## 妈祖公园发展计划方案

To Discuss and Adopt the following Proposals submitted by the General Council:

### Mazu Recreational Park and Plaza Development Proposal

Submitted by : General Council of The Selangor & Federal Territory Hainan Association

Proposed Resolution:

In view of the need to enhance the overall functions and long-term development of the temple, the General Council proposes the development of the Mazu Recreational Park & Plaza.

The proposed project aims to strengthen the temple's role in cultural, religious, tourism and community activities. The development, with an estimated cost of approximately RM 43.5 million, shall be carried out subject to detailed design, refinement of feasibility studies and approval from the relevant authorities.

The General Council further proposes to appoint the necessary consultants to undertake design development, preparation of 3D visualisations, submission to authorities and implementation of the project.

In addition, the General Council proposes to undertake fundraising initiatives, including donation drives, to support the development.

提案：

鉴于提升庙宇整体功能及长远发展之需要，理事会提议推动妈祖公园与广场发展计划。

有关项目旨在强化庙宇于文化、宗教、旅游及社区活动方面之角色。该发展计划预计耗资约 RM43,500,000 (4,350万令吉)，惟须以详细设计、可行性研究优化及相关当局批准为前提方予落实。

理事会并建议委任相关顾问，以展开设计深化、3D效果图制作、提呈审批及项目实施工作。

此外，理事会建议展开筹款活动，包括募捐，以支持有关发展开支。

Cause of Action:

To enhance and reposition the temple as a key cultural, religious and community landmark, while improving visitor facilities and optimising land use.

The proposed development is also intended to ensure the sustainable growth of the Association, strengthen its public engagement and support long-term financial and operational viability through improved infrastructure and planned development.

案由：

为提升并重塑庙宇作为重要文化、宗教及社区地标之地位，同时完善访客设施及优化土地运用。

有关发展亦旨在确保本会可持续发展，加强对外联系与社会参与，并通过完善基础建设与系统性规划，提升整体营运与财务的长远稳健性。

## 七层楼停车场发展计划方案

To Discuss and Adopt the following Proposals submitted by the General Council:

### Seven-Storey Car Park Development Proposal

Submitted by : General Council of The Selangor & Federal Territory Hainan Association

Proposed Resolution:

In view of the need to address slope stability concerns and improve parking facilities, the General Council proposes the construction of a 7-storey carpark comprising approximately 605 parking bays together with a permanent retaining wall system on Lot 143 and Lot 104 (PT 1).

The proposed project shall be implemented as a single-phase development combining both the retaining wall system and the multi-storey carpark, with an estimated total cost of approximately RM 47 million, subject to detailed design, refinement of feasibility studies and approval from the relevant authorities.

The General Council further proposes to authorise the appointed consultants to proceed with the remaining scope of services, including detailed design, submission to authorities, tendering and implementation of the project.

In addition, the General Council proposes to initiate a donation drive and/or other appropriate funding mechanisms to finance the development.

提案：

鉴于有必要解决边坡稳定性问题及改善停车设施，理事会提议于第143地段及第104地段 (PT1) 建设一项七层楼停车场 (约605个车位)，并同步兴建永久性挡土墙系统。

有关项目拟以单一阶段方式实施，将挡土墙系统与多层停车场一并建设，总估算费用约为RM47,000,000 (4,700万令吉)，惟须以详细设计、可行性研究优化及相关当局批准为前提方予落实。

理事会并建议授权已委任之顾问继续推进相关工作，包括详细设计、提呈审批、招标及项目实施。

此外，理事会建议启动募捐及／或其他适当融资方式，以支持有关发展开支。

Cause of Action:

To resolve critical slope stability issues and ensure the safety of the temple and surrounding properties, while addressing existing parking shortages and traffic congestion.

The proposed development is also intended to optimise land use, improve operational efficiency and generate sustainable revenue, thereby supporting the long-term development and financial stability of the Association.

案由：

为解决关键边坡稳定性问题，保障庙宇及周边产业安全，同时纾缓现有停车不足及交通拥堵情况。

有关发展亦旨在优化土地运用、提升整体运作效率，并创造持续性收入来源，以支持本会长远发展及财务稳健。

土地更改用途和合并建议

To Discuss and Adopt the following Proposals submitted by the General Council:

Land Conversion and Amalgamation Proposal

Submitted by : General Council of The Selangor & Federal Territory Hainan Association

Proposed Resolution:

In view of the need to streamline land administration and optimise long-term land use planning, the General Council hereby proposes the amalgamation and conversion of the following land parcels, namely Lot 42, Lot 143, Lot 144 and Lot 104 (PT1), into a single title under the ownership of Persatuan Hainan Selangor dan Wilayah Persekutuan.

The amalgamated land shall be standardised under the land use category of “building (place of worship)” (“bangunan / tapak berhala”), consistent with Lot 97.

The General Council further proposes to authorise the appointment of the necessary professional consultants and to proceed with submissions to the relevant authorities, including the Pejabat Pengarah Tanah dan Galian Wilayah Persekutuan Kuala Lumpur, to undertake all required processes for the amalgamation and conversion.

In addition, the Association hereby approves the commitment and payment of all relevant fees, premiums, charges and incidental costs as may be imposed by the relevant authorities in relation to the said exercise.

提案：

鉴于简化土地行政管理及优化长期土地发展规划之需要，理事会提议将第42地段、第143地段、第144地段及第104地段 (PT1) 合并并转换为单一地契，归雪隆海南会馆名下。

有关合并后之土地用途将统一为“建筑(庙宇用地)” (“bangunan / tapak berhala”), 并与第97地段之用途保持一致。

理事会并建议授权委任专业顾问，并向相关当局(包括吉隆坡联邦直辖区土地与矿物局)提呈申请，以办理所有有关合并及转换之手续。

此外，会馆同意承担及支付一切相关费用、地价溢价、手续费及由有关当局征收之附带费用。

Cause of Action:

To consolidate fragmented land titles into a single unified ownership structure in order to improve administrative efficiency, legal clarity and long-term planning capability.

The proposed exercise is also intended to standardise land use classification, facilitate future development planning, and avoid potential increases in costs and procedural complexity arising from delayed consolidation.

案由：

将分散之土地地契整合为统一产权结构，以提升行政效率、法律清晰度及长远规划能力。

此举亦有助于统一土地用途分类、便利未来发展规划，并避免因延迟整合而导致成本增加及程序复杂化之风险。



## (一) 议长致词

尊敬的雪隆海南会馆会长符和泽乡长、署理会长、各位理事、各位同乡、各位乡长，大家早上好。

一年一度的会员大会再次召开。今天的会议由我主持，心情颇为复杂。

我清楚记得自己在何种情况下重返雪隆海南会馆担任议长。当时提名我的同乡来电，我提出一个条件：若希望我担任议长，也请支持李素桦乡贤担任副议长。就在这样的前提下，我与李素桦一同当选。

我之所以接受议长职务，是出于对会馆过去支持的感恩，以及对海南人乡情的珍惜与维护。我们有责任推动会馆健康顺畅发展。我坚持提名李素桦，是因为我深知她的诚信与一贯为国家、社会奉献的精神与原则，尤其在妇女事务方面，我们曾有多次合作与深入交流。

今天心情复杂的另一原因，是她为了捍卫会馆章程精神与会员的选举权，不幸在司法程序上遭遇挫折，令人遗憾与痛心。虽然有些事超出我们控制范围，也不应轻易质疑，但我强调，她的出发点始终是为会馆与会员利益着想。在此，我肯定她的付出，并希望大家给予支持。

我始终相信，会馆的未来需要大家共同努力。虽然过去数年会馆经历不少争议，但我视之为发展的阵痛。只要出发点是为了进步，我们都应勇于面对。我欣见理事会日渐开放，更能接纳批评，并肯定其在改善方面的努力。但我不会在大会上为任何人贴标签。无论是否卷入争议，只要发言合情、合理、合法、符合章程，我都会捍卫其发言权。同时，希望理事会正视并回应会员的意见与建议。

会馆运作必须依程序进行。作为议长，我只能在权限范围内处理事务，不能逾越章程，也不能推翻既有程序。会馆虽以年长会员为主，但人才济济，包括律师、建筑师、工程师、会计师等。因此，每逢大会前，我都会收到大量包含提案与意见的电邮。对此，我的原则始终如一：

一，凡事合情、合理、合法；

二，依章行事，保障会员在章程框架内的发言权；

三，理事由大家一人一票选出，应依法履行管理与运作职责。

我们不能仅因怀疑理事而在事实未明前，要求他们提供尚未成熟的资料；理事也不能因掌握权力，就否决所有提案，仅因怀疑其动机，这种态度同样不当。

在会议召开前，我已向李素桦乡贤表示，我将保持中立，不偏不倚。希望会议顺利进行，即便提出尖锐问题，也应以温和、合理、理性方式表达。这非常重要。

我们不希望内部事务外泄而遭讥笑。当前正处过渡时期，虽会引发批评与误解，但应积极面对，赢得外界尊重，重塑雪隆海南会馆作为ISO认证团体的声誉与形象。

根据章程规定，今日会议出席人数须达理事总人数两倍，即86人。秘书处于上午10时42分提供的数据，目前出席人数为164人。因此，我正式宣布，今日会员大会合法召开。

接下来，进行接下来的议程：恭请本会会长符和泽乡长为大会致词。

## (二) 会长致词

议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬乡贤、副议长李素桦律师、法律顾问陈泽玉律师、拿督林鸿昌律师、纪律委员会主任拿督陈明耀、选举委员会主任邢福集乡贤、全体理事及团委，各位会员，大家早上好。

谨此感谢大家在过去一年里，对新届理事会的关心与支持。我们深感责任重大，将继续秉持本会宗旨，致力推动会馆朝向更制度化、透明化的方向发展。

为了不负会员所托，新届理事会已正式迈出改革步伐，其中一项重要举措，就是成立了“修章小组委员

会”。在副会长拿督陈行昌博士的召集之下，委任了周昌进乡贤为修章小组委员会主席，全面检讨本会章程。至今，小组已召开七次修章会议及一次建议草案审查会议，积极研究现有章程及全面投入修章工作。我们恳请会员给予小组委员会足够的时间与空间，随后也将广泛征询会员意见，力求完善修章内容。

当然，改革之路并不容易，我们理解会员的关心与意见，都是出于对会馆的热爱与责任心。理事会也欢迎建设性的意见与批评。然而，最近一些未经证实的消息被广泛传播，造成误解，甚至影响团结，实在令人感到遗憾。在此，我们呼吁大家理性判断，以事实为依据，共同维护会馆的和谐氛围。

改革需要时间，也需要大家的支持。今年的会员大会，我们特别安排“妈祖公园发展计划进展汇报”作为议程之一，就是希望大家更了解计划的最新进展。

在此，也向大家报告：七层楼停车场项目，已获得吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 发出的发展令 (D.O.) 及建筑图 (Building Plan) 批文。至于妈祖公园发展计划，我们也已正式入纸申请发展令，接下来将进入向市长申请最终批准的阶段。其他详情，将由署理会长拿督斯里符之庆稍后在议程 (八) 中，向大家进一步说明。

相信这几天大家都关注着一个热门课题，那就是我们敬爱的副议长李素桦律师的法庭案件结果。副议长尽忠职守、无私奉献，为本会及全体会员争取合法权益，结果却遭人控告，惹上官司，令人痛心。

我们要在这里坚定表达立场：我们肯定副议长李素桦律师所作出的贡献，也对她所承受一切，深感遗憾。雪隆海南会馆将作为她最坚强的后盾，给予她全力的支持。

各位会员，让我们一起用声音表达支持：“挺副议长，我们同在！”

最后，再次感谢大家一直以来的信任与支持！谢谢！

### (三) 覆准前期大会会议记录

#### 特别会员大会 (17/04/2024)

3.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬说明，此环节并非检讨会议内容，而是让曾出席前一次会议的会员确认会议记录是否准确、是否真实反映会议过程。若记录存在错误、遗漏或需增删修正，出席者可在现阶段提出，包括涉及出席者姓名的错误或遗漏。

本次覆准仅限上次会议的出席者提出修正意见。未出席者无权覆准、审核、推翻或否决会议记录，除非所涉议决违反法律或会馆章程。欲发言者须举手并获议长认可，发言前须先报姓名；已发言者应让未发言者优先，每人发言尽量简洁，建议不超过两次，并尽量一次表达完整修正意见。

若无进一步意见，将由一名会员提议通过会议记录，再由另一名会员附议，完成后方可结束本议题。

3.2 会员王运东 (K5278) 建议，在议程开始前为本会已故选举委员会主任唐南松律师默哀一分钟。

3.2.1 秘书长陈官平补充，另有一名理事，即公关组副主任马济东离世，他建议一起缅怀。

3.2.2 全体肃立默哀一分钟，以示敬意与追思。默哀完毕全体就座，会议继续进行。

- 3.3 会员朱小虎(K3295)指出,前次会议记录3.5使用“指责议长”一词与其原意不符,其当时仅为“提醒议长应公正处理事项”。建议修正为“提醒”,并查核其他段落是否有类似字眼并一并更正。
- 3.3.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示,会馆与会员应保持理性与尊重,不宜使用“指责”一词,并认同上述建议。
- 3.4 秘书长陈官平指出,前次会议记录3.7.14提及“Matric Justice(平等公正)”英文用词有误,应为“Natural Justice(自然公正)”,建议更正。
- 3.5 秘书长陈官平提出,前次会议记录第(九)项“讨论提案”应修正为“讨论其他提案”,以更准确反映当时议程。
- 3.6 会员李昌浩(K7659)指出,前次会议记录11.4中其姓名误写为“李昌皓”,应更正。
- 3.7 会员庄耿俊(K8203)提出,前期会议记录会长致词提及:“站在馆方的立场,最近发生一连串的事情,实在令人感到非常痛心,特别是卷入了频繁的纠纷,又花费很多钱打官司”,建议此部分在记录中有所注明。
- 3.7.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬提醒,目前处于覆准会议记录阶段,并非检讨或辩论环节,会长讲词的适当与否属大会程序,由议长判断决定。
- 3.8 会员朱运辉(K15820)指海南人文化不只是琼剧及海南歌曲.....
- 3.8.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬再次提醒,应按会议议程进行检讨记录。
- 3.9 会员杨兴金(K9271)提议,会员朱小虎(K3295)附议,会员大会通过【特别会员大会会议记录(17/04/2024)】。
- 3.9.1 会员李晓韵(K6185)指出,刚才杨兴金提议,但名单显示其未出席特大,请秘书处核实。若确认出席,可保留其为提议人;若未出席,她可以作为提议人。
- 3.9.2 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬请秘书处确认相关信息。
- 3.10 鉴于会员杨兴金(K9271)没有出席特大,因此改由会员李晓韵(K6185)提议,会员朱小虎(K3295)附议,大会通过【特别会员大会会议记录(17/04/2024)】。

### 2024年度会员大会(30/06/2024)

- 3.11 会员林方浩(K15859)指出,根据惯例,会员应在会员大会前数周、于指定期限内提交问题。他已依规向会馆递交问题,现欲就此发言。
- 3.12 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬提醒,目前议程为确认2024年度会员大会会议记录,发言应依议程进行。若有问题、建议或意见,请于适当环节提出,并指出,会务报告中存在部分错字,秘书处已获通知并将负责修正。
- 3.13 会员王招美(K15948)提议,会员杨兴金(K9271)附议,会员大会通过【2024年度会员大会会议记录(30/06/2024)】。

(四) 检讨前期大会会议记录  
特别会员大会 (17/04/2024)

- 4.1 会员庄耿俊 (K8203) 就前期会议记录会长致词中“站在馆方的立场, 最近发生一连串的事情, 实在令人感到非常痛心, 特别是卷入了频繁的纠纷, 又花费很多钱打官司”一段, 进一步强调“为什么不能关起门来解决?”, 并建议在修章过程中设立“调查委员会”, 凡涉及内部纠纷, 须先交由该委员会调查协调, 避免直接诉诸法律程序, 造成不必要的人力物力与金钱浪费。
- 4.1.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示, 若调解顺利便不至走上司法程序, 并现场请周昌进同乡作一次性回应说明。
- 4.2 会员王运东 (K5278) 提出, 早前特别会员大会会议记录被提交法庭, 引发 Contempt of Court (藐视法庭) 争议, 质疑至今特大决议是否具有法律效力。他进一步以开除会员为例, 指非会员不应对会馆事务妄加评论, 直言“Please shut up or keep your mouth shut” (请闭嘴), 称此言出于爱护会馆、支持理事会与副议长之立场, 并希望议长提供指引, 让会员更有力支持理事会、维护公正与团结。
- 4.2.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示, 会员意见将由理事会稍后回应。至于特大的法律效应, 她强调特大所作出的大会议决是有效的, 与相关法庭案件无直接冲突, 即便涉及诉讼, 其存在不影响大会合法议决。
- 4.3 会员庄光远 (K13702) 就前期会议记录第11.6段提问, 吴正忠与王玉诚辞任内部稽查员 (Internal Auditor) 时, 是否提交过正式报告或建议。
- 4.3.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示, 该问题属特大议题, 将在相关环节处理, 并指示秘书处先记录, 无需重复提问。
- 4.4 副会长拿督陈行昌博士回应, 目前修章小组委员会建议由会长先行调解, 无法解决再由议长及修章小组委员会处理, 并考虑仲裁机制; 另参考政党机制, 若会员起诉会馆, 则自动丧失会员资格。此建议尚在评估中, 计划经理事会讨论后举办会员座谈会征询意见, 预计2024年下半年展开, 至少举行两场会员参与会。他也提到修章小组委员会成员包括法律界人士, 而且大多数成员由非理事所组成, 自2024年起多次开会, 7至9月亦已排定会议日程, 持续推动章程改革。
- 4.5 副会长拿督陈行昌博士补充, 特大程序合法合规, 李素桦副议长虽因程序瑕疵被判道歉与赔偿, 但初心为捍卫会员权益。对方坚持判监七天令人遗憾, 显示章程需改革。特大后的选举结果亦显示理事会获会员支持, 呼吁团结, 不应“自己人打自己人”。
- 4.5.1 会员王运东 (K5278) 表示, 海南人不应内斗。对无理取闹、攻击副议长者, 纪律委员会应调查, 必要时采取行动, 维护会馆声誉。
- 4.5.2 会员史元春 (K4077) 提醒理事会, 未来慎重处理法院来函, 并列入议程讨论, 避免再牵连议长等人承担法律责任。
- 4.6 会员冯业贤 (K13333) 建议修章须以全体会员利益为核心, 不应偏向理事会, 应推动会馆民主化。
- 4.7 会员陈国希 (K0040) 向会长表达感谢, 并表示因心情复杂, 希望通过大会寻求解答与内心平复, 发言出于对组织的重视与信任。

- 4.7.1 会员陈国希(K0040)续称, 他已入会40年。他说官司是打不完的, 用钱打官司没有谁对谁错, 也没有答案。他指会馆事情很多、意见也很多, 因为理事有42人, 素质不一, 应当认清自身缺点。
- 4.7.2 会员陈国希指有律师及其他人曾建议避免“海南人打海南人”, 但他不知是否有此情况, 并指这是丑事。他表示, 活到七十多八十岁, 讲话应由心出发, 愿讲则讲, 不愿讲则不必讲。他认为, 若会馆有任何不同意见, 上律师楼是一个程序, 但在此之前, 应向会员大会讲清楚。至于由会长提出的修改章程建议, 他认为会馆任何争议都不应写入章程或带上法庭, 反之应聆听律师意见后, 才决定是否将有关部分列入章程。
- 4.8 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示, 为维持会议秩序, 意见请稍后提出。针对李素桦副议长案件及特大合法性, 她指此问题已由副会长拿督陈行昌作出说明, 会长符和泽亦在致词中表明支持副议长, 并请会长符和泽确认解读是否正确。
- 4.8.1 会长符和泽回应正确。
- 4.9 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬指出, 修章流程已清晰展示, 也有强调会员参与的重要性。目前阶段尚未提交理事会, 会员仍可提案。她强调, 会员提出的建议, 应以全体会员与会馆利益为出发点, 避免过度坚持个人立场, 并询问会员是否同意此说法。
- 4.9.1 会员回应同意。
- 4.10 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬鼓励会员尽快提交修章建议, 以利在2027年4月前完成工作, 并强调应通过机制表达意见, 而非仅在大会批评。关于调解人安排, 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表明为保持中立与公正主持会议, 拒绝担任调解职务, 并建议修章小组委员会不将议长列为调解人选。
- 4.11 会员王运东(K5278)提议, 会员王招美(K15948)附议, 通过上述检讨事项。

#### 2024年度会员大会(30/06/2024)

- 4.12 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬提醒全体会员, 稍后将进入提案环节。欲参与辩论者须事先向秘书处领取并填写表格, 仅限已递交表格者发言, 以确保会议顺利进行。她强调, 会员应充分准备后再参与讨论。
- 4.13 会员林方浩(K15859)指出, 会务报告第246页第7.8项中, “Wang Ang Peng”拼音有误, 应为“Wong Ang Peng”; 今日提案文件则误写为“Wong Ang Ping”。他希望大会确认正确拼音。
- 4.13.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示, 该事项属覆准会议记录环节, 并询问是否还有其他修正。
- 4.14 会员郑庭安(K17912)指他注意到议程第四项为【检讨前期大会会议记录】, 询问其是否与第五项【会务报告】内容相同。
- 4.14.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬说, 第五项【会务报告】为上一年度理事会的综合报告, 包括活动、会议及运作等, 而第四项则是对去年会员大会会议记录的检讨, 两者性质不同。
- 4.14.2 会员郑庭安追问, 【会务报告】是否不包括在【会议记录】中, 即当前尚未进入【会务报告】讨论?

- 4.14.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬重申,【会务报告】属第五项议程,独立于【会议记录】。
- 4.15 会员龙藉平(K2223)表示,他需另一位会员现场协助翻译中文发言,请求大会提供麦克风。
- 4.15.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问翻译人选,得知为在场会员翁诗莉(K18177)后,同意其请求。
- 4.15.2 会员龙藉平指出,第5.3.3项最后一句应为“我在会上询问现在应由谁负责”,而非“我想问”。
- 4.15.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬回应,该内容应在较早阶段提出,并提醒部分会员仍未分清各议程环节的处理事项。
- 4.15.4 龙藉平指出,第5.4至5.6.4中,大会就25项议题进行了长时间讨论。若秘书长当时明确说明DBKL尚未发出发展令(D.O.),讨论可在3分钟内结束。此信息已于DBKL会议确认,并源自2023年大会决议——在取得发展令前不得动工或付款,但会议记录未被记录在案。
- 4.15.5 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬确认其主旨,即“秘书长虽有回复,但会议记录未记载”?
- 4.15.6 龙藉平确认,并指出DBKL已明确表示未发出发展令,但该信息未在大会中说明,引发长时间质疑。
- 4.15.7 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问,是否意指秘书长未在会议中说明DBKL的决定。
- 4.15.8 龙藉平确认,并强调该疏漏导致至少半小时的冗长讨论。
- 4.15.9 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示,将由秘书长稍后回应。
- 4.16 会员龙藉平(K2223)进一步指出,第5.6至5.6.5共6项内容涉及已废置的“妈祖公园”项目及与DBKL相关的新发展计划。他建议应先正式废除2016年大会通过的旧项目,再启动新计划,以免混淆。
- 4.16.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬回应,上一届大会确有“妈祖公园”与“第二期发展项目”之间混淆。若要顺利推进未来发展,须明确区分,相关事项留待署理会长拿督斯里符之庆汇报后处理,届时允许会员龙藉平进一步发言,依章程推进程序。
- 4.16.2 龙藉平质疑,第5.6.2提到的QS(工料测量师)成本评估缺乏专业性,应公开相关报告。第5.6.4中提及的与DBKL洽谈新发展计划,若仅依赖QS报告,恐重蹈覆辙。他强调建材价格已上涨35%,建议安排与QS会面,并表示若理事会不重视,将不再多言。
- 4.16.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬回应,详细数据需待公开招标时才能明确。若有涨价趋势,理事会应警觉,但仍需依正式程序由AGM审议及批准。她认为,会员的意见是对理事会的提醒。
- 4.17 会员龙藉平(K2223)指出,第3.1项应讨论“妈祖公园项目”潜在问题,并追究前任理事会未有效处理或承担责任的情况。他强调,此项目并非2016年大会通过的内容,多年来无人回应,因此他决定今日最后一次正式提出,必要时应通过决议追责。

- 4.17.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问其发言目的。
- 4.17.2 龙藉平表示,该项目已争议九年,仍无实质方案。他尝试播放幻灯片,并询问后方会员能否清楚看到。
- 4.17.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬建议其直接陈述重点,以节省时间。
- 4.17.4 龙藉平表示,缺少PPT会影响呈现,但会简明说明。
- 4.17.5 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬回应,早前已代为总结部分内容。
- 4.17.6 龙藉平强调,2016年大会通过的是总值1亿400万令吉的发展项目,分为第一项与第二项。
- 4.17.7 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬提醒其发言已超时,给予额外5分钟总结。
- 4.17.8 龙藉平表示,该议题非常关键,许多会员仍不知实情。
- 4.17.9 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬指出,事前已说明幻灯片多数会员无法清晰观看,不宜作为主要呈现方式,请直接陈述重点。
- 4.17.10 龙藉平就“妈祖公园”名称混淆问题说明,指出DBKL已驳回会员批准的发展申请,该项目已属无效。
- 4.17.11 龙藉平补充,相关计划早在2015年或更早由Aspirasi Permai公司提出并获DBKL批准。其后,理事会提呈1亿400万令吉计划获会员大会通过。但该公司随后以“Landscape”申请升级并改名为“妈祖公园”,此名称未在会员大会明确说明。其后,另一公司Vintage Paradise再次申请升级,2017年提出第三次升级,DBKL遂要求发展令(D.O.)。
- 4.17.12 龙藉平强调,“妈祖公园”名称并非经会员批准,而是源自2015年前计划。他多次向理事会反映但未获重视,也未记入会议记录,认为必须尽快厘清。
- 4.17.13 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬总结,该问题核心在于第一阶段(含地下停车场等)与第二阶段发展计划名称混淆。原应为“第二阶段发展计划”,但出现“妈祖公园”名称,混乱源自上一届理事会。若本届理事会欲继续推进,不论在名称、计划或开销方面,一旦超出会员大会先前所批准的范围,或内容不明确、引起混淆的部分,皆必须予以纠正,并提呈会员大会重新审议通过,方可执行。她重申此事到此为止,不再讨论。
- 4.17.14 龙藉平表示问题已识别,这是他本人的责任,但仍需由理事会决定是否同意。
- 4.17.15 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬强调,是否同意并非由理事会决定,而是必须依章程行事,既然是章程规定,就必须同意并执行。
- 4.17.16 龙藉平进一步询问,若继续执行,相关损失由谁承担。议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬明确表示,是由全体理事会承担责任。

(与会会员随即鼓掌同意。)

- 4.17.17 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬补充,所有事情都必须依章及大会决议执行。她提醒会员,上一届会员大会已有说明,任何项目若由某位理事领头,也不能由个人承担责任,而是全体理事会共同负责。因此,大会所提出并符合理事会权限的事项,理事会皆需共同承担责任。她强调此课题已结束,待会只讨论署理会长拿督斯里符之庆提出的建议,不再纠结过往理事会的事宜。
- 4.17.18 王安平(K4526)指出议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬所言必须纳入会议记录,即理事会须对该事项承担责任。议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬回应表示,秘书处会将会把她言论记录,并坦言她未曾看过如此详细的会议记录。
- 4.17.19 龙藉平表示完全认同议长所言,并引述章程第9.1条文指出,所有事务由理事会负责,必须严肃看待。
- 4.18 会员庄耿俊(K8203)提问指出,根据第54页第7.9.29项显示,妈祖雕像工程总额为319万令吉,产品完成50%时需支付40%,完成并送抵工地后再付20%,合计60%;但第53页第7.9.27项列明本会已支付RM2,073,500,约为总额的65%,质疑是否超付5%。另询及第7.9.31项中提及副会长拿督陈行昌律师曾率团访华,Zheng Chang Stones Berhad Ltd (振昌石制品有限公司)要求500万令吉,希望了解该行程详情。
- 4.19 会员王运东(K5278)提出两项问题,其一,关于第241页第7.2.13项,2023年理事会批准RM119,558用于理事的医药保险。他质疑理事皆为义务身份,非职员,不应动用公款为45名理事购买高额保险,建议设立医药援助基金,协助有需要的海南乡亲,并以此取代保险制度,避免费用逐年增加。他建议将此议题交由会员大会决定是否继续执行。
- 4.19.1 其二,他指第251至252页第7.10.9项,关于对其他拥有妈祖庙的海南会馆捐款事项,每个会馆获得RM20,000,总额已超过RM250,000,此数额已超越理事会批准权限。他反对将每项捐款视为独立个案以规避审核,并呼吁负责该处理程序者出面说明,是否交由大会处理则交由议长裁定。
- 4.20 龙藉平(K2223)表示,会员大会应让会员畅所欲言,过去十年的问题未被正视,才导致今日的问题。他询问支付予中国雕像厂振昌石制品有限公司的总金额,并要求了解该支付是依照合约还是信件进行。他指出,根据承包信第11条款,协会有权随时终止合约,无需说明理由,但有关承包商并未被终止,仍持续付款,却未见雕像出现在本会。他认为财政应回答,并强调理事会必须被问责。
- 4.20.1 财政吴伟刚回应会员龙藉平关于振昌石制品有限公司费用的提问,说明付款进度已列出于荧幕。第一笔款项于23/08/2019支付,为完成50%减10%保留金后之45%,金额为RM1,435,500;第二笔款项于14/02/2023支付,根据YTS发出之第二张中期证书,为20%,金额为RM638,000。两笔合计已支付RM2,073,500,占整体合约的65%。
- 4.20.2 财政吴伟刚说明,整个合约总额为RM3,190,000,款项分阶段支付:签署合约后支付10%(RM319,000)、工厂完成50%制作后支付40%(RM1,276,000)、100%制作并运抵后支付20%(RM638,000)、现场安装完成后支付25%(RM797,500)、取得实用证书后支付3%(RM79,750)、修复缺陷证书签发后再支付3%(RM79,750)。截至目前,尚未支付的部分为RM1,116,500。
- 4.20.3 财政吴伟刚另补充说,尚有一项或有负债,即供应商针对妈祖公园发展计划提出的法

律索赔,金额为RM5,946,009,包括储存费、管理费及利息,目前尚未支付,正等待协商解决。

- 4.20.4 第三副会长拿督陈行昌博士补充说,根据合同,抵达马来西亚前仅需支付50%,余额在抵达后才支付。本届理事会上任时发现问题,对方已发出律师信,提出RM6,000,000索赔。根据合约,本会并无义务支付有关款项,惟暂未采取法律行动。本会将待DBKL批准后协调处理,并在协商结果获得会员大会通过后方进行。关于RM5,900,000索赔部分,本会坚持不支付,并维持合约条款。
- 4.21 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬回应,理事会将统一回答各会员提出的问题,邀请秘书长或相关理事说明,并要求在会议记录中明确写出之前并无发展令(D.O.)。
- 4.22 第三副会长拿督陈行昌博士表示,理事会接任后决定申请D.O.,并查阅过去文件,发现之前并无相关批准。因此理事会与DBKL多次接洽,一年内已正式入纸申请D.O.。理事会承诺在获得D.O.后,先获取报价,再提呈会员大会批准,之后才会动工。
- 4.23 署理会长拿督斯里符之庆说明,过去的工程批准文件、妈祖公园与停车场问题多来自前任领导层,甚至可能涉及外部单位或DBKL。目前为止,理事会已获得100%停车场批准;妈祖公园方面也通过多个单位审核,部长已表示无异议。
- 4.23.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬提醒署理会长,在发言时需清楚说明获得批准的是哪一个停车场。
- 4.23.2 署理会长拿督斯里符之庆指出,目前已获得发展批准的是2016年会员大会所通过的原有地下(basement)停车场,即位于妈祖公园位置的旧停车场,并非新设计的停车场。他补充,虽然已获批准,但理事会并未立即动工,而是计划作出部分调整以改善交通动线。
- 4.23.3 署理会长拿督斯里符之庆表示,他于农历新年期间亲自观察人流与巴士进出的安排后,决定修改路线设计,避免巴士停靠于前方主路,而是改由后方进入。同时,理事会也拟议增加两个电梯,以方便年长会员通行,并将原有的机械通风系统(Mechanical Ventilation)改为自然通风(Air Flow Ventilation)。有关修改建议已与专业人士Yap Teck Seng商讨,并准备幻灯片(PPT)向会员说明详情。
- 4.23.4 署理会长拿督斯里符之庆呼吁会员支持新的设计与方向,并表示应放眼未来,共同推动会务发展。
- (会员鼓掌)
- 4.24 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬确认有关修改计划在日后是否须呈交会员大会审议,并获得第三副会长拿督陈行昌博士的确认,表示所有修改方案将在取得D.O.后,提呈会员大会讨论及批准,方才进行施工。
- 4.24.1 第三副会长拿督陈行昌博士进一步回应,先前理事会曾委派会长符和泽及Bakertilly的稽查员前往中国福建实地考察振昌石制品有限公司,确认雕像的存在。目前将待DBKL正式核准发出D.O.后,再前往福建与供应商协商后续事宜。他说理事会承诺,将在雕像费用确定后呈交会员大会审议与通过后,方会推进后续工作。

(会员鼓掌)

4.24.2 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬强调,所有变动必须取得会员大会通过,才能执行,并呼吁会员给予理事会支持。

(会员鼓掌)

4.25 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示理事会尚未针对有关医药保险事项作出回应。

4.25.1 秘书长陈官平回应,关于会员提及的保险项目,详见报告书中文版第47页,第7.2.13项,金额为RM119,558。根据本会章程,理事会的批准权限不得超过RM250,000。此次支出主要用于理事保险,其中超过70岁的理事未被涵盖。由于有会员质疑金额偏高,理事会将重新讨论是否继续维持该保单,并在理事会作出决定。

4.26 会员龙藉平(K2223)尝试发言,但被议长制止。

4.26.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬指示龙藉平先坐下,强调这是会议,不是辩论场所,并要求相关理事就保险问题作出回应。她点名理事应主动承担责任,不应事事推给第三副会长拿督陈行昌博士回答,否则其他理事等同失责。此言获得与会者掌声认同。

4.26.2 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬重申,任何项目由负责理事回答,不应由单一理事独揽所有答复。

4.27 署理会长拿督斯里符之庆回应,关于妈祖庙捐款RM20,000事项,解释捐款缘由如下:本会作为海南人组织,鉴于本会天后宫为马来西亚海南人集资建立而成,因此当槟城、瓜拉立卑等地落后的妈祖庙寻求支援时,本会本于回馈与文化遗产的精神,经理事会同意每间庙宇拨款RM20,000用于维修,并无私人用途。

4.28 会员庄光远(K13702)提出有关内部稽查员(Internal Auditor)未呈交报告及发现事项的问题尚未获得解释。

4.28.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬要求财政吴伟刚说明内部稽查员事宜。

4.28.2 财政吴伟刚表示,大会已委任两位内部稽查员,即王玉诚(K11913)及吴正忠(K12808)。但大会结束后联络王玉诚时,对方婉拒受委;吴正忠方面,在账目整理完毕后曾与其会面,但不久后收到其辞职信。馆方尝试挽留,对方仍坚持不接受职务,故无法提呈任何稽查报告。本次大会将重新选出两位内部稽查员以履行监督责任。

4.29 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬总结时表示,她在主持会议过程中不断询问是否还有问题,会员未回应却在回答环节结束后继续发问,导致会议难以顺利完成。她强调大会程序须守纪律,并呼吁会员配合,表示“下不为例”。

4.30 会员朱小虎(K3295)欲发言提问,议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬指示请于提案环节再行提出。

4.31 会员冯廷荫(K3875)表示为避免误解以英语发言。他指出,理事会准备将停车场或妈祖公园发展计划提呈大会批准,是否属“先斩后奏”之举,尤其是如设厂向银行贷款需先准备所有计划,但若最终不获批准则劳而无功。

- 4.31.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬回应,该申请属先期阶段,仅为设计修改,尚未动工,将在动工前提呈会员大会审议,通过后方执行。
- 4.31.2 会员冯廷荫 (K3875) 续指,可否在费用支出前取得批准,避免大会否决后造成浪费,如建筑图纸、顾问费等,并强调若大会不通过,将构成资源浪费。
- 4.31.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬说明,所指为原本之停车场项目,而非七层停车场计划。
- 4.31.4 会员冯廷荫 (K3875) 指出2016年批准已过期,理应先准备建议书,根据顾问公司反馈后取得会员大会批准,程序应如此进行。
- 4.31.5 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬建议理事会留意并考虑会员建议,日后谨慎安排相关程序。
- 4.31.6 会员冯廷荫 (K3875) 向不明白中文的会员解释“先斩后奏”是指动工后才寻求批准。
- 4.31.7 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬回应,会员所用“先斩后奏”字眼未必适当,但建议理事会采纳会员意见,即先准备初步建议书,经会员大会通过后,再委托设计,最终呈报大会正式批准,以确保程序完整。
- 4.32 庄耿俊 (K8203) 指出他之前提出两个问题,仅获得其中一个答复,另一个问题尚未获回应,即根据条款7.9.29应支付60%,但目前依条款7.9.27却已支付65%。
- 4.32.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示该问题已在稍早前回答,并指出款项确实已超额支付,提醒与会者应留意聆听讨论内容。她强调自己睡眠不足仍能听清楚发言,同时要求龙藉平 (K2223) 停止发言并就座。
- 4.33 龙藉平 (K2223) 继续要求发言,表示其问题仍未获得答复,并质问有关妈祖雕像事项是否确认多付款项。议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬回应对方所言属实,并重申该问题源自上一届理事会。龙藉平强调合同具有持续效力,理应跨届追责,并质疑为何合约已注明本会有权终止,却未执行该权利并继续支付款项,最终又承认多付,认为此处理方式不公平。
- 4.33.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬要求第三副会长拿督陈行昌博士说明款项支付时间及本届理事会所采取之措施。
- 4.33.2 第三副会长拿督陈行昌博士说明有关款项分别于2019年及2023年1月支付,其本人尚未进入理事会;在其上任后发现问题,随即展开处理工作。
- 4.33.3 龙藉平对此表示若无相关责任人追责,问题将难以厘清。
- 4.33.4 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬提醒龙藉平应保持理性,不应提高声量,并解释若上一届理事会有错误,不应要求现任理事承担。现任理事会职责在于鉴定、承认并纠正过去错误,避免未来再犯。此言获得全场掌声。
- 4.33.5 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬续称应承担者多已不在,甚至不再是本会会员,呼吁与会者勿再执着于过去错误,只要往后事务依法依规并尊重会员权利,即应予以推动。
- 4.33.6 龙藉平追问目前责任归属及相关款项应由谁承担。

4.33.7 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬反问其期望谁负责,并建议其可正式提呈书面投诉,要求展开纪律调查。龙藉平表示会这么做。

4.33.8 第三副会长拿督陈行昌博士解释,本届理事会决定不终止合约,目的是尽力将妈祖雕像取回,以继续发展妈祖公园。该雕像为特别定制,本会仍希望能成功接收并完善妈祖公园,因此目前合约尚未终止,并将继续协调处理。

4.34 翁方坤(K2676,系统名字为翁宏文)提醒大会,理事会的责任非常重要,尤其许多现任理事本身就是前届理事,因此若查出问题,应由相关者负责。

4.34.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示,这些理事是会员投选出来的。

4.34.2 冯廷荫(K3875)指出,不可因前任已离开就推卸责任,即使CEO离职,机构仍需负起责任。他强调,天后宫、雪隆海南会馆仍在,就必须承担责任。

4.34.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬指出,会务必须向前走。她强调,若新届理事会要继续执行上届未完事项,一旦涉及名称、计划或开销上的更动或模糊之处,必须提呈会员大会重新审议通过。她也提醒,会员本身在投选理事时,是否了解候选人或只是“跟菜单投”,这将影响监督的效果。她表明,若坚持追责,会员可循程序要求重启调查,并在调查完成后由会员大会决定是否采取法律或其他行动。

4.34.4 翁方坤(K2676,系统名字为翁宏文)表示认同议长所言,并提醒所有理事应对自己职责负责,若坐在理事位上,就应以真诚之心为海南人服务,不应重犯旧错。若再有过错,海南人将因此蒙羞。他赞同议长所言,呼吁勿“盲目菜单投”,而应认真尽责。

(与会者鼓掌)

4.34.5 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬感谢并补充指出,现任理事会更为开明,她曾建议举办干部训练营,教导如何开会、当理事、策划会务,并获得理事会一致同意。

(与会者鼓掌)

4.34.6 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示,会务要继续推进,过去的事要检讨,未来要做得更好。

(与会者鼓掌欢呼)

4.35 随后由王运东(K5278)提议、李昌浩(K7659)附议,通过上述检讨事项。

4.36 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬宣布休会,午餐后于下午2时复会。

#### (五) 讨论及接纳2024年度会务报告

5.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬说明议程进入第五项,请秘书长陈官平提呈2024年度会务报告。

- 5.2 秘书长陈官平提呈2024年度会务报告，并说明中文版本载于第63至105页，英文版本载于第263至286页。
- 5.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示，即将开放讨论2024年度会务报告。并提醒会员如欲参与第七项提案辩论，请先向秘书处领取表格填写。
- 5.4 秘书长陈官平建议在第67页8.5“妇女团”栏目增列以下资料：  
 顾问：龙月梅、陈孟龄、拿汀许雪兰、陈开蓉  
 法律顾问：吴乃馨律师
- 5.5 会员郑庭安(K17912)指出第84页11.4节中关于吉隆坡侨南华小的代表职务表述不清，部分董事未注明其所属代表机构，建议进一步厘清其身份归属。他并指出主席台后方国旗摆放位置有误，应依据国家礼仪置于议长右手边。
- 5.5.1 秘书长陈官平说明，理事是代表会馆出任侨南学校董事，选举由董事部内部进行，会馆方面仅委派董事，并无参与职位分配。吴伟刚是财政，彭志光与朱运炽则无职务。
- 5.5.2 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬指出，海南会馆只派出董事，并未派出家教协会代表，侨南方面也未提供家协名单，因此有关职位仅限董事部。
- 5.5.3 为进一步澄清，议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬邀请侨南董事长拿督林鸿昌律师作出说明。
- 5.5.4 侨南董事长兼本会法律顾问拿督林鸿昌律师说明，侨南董事会共15人，由校友会、家协、信托人、教育部代表及赞助人各3人组成。除了校友会与家协的6人，其余9人皆由海南会馆推荐，分别担任信托人、教育部代表及赞助人职位。吴伟刚、彭志光与朱运炽是以赞助人代表身份出任董事。
- 5.5.5 会员郑庭安(K17912)建议此类身份应列明，侨南董事长兼本会法律顾问拿督林鸿昌律师回应日后可补充说明。
- 5.6 会员郑庭安(K17912)进一步就第93至94页“受惠团体”部分提出意见：
1. 建议列表采用编号方式，便于ISO管理与追踪。
  2. 指出2023年起，政府已对华小制度化拨款，侨南华小应可获得一定资助，因此本会无须额外承担大笔拨款。
  3. 提出部分开销应由学校家协负责，包括：
    - 教师节晚宴 (RM8,203.45)
    - 教师办公室电脑 (RM28,952.00)
    - 打印机3台 (RM1,830.00)
    - 儿童节恩物 (RM2,750.00)
    - 儿童节茶会费用 (RM1,000.00)
    - 校内羽毛球比赛经费 (RM2,000.00)
  4. 建议检讨对吉兰丹中华独中所提供的RM1,000清贫学生助学金拨款。
- 5.7 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬指示若无其他疑问，可由一人提议，一人附议接纳2024年度会务报告。
- 5.8 会员郑庭安(K17912)询问拨款安排问题尚未回答，并指出侨南属会馆产业，但为何大部分由会馆出资而非家协。

- 5.8.1 侨南董事长拿督林鸿昌律师回应指，侨南目前财力薄弱，学生仅265人，其中华裔仅165人，其余为巫裔、印裔等族群。由于家庭背景以中下阶层居多，筹款困难，董事会也无经常性收入，若无会馆支持，恐难维持。他指出其他籍贯团体如客家人、福建人、潮州人所管理的学校均办得有声有色，反观侨南却逐渐衰落。他呼吁会馆应优先照顾侨南这所由先贤捐资建设的学校，不应让其毁于本届理事会之手，应设法复兴办学。
- 5.8.2 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬打断会员郑庭安 (K17912) 发言，并提醒与会者遵守发言秩序。
- 5.8.3 会员郑庭安 (K17912) 解释其原意为询问政府拨款是否充足，并建议董事部如有不足应积极申请。
- 5.8.4 侨南董事长拿督林鸿昌律师回应，政府拨款有限，每年维修费用高达20万令吉，前年仅获拨10万，去年虽申请20万，最终获批5万，但仍不足以维持校园设备与基本设施维修，政府无法提供足够支持，因此需会馆持续资助。
- 5.9 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬再三确认是否仍有问题，若无，则结束此环节。
- 5.10 会员朱小虎 (K3295) 建议，鉴于侨南学生人数持续下降，是否考虑将学校搬迁至华人较多的地区，重新建设，以利会馆未来发展。
- 5.11 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问会员龙藉平 (K2223) 意欲发言内容。
- 5.11.1 会员龙藉平 (K2223) 指出他想询问的问题董事部已经回应，但他认为应思考为何学校水平发展至现状，并强调校方应制定具体行动计划，避免流于空谈。
- 5.11.2 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示可将有关事项待提案环节时再行讨论。
- 5.12 会员郑庭安 (K17912) 提议，会员李昌浩 (K7659) 附议，大会一致通过接纳2024年度会务报告。

#### (六) 讨论及接纳2024年度经审核员审核之财务报告

- 6.1 大会议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬报告接下来的议程为讨论及接纳2024年度经审核之财务报告，并邀请财政吴伟刚提呈。
- 6.2 财政吴伟刚向大会议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬及在场会员问好，并表示将以PPT形式汇报，财务报告在第142至183页。
- 6.2.1 他报告2024年总收入为RM18,446,594，比2023年减少RM478,603，下跌2.5%。
- 6.2.2 本会2024年总开销为RM12,618,195，盈余RM5,828,399，下跌5%。惟总资产为RM123,041,854，增长5.2%。
- 6.2.3 比较2020至2025年的总收入与开销，2020年因疫情与MCO支出减少，2022年后逐渐增加，2024年稍有下降但与2023年接近。
- 6.2.4 本会主要收入变动来自活动。2024年法会、卫塞节及新年等活动收入RM5,098,637，比2023年减少1.4%。捐款则增加至RM9,997,792，增长近6%。

- 6.2.5 存款利息收入为RM2,401,202, 下跌1.8%; 租金收入增加RM133,066, 上升18%。另有一项合法和解赔偿案件。
- 6.2.6 他解释, 一供应商因送错货物经法庭判决需赔偿。目前已偿还RM50,000 (8个月), 尚有24个月分期。
- 6.2.7 2022至2024年盈余均维持在500万以上。2024年盈余为RM5,828,399; 总资产每年增加约5至6百万, 目前为RM123,041,854。
- 6.2.8 活动开销2024年为RM2,873,571, 比2023年增加RM360,827。
- 6.2.9 对外捐献总额为RM1,783,496, 比2023年增加RM844,960。增加最多为对海南联合会、属会及乡团捐献, 共RM797,000。会员可参阅第89至105页捐献明细。
- 6.2.10 法庭赔偿开销RM88,400, 源自会员罗长庚与王亚成诉讼, 本会败诉需赔偿。
- 6.2.11 律师及专业费用为RM930,074, 比2023年增加RM761,368, 上升451%。主要因多起理事涉入法庭案件。
- 6.2.12 本会注销应收租金RM44,000。财政解释, 因Jalan Raja Bot产业租户严重经济问题拖欠租金, 经法律顾问建议追讨成本过高, 理事会议决注销。
- 6.2.13 维修及保养费为RM858,642, 比2023年增加RM255,623, 主要用于新购停车场维修。
- 6.2.14 停车位增加50个至180个, 2024年停车场收入RM268,650, 几乎弥补维修费用。平常维修费用约RM600,000。
- 6.2.15 2024年活动盈余包括新年RM930,400、法会RM1,013,004、卫塞节RM173,623、佛诞RM608,526、婚姻注册RM537,021, 总盈余RM3,262,574, 比2023年减少30万。
- 6.2.16 他提醒各部门应积极增加收入, 尤其是活动收入。
- 6.2.17 会员个人意外保费RM142,716, 因保险费从RM8.30上涨至RM11。目前共有12,408位会员投保。
- 6.2.18 会员意外保险赔偿金RM114,171, 可向保险公司索回。大学毕业奖励金RM54,450, 会员子女奖励金RM33,900; 帛金约RM60,000; 施赠贫老增加RM248,579。
- 6.2.19 截至2024年产业总值RM52,270,123, 其中价值最大为新购停车场RM37,400,200。
- 6.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬感谢财政吴伟刚的详细报告, 并开放会员提问。
- 6.4 会员林方皓 (K15859) 询问, 外部审计公司Baker Tilly负责人是本会会员, 是否影响独立性。
- 6.4.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问会员林方皓 (K15859) 是否认为本会会员不应担任外部审计师。
- 6.4.2 会员林方皓 (K15859) 回应, 他担心可能涉及利益关系。

- 6.4.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬回应，外部审计公司受政府管制，若有失信将受纪律处分，并询问会员林方皓 (K15859) 是否认为外审公司会犯错。
- 6.4.4 会员林方皓 (K15859) 回应不确定，但表示疑虑。
- 6.4.5 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬提议，应拟定章程以明确专业人士的条件与标准。
- 6.4.6 财政吴伟刚回复会员林方皓 (K15859) 有关审计师独立性的问题。他表示，本会也关注此事，并从外审公司Baker Tilly得到澄清和保证。首先，负责审计的合伙人虽是会员，但并未在本会担任职务，也无权参与事务运作。
- 6.4.7 此外，财政吴伟刚说，大会年度报告第144页已有明确声明，审计师独立于会馆，所有作业遵循马来西亚会计师协会 (MIA) 专业道德与实务章程，以及国际会计师道德标准委员会 (IESBA) 的《国际专业会计师道德守则》。因此，Baker Tilly及其合伙人有责任确保审计透明，报告不仅向本会负责，也须向政府汇报。财政吴伟刚认为，Baker Tilly作为外部审计公司并无问题，他们同时也是多家大型企业的审计师，具备专业资质。
- 6.4.8 Baker Tilly负责人王廷谚补充，他仅是普通会员，没有干预权力。
- 6.5 会员郑庭安 (K17912) 指出，截至2024年12月31日银行定存为RM67,212,422，利息仅2%至2.5%。他建议考虑投资信托机构，利息可达10%至12%，条件是需有50万令吉。
- 6.5.1 对于资产存放定期而非信托基金的问题，财政吴伟刚解释，这是基于回酬及风险考量，为保障资金安全，选择相对稳妥的定期存款。他相信其他会馆也采取相同做法，这是目前最佳选择。
- 6.6 会员庄光远 (K13702) 认为财政报告有误，2024年开销实为增加约200万，当中约700至800千为捐献，另有800千为法律及专业费用。他理解法律费用及专业费是无可避免的。
- 6.6.1 他指相对于法律费用，他更想了解捐献事宜，并以个人收入作为比喻，指捐款比例过高，并建议增加贫老施赠及奖励金数额。
- 6.6.2 他询问资本承诺由2023年的1,700万减至2024年的140万，是否与妈祖公园有关，并建议未来签署合约应加入理赔条款。
- 6.6.3 关于会员福利，财政吴伟刚表示，这不属财务范畴，须由理事会讨论决定。但若大家同意，福利可作调整。
- 6.6.4 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬指出，此涉及预算规划，财政可考虑如何在成本与预算上作调整。
- 6.6.5 关于资本承诺，财政吴伟刚说明，资本承诺已由 1,700万降至 142.9万，主要因部分合约在2022年终止，目前仍在进行的包括振昌石业、妈祖雕像、顾问及景观设计等。
- 6.6.6 第三副会长拿督陈行昌博士汇报，本会涉及约10个案件，今年法律及专业费用约RM50万，之前 RM40万，总计 RM93万。他解释，每项案件费用按进度支付，多数案件为本会被起诉。最新是副议长李素桦律师藐视法庭案，属2025年，不在本次报告内。

- 6.6.7 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问各项案件的进展。第三副会长拿督陈行昌博士回应,首五宗已完成:Vintech Solution 案本会胜诉;与会员罗长庚、王亚成的两个案件败诉;前执行秘书张玳维的两个案件和解,对方道歉后撤诉。第6至第9宗涉及前署理会长拿督丁才荣的案件,仍在进行中。
- 6.6.8 会员詹道鸿 (K7390) 询问律师是本会内部还是外聘。议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬解释,不同案件需不同专业律师。詹道鸿表示理解。
- 6.6.9 会员王运东 (K5278) 质疑第4及第5案律师费高达 RM30,000,是否已开庭。他以自己50年经验指出,若庭审则合理,否则过高。他强调若由他处理,将不收费,因为他是海南人。
- 6.6.10 会员王运东补充,他在会馆服务15年,是纪律委员会委员,但因前秘书长黄良友被撤职,他也被移除。他表示海南人有义务帮助会馆,希望理事会善用资源。
- 6.6.11 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬回应,理解会员王运东愿义务服务,未来若有职员纠纷可交由后者协助。
- 6.7 会员龙藉平 (K2223) 询问财政吴伟刚提到的Raja Bot注销租金是否为RM40,000。
- 6.7.1 财政吴伟刚回复,数额为RM44,000。
- 6.7.2 会员龙藉平向财政吴伟刚提出质疑,指若产业属个人,是否会轻易注销租金,并询问租赁协议情况,认为应有解决方案。
- 6.7.3 会员龙藉平提醒注销欠款 RM44,000 的问题尚未答复。
- 6.7.4 财政吴伟刚解释,理事会曾多次催收无果,并咨询律师 Tony Chiu & Partner。因欠款低于 RM50,000,法律诉讼成本过高,不值得追究,因此决定注销。他强调,此决定是根据法律意见作出,并非草率。他补充,该租户合约已终止,理事会正寻找新租户。
- 6.7.5 会员龙藉平询问南洋酒店租赁协议及年收入情况,以及本会法律案件数量、结案情况及胜诉比例。
- 6.7.6 财政吴伟刚说明,疫情期间酒店虽困难,但仍继续租用并最终清还所有欠款。他说理事会认为维持长期稳定租户有利,目前租金调整谈判由秘书长陈官平及产业小组主导进行,需考量若更换新租户可能带来装修及可靠性风险。
- 6.7.7 署理主席拿督斯里符之庆补充,注销的 RM44,000 租户已破产。若追讨需清盘,费用过高且耗时,因此注销坏账,但仍会依程序发催收函,算是形式流程。
- 6.7.8 会员龙藉平表示理解,但质疑为何未在早期采取措施,任由欠款累积。他也询问南洋酒店租金。
- 6.7.9 署理会长拿督斯里符之庆回应,酒店租约已到期,本会仅给予短期续约。疫情期间虽欠租,但最终已全数偿还。近期他与酒店负责人会面,酒店已残旧,将进行翻新并提交计划,再与本会谈判,未来考虑给予长期租约。

- 6.7.10 法律顾问陈泽玉律师发言,表示作为业主,若租户拖欠租金超过三个月,行政部门应立即采取法律行动,若金额高,更应在一两个月内通过律师处理,否则易累积成大额欠款。他质疑,若公司关闭或报穷,为何会馆不追究?即使收不到钱,也可花小笔费用逼对方报穷,把账目处理为坏账,以利账务核销。
- 6.7.11 法律顾问陈泽玉律师进一步指出,很多律师“照章行事”,未从会馆税务或实际角度考虑。租金若数额大,拖欠一两个月即应行动,避免变成大数目坏账。他举例,有公司拖欠RM100,000后直接倒闭,最后无法追讨。作为大业主,会馆应加强处理。
- 6.7.12 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问,理事会在处理此类问题时是否曾咨询法律顾问陈泽玉律师。陈泽玉律师回答没有。
- 6.7.13 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬指出,自她主持会员大会以来,发现法律顾问几乎只是“摆设”。既然会馆委任法律顾问,日后凡需聘请律师,必须让顾问介入,听取意见。任何涉及法律的问题,也应先咨询顾问。她质疑为何陈泽玉律师之前从未被征询,却突然站起来回答问题,这显示理事会未善用顾问资源。她强调,今后理事会必须改进,即便因此惹恼理事会,她也必须直言。
- 6.8 会员龙藉平(K2223)质疑停车场依然使用固本收费方式,建议安装自动收费系统以加强管理。
- 6.8.1 他询问停车场总成本,并认为相关诉讼费用应计入成本。
- 6.8.2 财政吴伟刚回应停车场收费系统问题,指IT部门已向多家供应商征求方案,正在评估。有的公司要求五五分账,有的提议自建自营,涉及运营方式、理事及会员收费安排等问题,需要详细讨论。他保证一旦有决定会通知会员。
- 6.9 会员龙藉平(K2223)指出,本会支付RM500,000予Mah Weng Kwai & Associates诉讼费,应归入妈祖公园项目成本。
- 6.9.1 他质疑二十四雕像列为资产的做法,强调会员有权知悉项目总成本,认为目前无人能确认。
- 6.9.2 他提及2023年与理事杨庆和等讨论市政局RM189,000款项,当时建议不支付,但最终仍支付。他要求理事杨庆和说明会计部处理方式及批准效力。
- 6.9.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬回应,理事杨庆和稍后将答复,并询问会员龙藉平是否还有问题。
- 6.9.4 理事杨庆和针对会员龙藉平询问RM189,500.00的问题指出,2022年会馆理事会分为两派,当时前任与现任会长曾向他询问有关停车场的发展来源。他解释,该发展源自前任会长拿督丁才荣申请的七层楼多用途大厦,包括底层摩托与汽车停车场、储藏室与办公室。此计划自始多次向吉隆坡市政局申请,但至2022年初一直未获批准,原因是土地用途为公共机构或社会服务机构(Institutional),仅可兴建庙宇等设施。
- 6.9.5 理事杨庆和说明,后来因拿督杨天生与吉隆坡市政局关系良好,可能将计划修改为七层楼全面停车场,其他发展皆不可行。当时他曾向吉隆坡市政局寻求批准信函。结论是若仅兴建七层楼停车场,需缴付两项地契费用(premium),即2万令吉及16万9500令吉。该信件于2023年寄出。

- 6.9.6 理事杨庆和补充, 2023年2月, 会长与一批理事, 包括已故理事王禄福在Bandar Puteri召开会议, 他曾向与会者讲解批准事项。停车场涉及三块土地, 包括LOT PT 1或104, 以及LOT 143与42。后两块为农业地 (agriculture land), 必须申请更改土地用途才能建设停车场, 当时包括会长、副会长及理事在内, 多数人并不清楚停车场的实际位置。
- 6.9.7 理事杨庆和进一步说明, 2023年2月12日会议中, 他向理事会解释若拒绝缴付, 则无需支付该笔地契费用。然而三天后召开的理事会, 尽管原先多数表示反对, 最后仍一致举手通过, 仅林日喜及黄循营反对。他相信至今吉隆坡市政局仍附带条件, 要求证明三块土地的用途与类型 (status)。若要继续发展, 必须进行土地转换, 至少需额外支付2至3百万令吉的地契费用。因此RM189,500.00即属该笔开销。
- 6.9.8 会员龙藉平询问财政, 该笔RM189,500.00费用列在哪一项, 会否在吉隆坡市政局仍属有效, 是否意味着未来无需再缴, 或已失效。
- 6.9.9 理事杨庆和回应, 该笔RM189,500.00为支付予吉隆坡市政局以换取停车场发展令。他指根据拿督丁才荣的解释, 若不支付则批准信将会失效, 之后再申请将更为困难。因此, 理事会于2023年2月15日别无选择, 只能举手同意支付。
- 6.10 会员龙藉平 (K2223) 补充, 270万减值损失若合并相关项目恐超过500万, 并强调RM189,000款项必须交代。
- 6.10.1 他质问减值损失责任人, 若无人负责, 损失将由会员承担。他提醒理事会权限仅25万, 质疑超额是否属会员责任, 若如此, 会员不应贸然通过财务报告。
- 6.10.2 财政吴伟刚交由副财政林治平回应。副财政林治平表示, 这是他首次汇报, 希望大家包容, 他说明妈祖公园总费用为504.3万令吉, 但财务报告分类不同, 部分费用未直接列为项目开销。比如妈祖雕像制作费207万令吉 (2019至2023年已支付), 属项目费用; 招标广告费2.3万令吉则列在杂项。
- 6.10.3 副财政林治平进一步说明, 指雕像费用207.3万令吉已在财务报告中减值; 地面工程和园景清理110万令吉; 咨询与法律费用46.3万令吉; DBKL 批文费用及 2015 年 24 孝雕像20.9万令吉; 招标广告费2.3万令吉。至于2024年理事前往中国雕像工厂的1.7万令吉旅费, 不列入项目开销。
- 6.10.4 副财政林治平汇报, 2015至2020年总开销为380万令吉; 2021年8.6万; 2024年10.3万。虽2024年会员大会反对继续该计划, 但仍有18.3万令吉开销, 包括DBKL批文、土壤测试及雕像厂视察。2025年1月至5月亦有部分批文与图测开销。
- 6.10.5 副财政林治平表示已整理受款人及付款年份, 计算出总额, 并重新分类支出, 确认妈祖公园最终总支出为500万令吉, 50万令吉大殿粉刷则属常规支出。
- 6.10.6 会员龙藉平询问, 504万令吉是否包含30万元的后山清理费用。
- 6.10.7 副财政林治平一度未听清, 再次确认后答复, 该费用由 Crystal Business Solution 承包, 金额30.8万令吉, 已列入“场地清理”。
- 6.10.8 会员龙藉平回应, 他只是确认数据并强调该笔款项需有人负责。

- 6.10.9 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示,她观察到副财政林治平汇报时,会员龙藉平没有留意幻灯片(ppt),只看手中资料,没有认真聆听。
- 6.10.10 会员龙藉平否认,并解释自己是在寻找 Crystal Business Solution 那笔30万元的费用,当时找不到,现在已经找到。随后他询问外部审计师,想进一步了解财务报告第170页提到的“与相关一方的交易”(Related Party Transaction)及“关键管理人员补偿”(Key Management Personnel Compensation)的含义。
- 6.10.11 外部审计师王廷谚回应,所谓“关键管理人员补偿”是标准披露,本会属集体运作,并无个人管理者,因此需在报告中说明不存在此情况。至于“与相关一方的交易”,只是披露性质,不影响财务报告结果。
- 6.11 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示,这一届理事会能够回应会员提问,值得鼓励,希望他们继续努力。
- 6.12 会员冯廷荫(XK3875)询问,2023年支付吉隆坡市政局RM189,500.00的款项,用于妈祖公园的哪项开销?是否与七层楼停车场相关?他要求财政或会计师解释,并说明该capital item是否获会员大会批准。
- 6.13 会员龙藉平(K2223)表示,目前关键的是RM189,500的费用是否已经浪费(burn)。他追问财政是否确认该笔款项已浪费。
- 6.13.1 副财政林治平反问对方“burn”是什么意思。会员龙藉平(K2223)回答是“is gone”。副财政林治平询问是否指“spend out”的意思,并解释该笔款项确实已经支出,从2023年的数据汇总可见该款项已记账。他强调这是事实,但要进一步解释情况比较困难。
- 6.13.2 会员龙藉平询问该笔费用是否还有任何作用。
- 6.13.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬反问,为何不直接向会员解释在什么情况下已缴付的款项会失效。
- 6.13.4 会员龙藉平续称,会馆为申请吉隆坡市政局批准兴建停车场已缴付RM189,500,但最终并未兴建停车场。他追问该笔RM189,500在未来若申请新的停车场时是否可以抵销。
- 6.13.5 署理会长拿督斯里符之庆回应指出,会馆即将在庙宇后方兴建新的停车场,因此提出是否能抵销的疑问。
- 6.13.6 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬解释,缴付该款项后必须在规定期限内完成兴建,否则执照会失效。若未完成兴建,日后再申请时必须重新缴付。她说明,原本准备兴建七层楼停车场的地段属于农业地,若要转换为商业地,章程规定必须获得四分之三会员同意,而当时理事会并未完成该程序。
- 6.13.7 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬续称,在未完成土地转换程序前已申请并取得准证,同时款项已缴付,但因土地未转换,是否能在期限内完成兴建仍存疑。若会员大会未通过,理事会又无意继续推动,该笔RM189,500将处于“冻过水”的状态。她认为理事会必须妥善处理此事。

- 6.14 会员翁方坤 (K2676) 表示, 在聆听了各方的谈话后, 此事的结论是提醒我们, 当年因为支持了前会长拿督丁才荣的部分决定, 导致出现失误。若将所有责任推给丁才荣是不公平的, 他确实有错误, 但在座部分理事当时是支持其做法的。因此, 这件事必须视为教训及警钟, 日后在处理任何事项时必须谨慎。若当时理事们能更严谨地透视问题并详细分析, 今日便不会出现RM2,700,000的烂账、逾RM5,000,000的或有负债 (Contingency liabilities), 以及逾RM1,000,000的律师费。
- 6.15 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬要求有人提议及复议, 并接纳财政报告。
- 6.15.1 会员郑庭安 (K17912) 提议, 第七副会长陈颖平附议。议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬要求全体鼓掌一致通过, 接纳2024年度由审核员审核之财政报告。

### (七) 讨论提案

- 7.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬要求秘书长陈官平汇报一共收到多少份提案及提问。她提醒大家, 许多提问已在刚才的环节中获得解答, 若已得到答案便不应重复纠缠。
- 7.2 秘书长陈官平汇报, 一共接获十四项提案。
- 7.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问秘书长陈官平如何处理这些提案。
- 7.4 秘书长陈官平汇报, 在召集人兼第三副会长拿督陈行昌博士的召集下, 理事会已成立修章小组委员会, 并委任周昌进为主席, 带领小组研究及修改章程。目前已召开7次小组委员会会议及1次建议草案审查会议。
- 7.5 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬再度询问秘书长陈官平接获多少提案、接纳多少提案, 以及处理方式, 并强调若不清楚说明, 事后必将引起争论。
- 7.6 秘书长陈官平汇报, 基本上由会员王安平 (K4526) 提议、会员林日炯 (K2742) 复议的一共有十一项提案; 加上侨南华小董事长拿督林鸿昌律师的侨南提案; 拿督斯里符之庆提议、第三副会长拿督陈行昌博士复议的施赠贫老提案; 以及会员黄良友的提案, 由会员王运东提议、会员林猷广复议。
- 7.7 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬亲自向大会汇报: 一共收到八份提案及提问, 总计十八项提案与七项提问。理事会经讨论后, 议决接纳三项提案在大会上进行讨论, 即目前荧幕上显示的三项, 其余提案则已给予书面回复。
- 7.8 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示, 既然已有书面回复则不再讨论; 若仍有异议, 必须等三项提案讨论完毕后再行处理, 否则连三项提案也无法完成。
- 7.9 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬邀请侨南华小董事长拿督林鸿昌律师向大会讲解此提案之原由及背景。

提案一: 吁请本馆批准侨南华小董事部推展一项预计价值八百万令吉的三层楼建筑计划, 包括底层作为历史走廊及停车位, 一楼为停车位, 二楼为礼堂兼羽球场与篮球场, 并要求会馆拨款三百五十万令吉作为部分建筑费。

- 7.9.1 侨南华小董事长拿督林鸿昌律师汇报称, 他于一年多前出任董事长。随着2024年改

- 选,董事部出现人事变动,多数由新成员担任。根据政府规定,董事长需具备至少三年董事经历,他遂在“蜀中无大将”的情况下出任董事长。
- 7.9.2 他回顾侨南华小辉煌时期学生曾逾千人,但自十九楼(Perkeliling Flat)搬迁后人数逐年下降,目前仅265人,其中华裔165人,巫裔、印裔及其他族群90人。多年来董事部尝试包括举办英语补习班等方式吸引学生,但效果有限。相较之下,中国华小虽不在华裔聚居区,却凭办学特色吸引学生四方而来。
- 7.9.3 他指出,校门因兴建马路天桥而被遮掩,影响了曝光度。尽管如此,侨南华小学生近年表现优异:2024年在雪州与联邦直辖区羽球赛获19面奖牌(7金),截至2025年6月已获17面奖牌(9金),虽无羽球场,家长仍自费接送训练。部分学生更代表国家参加东运会羽球赛。学生亦在全国华语演讲赛夺冠、华语辩论赛获亚军。
- 7.9.4 他进一步补充,学生亦在二十四节令鼓、亚太区奥数赛、小学华乐赛及跆拳道赛中获佳绩。为培养更多人才,校方认为有必要兴建更现代化的设施,以提升形象,吸引学生。
- 7.9.5 董事部建议兴建三层楼建筑:底层设历史走廊与停车场;二层为停车场;三层为综合体育馆(篮球场、羽球场)。现有历史走廊常年关闭且不显眼,新走廊将每日开放,以更正式堂皇的方式展示先贤贡献。
- 7.9.6 他补充,校方调查发现,学校步行范围内有4至5项公寓计划将在2026年底落成,其中一处有918个单位,若吸引200户学生入学,即可增加200名学生。因此,应趁机建设以提高竞争力。
- 7.9.7 他强调,侨南华小是会馆产业,承载108年来海南先贤心血,必须守业并发扬光大。当前项目已获一批顾问、工程师及工料测量师(QS)承诺免费服务,预算约RM8,000,000,迄今认捐RM4,500,000。
- 7.9.8 他请求大会通过此计划,并授权会馆在最坏情况下资助RM3,500,000,惟他有信心最终或无需动用会馆资金。
- 7.10 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问:若拨款RM350万,是否将冠上“雪隆海南会馆大楼”名称?拿督林鸿昌律师答复是,议长笑称“会很有面子”,并澄清仅属玩笑,不影响会员判断。
- 7.11 会员黄良友(K0019)询问此案是否已获理事会通过,并要求记录日期。
- 7.11.1 秘书处汇报,第7次理事会(11/06/2025)已通过,秘书长陈官平确认属实。
- 7.12 会员龙藉平(K223)询问工程完工时程。
- 7.12.1 拿督林鸿昌律师答复说尚需教育部批准,若顺利,今年内可获批文,明年完成建设。
- 7.13 会员龙藉平(K2223)表示并非反对开销,而是关心仅265名学生是否值得兴建RM8,000,000工程。
- 7.13.1 拿督林鸿昌律师回应指建筑物为未来1000名学生做准备,校方已积极在网络宣传并吸引专业人士家庭关注。

- 7.14 会员黄良友 (K0019) 指出当年会馆资助建校时学生逾1700人, 教室已超过现今需求, 现部分教室空置、漏水及损坏, 质疑应优先维修并关注礼堂收入可行性, 否则恐步上吉隆坡多所空置礼堂的后尘。
- 7.14.1 拿督林鸿昌律师回应指新建筑启用后, 图书馆将迁移至空置教室, 日后学生增加可再利用。礼堂及球场则有出租潜力, 尤其羽毛球及Pickleball需求高, 可为学校带来收入。
- 7.15 会员郑庭安 (K17912) 询问若最终会馆未出资, 是否“雪隆海南会馆”字样将不出现?
- 7.15.1 拿督林鸿昌律师澄清说无论筹款方式如何, 海南会馆贡献不会被遗忘, 工程仍会冠以会馆名义。
- 7.16 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问, RM8,000,000是否仅为建筑费。
- 7.16.1 拿督林鸿昌律师回答说主要为建筑费, 设备有限, 仅历史走廊涉及较多布置。
- 7.17 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬要求举手表决。秘书处统计, 出席225人, 其中赞成103人, 无人反对, 弃权16人。议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬宣布大比数通过, 并恭贺侨南华小。
- 7.18 侨南华小董事长拿督林鸿昌律师表示深受感动, 感谢支持, 并承诺竭尽全力完成计划。
- 7.19 署理会长拿督斯里符之庆提议, 副会长拿督陈行昌博士附议, 向会员大会提呈提案二。
- 提案二: 建议会员大会批准拨款 马币三十五万令吉 (RM350,000) 作为本会2026年度施赠贫老活动的开支预算。
- 7.19.1 署理会长拿督斯里符之庆汇报, 会馆每年举办施赠贫老活动, 往往红包不足, 今年尤其短缺, 因此建议将原本的RM250,000增至RM350,000, 以造福更多会员。
- 7.19.2 会长符和泽补充, 施赠贫老并非普通红包, 而是专为贫困会员准备的援助金。
- 7.20 会员朱运辉 (K15820) 询问, 若拨款RM350,000, 每位受惠者可获多少? 布施的形式为何?
- 7.20.1 福利组主任彭志光解释, 2024年1月的施赠贫老活动, 共有1700人领取, 超出往年的1500人, 而根据章程10.2, 理事会每项开支不得超过RM250,000, 导致部分人士未能受惠。最后, 多数理事自掏腰包支付RM22,950, 以弥补不足。此次提案即为避免类似情况。每位受惠者可获RM150。2025年起采用预先注册 (Google Form), 人数控制在1500人以内, 活动顺利进行。
- 7.21 会员冯廷荫 (K3875) 建议, 批准金额应具弹性。若实际开支超出RM350,000, 可由理事会先行批准, 但须在下次会员大会报告。他建议设定上限RM500,000, 以供调节。
- 7.22 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬提醒, 应界定“贫老”的资格, 否则人数难以控制。她举例, 若60岁以上即可领取, 自己亦符合条件; 且RM150对远道而来的老人家而言, 车费已占去大半, 真正受惠有限, 因此必须深思如何落实。
- 7.23 会员郑庭安 (K17912) 建议, 将金额提高至RM350,000后, 受惠者人数应维持1500人, 每人应可获RM200, 其余作为杂费。他同时质疑“贫老”一词, 因不少领取者并非贫困, 建议改称“乐龄人”

士赞助金”。

7.23.1 议长周美芬认同,并笑言“乐龄红包”亦合适。

7.23.2 福利组主任彭志光澄清,施赠贫老仅限65岁以上会员。截至2025年6月,共有7204人符合资格,若人人领取,将需逾百万令吉,因此必须限制人数。

7.24 会员朱运辉(K15820)建议采用网上转账方式,避免老人舟车劳顿及车费过高。他强调,布施应惠及真正需要的人,而非流于形式。

7.25 会员林日炯(K2742)作为受惠者,表示“贫老”字眼不恰当,应定位为乐龄人士福利。他赞成改用注册方式,因能避免长时间排队,保障老人家权益。

7.26 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬总结,提案重点是增加预算至RM350,000,以应付未来人数增长。长远而言,会馆应制度化管理会员福利,明确资格与方式,使真正需要的会员受惠,并通过照顾乡亲来吸引更多年轻人加入。

7.27 经表决,赞成多数,2人反对,2人弃权。议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬宣布提案获大比数通过,并请全体鼓掌。

7.28 会员庄耿俊(K8203)提呈提案三。

提案三:推动大学课程更公平合理录取制度诉求政府探讨在尚未能全面落实以成绩为基础前,采用按我国族群比例分配的配额制度,以录取成绩优异的各族优秀生进入大学预科课程。

7.29 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问是否需要辩论,并表示这是多数会员的心声,但仍有人持不同意见。

7.30 会议结果为1人反对,无人弃权,大比数通过。议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬要求全体鼓掌通过,大部分会员响应。

7.31 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬随后开放让未被列入提案的会员提出上诉。

7.32 会员王安平(K4526)询问是否需要读出其提案。

7.32.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示,在他读出提案之前,须先由理事会作出答复,若其在听取后仍不满意,才可继续表达意见。

7.32.2 会员王安平(K4526)指出,其提案获得114人签名支持,依照章程必须被提呈,理事会不能直接答复。他强调,该提案必须被听取,若大多数人不同意,则应交由表决决定,依据第7.2条文执行。

7.32.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬要求其先读出,再听取理事意见后方可进入投票。她同时要求逐项进行。

7.33 会员王安平(K4526)以英文读出其提呈的第二项提案,即会馆年度预算案,并要求翻译中文,但议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬拒绝。

提案2: 本会年度支出预算案(提议人王安平, 附议人林日炯)

理事会得每年在年度会员大会上, 提呈预先年度每项活动支出预算案申请予年度会员大会讨论、征求大会的通过和核准。

这预先申请包拨款含以下项目, 但不单限于这些项目: a. 职员薪金、包括超时津贴和、终花红和奖励金。b. 临时工人薪金。c. 对外捐款及慈善项目包括年度施赠贫老金。d. 教育贷学金、助学金及补助金。e. 传统佳节庆典活动系列、包括农历新春及除夕日。f. 产业维修、装修及提升工程。g. 其他不在以上的支出项目。

理由: 年度支出预算案申请时确保资金运用透明度、此物问责制、清楚提供整年活动系列的资金流向、加强资金管控及符合国际标准作业准则、鼓励善用资源、时时改善监控和评估报告。

7.33.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬向理事会说明, 对方建议今后每年会员大会应提呈下一年度财政预算案, 此举属进步做法, 有助理事会提前规划开销, 不足时可再提呈会员大会追认或批准。她询问会员是否同意。

7.33.2 副会长拿督陈行昌博士表示, 预算应由新届理事会在改选后根据计划制定。若立即执行, 可能导致选举年后全年工作停滞, 建议交由修章小组委员会研究, 之后再开放给会员进行为期一天的详细讨论, 以找出最好的处理方法。

7.33.3 会员周昌斌(K4462)认为, 方法没有最好, 只有更好。公司或协会的活动必须设有预算、收支平衡点及应对超支的措施。他强调不应再拖延, 透明与事先规划十分重要。

7.33.4 提议人王安平(K4526)重申, 财务预算每年应有的基本要求。

7.33.5 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬认同提案, 认为即使政府选举在即, 仍须提呈预算案, 这是良好治理的表现。

7.33.6 会员龙籍平(K2223)支持提案, 强调预算是理事会的责任, 不应以困难为由拒绝执行。既然预算获会员通过, 新理事会接手后亦应承继并作必要调整。

7.33.7 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬进一步说明, 若每年制定预算, 可避免特别提案临时申请经费(如施赠贫老350千令吉), 并可提前明确方向, 提升效率。她建议从明年开始实行。

7.33.8 财政吴伟刚展示“2025预算总览”, 表示理事会每年均有拟定预算, 并在活动结束后对比实际开销进行调整。

7.33.9 副财政林治平指出, 编制预算时间与会员大会时间未必一致。若6月会员大会需批准来预算, 意味着预算须提前7个月编制, 时间偏早。

7.33.10 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬建议, 对会计年度及其截止日期进行调整。虽然她没有修读会计专业, 但她觉得其中技术上的问题.....

7.34 提案提议人王安平(K4526)建议就此提案进行表决。

7.35 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示, 既然理事会已有财务预算编制机制, 就说明没有问题。

7.35.1 副财政林治平表示, 馆方会准备下一年度财务预算, 并提呈会员大会让大家了解新一

- 年度的工作计划,但并非寻求会员大会正式通过,因为若预算日后需调整,将会造成程序上的问题。
- 7.35.2 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问副财政林治平,是否有公司或团体编制年度预算的经验,并请其说明为何不能让会员大会批准或认可财务预算。
- 7.35.3 副财政林治平回应,他曾参与部门预算编制。他认为若依程序通过当然没问题,但若会员大会在6月举行,预算却需在5月准备,用于隔年1月,则等于提前7个月,时机过早,不如国家预算在10月提呈更为合理。
- 7.35.4 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问在座是否有会计师,惟无人回应。
- 7.35.5 会员龙藉平(K2223)表示,副财政林治平提出的仅是困难。会员们选出理事会就是为了解决问题,因此必须执行。他并要求出示预算,并希望了解总开销金额。
- 7.35.6 副会长拿督陈行昌博士回应,作为新春筹委会主席,他在新年前已与委员详细拟定15天活动计划,并由各小组提交预算整合编制。他强调大会讨论的是2024年报告,若要辩论2025新春活动预算,他将不参与。
- 7.36 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬要求会场安静,并说明:  
(1) 现在只是在于大家是否习惯采用目前的方式处理财政预算案;  
(2) 根据章程,每项工程开支有规定限额,但今年新春已超出预算;  
若每年制定并提呈预算,理事会即可像国会一样依法执行,避免日后被质疑超支。
- 7.36.1 她强调“6月不能制定来年预算”的说法并不成立,并认为提案部分内容可采纳,最终应由大会表决决定。
- 7.37 副会长拿督陈行昌博士指出,理事会将会落实会员提出“要编制财务预算”的要求,但是要给予时间处理。他指出如果今天通过“日后要向大会提呈财务预算”的议案,实际操作将会是明年无法开展农历新年的工作,因为必须等到6月会员大会通过预算。因此,落实上述措施需要时间慢慢去调整。
- 7.37.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬认同,理事会需时间逐步落实。
- 7.38 会员翁方坤(K2676,系统名字为翁宏文)要求提供3年预算。他认同议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬的说法,并强调时间不是问题,即便准备需时2个月,他也能接受,主要是今天必须通过“未来须提呈财务预算”的提案。
- 7.39 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬建议,本提案今日通过,但从明年起才执行,并以2026年会员大会提呈2027年预算为例,呼吁表决。
- 7.40 会员杨芊莹(K13444)表示,新年开销大致可预测,例如今年50千,若额外需20千,则应直接列入预算70千,便于掌握方向。她强调今天即可回应,无需再等一年或三年,并认为此举能避免过度开支。
- 7.41 大会议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬交由表决,全场无人反对,大会一致通过:理事会自2026年起,须向会员大会提呈下一年度的财务预算。

## 7.42 会员王安平(K4526)提呈以下提案：

提案3:委任首席官方发言人(提议人王安平,附议人林日炯)

会员建议和议决委任本会会长、秘书长或理事会推选其中1位理事为本会首席官方发言人。本会不会承认没有受权者代本会发言,其言论不具代表本会立场以及其言论没有任何法律基础。

7.42.1 副会长拿督陈行昌博士表示认同,并说明理事会在对外访问及发言时,一律要通过秘书处安排,不允许任何人擅自代表会馆召开记者会或接受访问。发言人一般为会长。

7.42.2 提案提议人王安平(K 4526)感谢副会长拿督陈行昌博士的回答,并补充指出曾发生会长对外发言引发争议,进而导致会馆卷入法律诉讼。

7.42.3 副会长拿督陈行昌博士说明,该记者会是由理事会授权,并由会长批准的,是一场正式授权的记者会。只是后来有人意图抹黑会馆,进行诽谤。会馆当时的处理是依照章程行事。但会馆最近发现,有人未经会馆同意擅自接受电视访问,因此他们将深入了解此事。

## 7.43 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问会员王安平(K 4526),是否认同上述所讨论的事项,会员王安平(K 4526)表示认同。

7.43.1 提案提议人王安平(K 4526)表示认同,与会者亦无人反对“会长为本会官方发言人”。

## 7.44 会员王安平(K4526)提呈以下提案：

提案4:网上/线上银行服务(提议人王安平,附议人林日炯)

本会章程第10.1条文必须纳入网上/线上银行服务1项。

7.44.1 副会长拿督陈行昌博士指出,会馆章程已涵盖线上银行服务,目前该服务已实行,并也已纳入在标准作业程序(SOP)中。

7.44.2 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示,意思是章程中没有相关限制,因此可以自由进行线上操作。

7.44.3 提案提议人王安平(K4526)表示若此事项已涵盖在章程内,相信可以解决许多问题,包括人力资源的问题。

7.44.4 鉴于会馆章程已涵盖“线上银行服务”,提案提议人王安平(K 4526)以及与会者均无异议。

## 7.45 会员王安平(K4526)提呈以下提案：

提案5:实行及执行无现金支付制度(提议人王安平,附议人林日炯)

建议 2026年元月1日开始实行及执行无现金支付制度。所有本会向外支付必须透过网上银行或线上银行服务来做支付,这包括汇款和转账。在章程第10.1(f)条文,财政继续保留每次零用现金不超过3,000.00令吉。

7.45.1 副会长拿督陈行昌博士指出,会馆尽可能实行无现金支付。会馆遵循标准作业程序及ISO要求,相关现金由职员保管以用于交易。有些活动需要现场发放现金,例如赛事活

动,因为无法事先知道获胜者,因此必须现场支付,涉及现金交易。会馆一直监督与审核现金交易,特别是最近有会员要求汇出马币11千令吉的事项。多年来现金提取均妥善进行。目前已实行每月报告制度,定期汇报各项活动中提取的现金金额,以及未使用部分存回银行的情况。本会目前的财务和会计人员妥善管理这些现金交易,但并非所有交易都能实现无现金,例如向外供应商购买茶点和蛋糕,这些属于日常营运所需。

- 7.45.2 提案提议人王安平(K 4526)表示,他理解部分情况确实需使用现金付款,但希望未来能大幅推动无现金支付,以防止任何不当行为、伪造或其他不良情况的发生。他们所追求的是透明、有效的管控,不要过去曾经发生过的那些乱象。他强调,为了获得明确保障,因此才会要求将这项提案认真交付表决,并严肃对待。
- 7.45.3 副会长拿督陈行昌博士表示,会馆正逐步减少现金使用,尽可能采用无现金支付方式,目前也在使用二维码及银行转账等渠道进行付款。
- 7.45.4 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问,本会是如何发放职员薪金。
- 7.45.5 副会长拿督陈行昌博士表示,都是采用支票或线上转账职员薪金,甚少使用现金,除非是那些只工作一天的临时工。会馆在大多数情况下尽可能选择线上转账,并认同提案人所说的“实行及执行无现金支付制度”,惟相信财政在实际操作方面真的很头痛,但是正在努力改进中。
- 7.45.6 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬认为,会馆已经在“实行及执行无现金支付制度”,惟需给他们改进的空间。
- 7.45.7 鉴于会馆已经在“实行及执行无现金支付制度”,提案提议人王安平(K 4526)以及与会者均无异议。

7.46 会员王安平(K4526)提呈以下提案:

提案6:批准请款(提议人王安平,附议人林日炯)

本会财政或副财政需要先依据标准作业程序审核及细查任何请款申请、确认无误后方可核准请款申请以及签署支票或网上/线上银行支付服务申请。根据章程第 10.1 (d) 条文,第1组及第2组才联署。

- 7.47 副会长拿督陈行昌博士指出,根据目前的章程,首先由秘书长进行“审批”(approval),随后由财政进行“复核”(validation),同一人(如财政)不可同时负责审批与复核,因此这两个步骤由不同人员执行。按照ISO标准,在预算及相关事项确认无误后,秘书长针对RS15进行付款审批;随后由会计或财政人员核查文件的完整性及准确性,确认无误后才完成签署与最终批准。

7.47.1 目前的流程已设有一人审核、一人复核,三人共同签署支票的机制。理事会会把这个提案交给修章小组委员会,以进一步探讨是否有更完善的制衡方式。

7.47.2 如果现在将“审批”再交回财政一人负责,那就失去了制衡的意义。而实际上,大多数付款审批都来自理事会(GC)。秘书长只是执行理事会已经通过并记录在案的決定。这些审批权限和机制已经写入章程中。实际上,根据章程,目前有四个可以审批付款的角色:

1. 主席(President)——可审批最多RM10,000
2. 秘书长(Secretary General)——可审批最多RM5,000

3. 理事会 (GC)
4. 常务理事会 (Exco) ——最多可审批RM25,000

- 7.48 会员翁方坤 (K 2676, 系统名字为翁宏文) 指出, 在所有企业会计操作中, 无论是上市公司还是私人公司, 通常都是由财政或会计部门先审核所有相关文件, 确认无误后, 才提交给高层审批, 例如财政或主席。这才是合理、正确的做法。而馆方目前是由秘书长先审批, 然后再交由财政处理的做法不正确, 并不符合这个规范, 因此提出建议以指出此流程上的缺陷。
- 7.48.1 他补充道, 曾听闻“会长和秘书长都签了, 财政也只能照签”的说法, 但这显然是错误的做法。
- 7.48.2 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬认为翁方坤 (K 2676, 系统名字为翁宏文) 的说法正确; 款项申请人要先提呈申请, 然后交给财政检查与核实, 之后再交给秘书长或会长审批。
- 7.48.3 副会长拿督陈行昌博士指出, 本会现行章程是如此规定, 大会议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬与会员翁方坤 (K 2676, 系统名字为翁宏文) 建议修改章程。
- 7.48.4 副会长拿督陈行昌博士表示, 大家持有不同看法, 建议将此事交由修章小组委员会进行全面研究, 找出最合适的处理方式。如需修改, 也应包括对ISO程序及相关表格的调整。
- 7.49 修章小组委员会副主任莫龙泽 (K 8227) 表示, 修章小组委员会的任务是对章程进行全面而深入的检讨, 并提出尽可能完善的修订建议。他坚信所提出的任何章程修改, 最终都必须与会员大会的集体意愿保持一致。若会员被允许在会员大会上讨论及表决提案, 所通过的决议便可合理地被视为代表大会的集体立场。
- 7.49.1 根据章程第7.1条, 会员大会是最高权力机关, 因此在大会上通过的决议, 应该不是障碍, 而是为修章小组委员会的工作提供方向和依据。事实上, 一旦某项涉及章程的决议已在大会中通过, 修章小组委员会便无须再针对该议题进行详细辩论, 而应将该决议纳入最终的章程修订建议中。
- 7.50 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示, 目前为止, 大会仅就其中一项提案 (即有关预算案) 进行表决。其余的会员提案将交由修章小组委员会处理, 负责就这些提案内容进行讨论与重新检视, 并提交章程修改建议。
- 7.50.1 修章小组委员会副主任莫龙泽 (K 8227) 表示, 问题在于即使过去通过了的提案而并未修改章程的做法是否合法? 此外, 该事项实属执行层面的事务, 因此应当就此进行表决, 并强调“会员的意见非常重要”。
- 7.50.2 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示不会对此提案进行表决, 因为将交由修章小组委员会去研究与提出修订建议。如果今天表决通过就会受到约束, 此举将导致修章小组委员会失去再进行研究或修订的权限。她询问提案提议人王安平 (K 4526) 是否认同她的说法。
- 7.50.3 提案提议人王安平 (K 4526) 表示, 认同大会议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬的观点, 同时也不希望因此限制修章小组委员会的自主空间。
- 7.50.4 会员龙籍平 (K 2223) 表示, 修章小组委员会副主任莫龙泽 (K 8227) 所表达的是此事实属执行层面的事务, 在座的会员已经表达他们的希望和决定, 无需交由修章小组委员

会处理。他也询问章程中哪一条条款说明“秘书长必须先审批”。

- 7.50.5 副会长拿督陈行昌博士回应,是章程“9.4秘书长职责:(f) 审核一切支款单据”。他认同所提议的是个好方法,但是若今天通过有关提案,恐怕明天执行就会遇阻,因为面对现行章程与今日提案之间的冲突,将不知该以哪一方为准。
- 7.50.6 会员龙籍平(K 2223)询问副会长拿督陈行昌博士,他是否明白章程中的秘书长职责是“审核”并不是“审批”。
- 7.51 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬就她在发言前未翻查章程而致歉,呼吁大家应回到提案本身进行讨论。
- 7.51.1 她认为在秘书长签署之前需要先审核。目前依照章程执行的财务流程:即请款人需先提出申请,财政进行初步审核(verified);若属特定单位如福利组的活动,还须由该单位负责人进行核实;接着由秘书长签核,待所有步骤完成后,方可发出支票或进行付款。目前所提出的提案内容仍不够完善,建议应参考会员翁方坤(K 2676,系统名字为翁宏文)的建议。
- 7.51.2 最后,在执行秘书走上舞台与议长短暂沟通后,议长表示自己不太了解 ISO 的具体作业方式,并当场向黄良友乡长询问“目前所执行的财务程序是否受到 ISO 标准的限制”。
- 7.51.3 会员翁方坤(K 2676,系统名字为翁宏文)认为,会馆的运作不应受限于 ISO 标准,因为 ISO 属于另一个范畴,与日常营运事务应区分处理。
- 7.51.4 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬举例,前秘书长会被纪律行动对付,质疑当时的 IT 主任是否有遵循请款程序:是否先提出申请?是否经过审核?是否再由秘书长核准?
- 她进一步举例说明:若教育组举办活动产生费用,应先整理账单,由活动负责人签名后提交财政审核,再交给由秘书长,最后才能付款。一般上,会馆的支票签署人是财政、会长和秘书长。其实,所要求的只是一个规范程序。若通过此提案,是否会影响会馆运作?他认为若事情果真如此发展,那问题应出在 ISO,而不是会馆的问题。
- 7.51.5 会员翁方坤(K 2676,系统名字为翁宏文)指出,他曾在国内国外大公司工作,并曾任职上市公司总裁。他认为次做法是通行的做法,应该照着这个正确的程序做,如果章程是错的就应该修章,故他建议进行表决。
- 7.52 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬请大家举手表决。她强调“章程9.4:秘书长审核一切支款单据”,即使投票通过了也没有违反章程9.4 f。因为那只是让秘书长能够受到更好的保障。她询问秘书长,在他不了解的情况下,而直接要求他审核该活动账单,然后才指示财政付款,他是否愿意承担这个责任?此举对他是否公平?
- 7.52.1 秘书长陈官平表示“危险”。
- 7.52.2 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示,根据她在马华以及相关部门的经验,从来没有“由秘书长先签,再由财政签”的做法。理事刚才没有举手,是否表示不同意?她说执行过程其实非常简单,举例来说,如果今天有人要请款,就需提供单据提呈申请。提交之后,由财政查核该申请是否属于已经通过的活动。不过,这个流程不适用于临时购买糕点或饮料的事宜,这也是为什么财政手上会有 RM3,000 的预算,就是为了支付这类费用。

- 7.53 教育组主任黄靖胜指出,该议题涉及行政运作层面的事务,因此他认同可以将相关内容纳入提案中。但他建议,会议可原则上先接纳“将提案交由理事会(GC)进一步研究与落实”。他强调,若在此阶段直接进行提案表决,仅能表达“赞成”或“反对”的立场,而目前仍有许多细节尚未明确。他建议将此意见记录在案(put in record),但不要表决,并在明年大会上作出解释与说明。
- 7.53.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示,针对该议案的处理,没有必要对投票产生顾虑,这只不过是一个议案而已。
- 7.53.2 教育组主任黄靖胜则说明,不是每一项提案都适合直接进入投票环节。若进行表决,可能被理解为出现立场上的对峙。
- 7.53.3 会员翁方坤(K 2676,系统名字为翁宏文)表示,投票本身并非对立,而是为了推动应有的决策。他认为大家正在做正确的事情,并呼吁大会议长支持该流程,强调这属于一般做法。
- 7.53.4 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬解释称,自己的立场是希望把事情处理得更好,并无意造成误会或对立。她提到,虽然目前的提案尚不完整,但可以接纳其基本精神,并交由理事会后续完善与处理。她希望事情在在会议中充分讨论,并能让大家心服口服比较好。
- 7.53.5 教育组主任黄靖胜补充指出,理事会成员是由会员选出的,因此应对理事会的工作有信心。他表示可以听取会员意见,但不认为应由会员直接在大会上指示理事会如何处理事务。他建议相关意见交由理事会进一步研究,并指出,若所有事项都以类似方式推进,他认为并不妥当。
- 7.54 会员黄良友(K 0019)指出,所有会员都有权在会议中提出意见并记录在案,但在没有正式提呈提案的前提下,立即进行投票并不合适。他不认为大家有这种表决的权力。
- 7.54.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬回应说,该提案其实已经提出过一次,只是当时未被理事会接纳。其实该提案已符合提呈所需的条件。根据规定,若会员的提案提交时间延迟或逾期,理事会有权不予接纳;若内容属于询问性质,理事会也可选择以口头方式回应。他进一步说明,凡是符合程序的提案,提案人即有权请求在会议中进行讨论。此外,议长指出,理事在处理相关事务时应承担应有的执行责任,不应将责任转为由秘书长承担,唯有如此,才能提升组织的透明度与整体运作的效率。
- 7.54.2 会员黄良友(K 0019)则表示,若理事会未能采纳提案,可考虑召开特别会员大会。
- 7.54.3 提案提议人王安平(K 4526)赞同该提案应进行表决,并再次强调会议记录需完整反映讨论过程。
- 7.55 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示,她认同该提案的精神,即希望会馆在付款程序上更加符合一般财务管理的规范。她建议,若获得会员认同,由会馆负责进一步完善与落实,以提升整体财务制度的健全性与完整性。随后她进行现场举手表决,因无人反对,议案获一致通过。
- 7.56 会员王安平(K4526)提呈以下提案:
- 提案7:解读本会章程第10.2(a) (b) (c) (d) 条文里的“在任何每1次”词句的真正含义(提议人王

安平, 附议人林日炯)

“在任何每1次”在章程第10.2(a) (b) (c) (d) 条文都清晰解读为“在任何单1项目”的含义, 是指单1 整个项目。这包括农历除夕、农历大年初一至十五庆典活动系列是归于1 整个项目。如卫塞节和妈祖娘娘千秋宝诞各别也属于“单1个项目”。任何单 1 整个庆典活动系列项目都有本身关键要素、本身的庆祝环节和庆祝活动节目系列项目于同时间管理与举行。

7.56.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬建议, 因为这些内容涉及用词定义的问题, 交由修章小组委员会深入研究, 并确保能真正针对问题作出回应。

7.56.2 提案提议人王安平认同, 但是他认为必须从现在开始采取正面的行动, 因为.....

7.56.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示, 刚才副会长拿督陈行昌博士已经表示欢迎大家提交修章建议给修章小组委员会研究。

7.56.4 会员龙藉平(K 2223) 认为, 现在讨论的不是修改章程的问题, “在任何每1次”字眼的定义是属于另一个独立问题。会员们希望现在就要让大会表决 “在任何每1次”的字眼做出定义。举例来说, 今天在场有50或100位会员就可以作出决定, 但委员会仅仅只有10人却代表众会员作决定。

7.56.5 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问为何要仓促处理, 此有关如何解读章程中的措辞, 在没有经过研究的情况下就直接处理。

7.56.6 会员龙藉平表示他会保持耐心, 再等两三年, 也等着几百万令吉继续被浪费。他以最近的新春活动为例, 指出相关开销轻易就超过一百万令吉。他问这笔支出是经何人批准。

7.56.7 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬认为, 事情不可能一夜之间得以改变, 大家在这几年已经作出了不少改进, 本会理事也已经很好, 大家应该给自己与理事们一个掌声。但大家也需要多一点耐性, 若日后还是有问题, 相信大家自然会去 “监督和纠正”, 但至少现在要给予他们一些信任, 毕竟他们是大家选出来的。她呼吁大家先把眼前该做的事做好。

7.56.8 提案提议人王安平表示, 至少认同他们要改变的精神。

7.56.9 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬建议, 交由修章小组委员会研究 “解读本会章程第10.2(a) (b) (c) (d) 条文里的“在任何每1次”词句的真正含义”。提案人王安平认同议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬之建议, 把此事项交由修章小组委员会研究。

7.57 会员王安平(K4526) 提呈以下提案:

提案8: 解读本会章程第15.3条文里的“工程/项目”字眼 (提议人王安平, 附议人林日炯)

在章程第15.3条文内的“工程/项目”字眼应解读为:

“任何尝试进行的工程建案项目、佳节庆典活动系列、维修项目、采购案项目等有金钱牵涉或是有合约性的管制、有时限管制或有限时完成目标的项目。”

7.57.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬认为上述提案也是讨论用词定义, 其性质与提案(7)相似, 建议讨论下一个提案。

7.57.2 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬建议, 交由修章小组委员会研究“在章程第15.3条文内的“工程/项目”字眼的解读”, 提案提议人王安平(K 4526) 及与会者均无异议。

7.58 会员王安平(K4526) 提呈以下提案:

提案9: 接纳内部审核准则(提议人王安平, 附议人林日炯)  
年度会员大会核准及接纳建议的内部审核准则(附件1)。

7.58.1 提案提议人王安平(K 4526) 指出, 内部审核准则纸本已提交理事会(GC), 该准则是马来西亚内审的通行标准。他补充, 由于本会章程中对内部稽查员的职责未有明确规定, 仅对外部审计师有所提及, 因此希望通过此举有助于本会更好地规范相关制度。

7.58.2 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬提问, 一般公司是否同时设有内部稽查员与外部审计师。同时, 她指出大会所选出的两位内部稽查员目前皆已辞职。

7.58.3 提案提议人王安平回应指出, 此次讨论针对的是会馆, 而非一般公司。他也不知道两位内部稽查员皆已辞职。

7.58.4 提案提议人王安平指出, 内部稽查员职责缺乏明确说明, 导致执行过程中出现困难。他坦言, 有些人被选上后预期只是扮演“印章”(形式上)的角色, 因此更凸显出制定一份内部审核准则的必要性。

7.58.5 会员翁方坤(K 2676, 系统名字为翁宏文) 表示, 将提名两位新的内部稽查员, 目前已有两位人选在手。针对刚才所提出的问题, 他们已经提交了一份《内部审计准则》, 作为未来内部稽查员的工作指引。这是他们提交该准则的原因所在。

7.58.6 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬再次强调, 希望将该文件交由修章小组委员会研究, 不进行现场表决, 会员翁方坤表示认同。

7.58.7 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬建议, 交由修章小组委员会研究《内部审计准则》, 提案提议人王安平(K 4526) 及与会者均无异议。

7.59 会员王安平(K4526) 提呈以下提案:

提案10: 委任专业会计司协助审核及报告工作(提议人王安平, 附议人林日炯)  
被年度会员大会委任的2人组内部审计司可向理事会推荐及委任1家合格专业审计司来协助 2人组内部审计司深入审核稽查工作以及提呈报告。审核稽查行动必须依据内部审核准则行事。

7.59.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬建议交由修章小组委员会研究。

7.59.2 提案提议人王安平点头表示认同。

7.59.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬建议, 交由修章小组委员会研究“委任专业会计司协助审核及报告工作”, 提案提议人王安平认同, 与会者均无异议。

7.60 会员王安平(K4526) 提呈以下提案:

提案11: 年度会员大会 / 特别会员大会检讨工程 / 项目管理账目报告和大会会议记录(提议人

王安平, 附议人林日炯)

会员建议每 1 次工程/项目最终账目报告必须在2个月内提呈予理事会检讨及核准。同样的, 大会后的账目报告和会议记录也务必在3个月内提呈给予理事会核准。理事会审核后的账目报告与大会会议记录随时得提供予会员过目阅读, 如果会员有此要求。

7.60.1 副会长拿督陈行昌博士表示, 许多会员对理事会有很高期待, 但往往忽略了理事会成员的实际处境。他感谢大家的关注, 同时指出很多人并未设身处地理解理事会的工作情况, 也没有主动协助。他欢迎大家参与活动策划、加入小组委员会, 或查阅财务季度账目。但是会馆的财务团队仅有四人, 人力有限, 无法像企业般高效运作。两位财政和秘书长都需要兼顾正职工作, 但仍几乎每天到场协助。他本人投入大量时间处理文书和流程, 力求提升会务品质。目前的理事团队仍在不断学习与协调, 将所有预算与活动摊开讨论、公开处理, 希望做到透明。

他强调, 理事会已尽最大努力推动事务, 但若外界不了解实际流程却强行设定时间表, 会造成极大压力。他举例指出:

- 农历新年刚结束, 接着还有卫塞节和巴生港口妈祖游行等大型活动, 理事会成员都需出席;
- 同时还需处理账目结算, 但由于还在等收据和与供应商确认发票内容, 财务报告无法在两三个月内完成;
- 他呼吁大家给予合理的时间, 让理事会妥善完成各项工作。

7.60.2 他进一步指出, 如果持续受到过高的期望与外界压力, 他个人可能会在来年不再推动任何活动, 就不会有机会被责难。对于章程修订部分, 已预备一年时间供大家提出建议与修改, 现在突然提出要立即修改是可以, 但修改之后可能不符章程, 或导致执行的人再次被大会质疑或产生法律风险, 届时真不知道该如何继续推动会务。他坦言, 若未来在年度大会或其他场合不断受到质疑或指责, 将严重影响理事会工作的意愿与信心。

7.60.3 提案提议人王安平澄清指出, 他的发言并非针对现任理事会, 而是希望从程序层面提出长期改善建议。

7.60.4 副会长拿督陈行昌博士坦言, 有些人甚至不愿意了解会馆的实际运作模式, 拒绝沟通。他无奈表示, 会馆其实有一套既定流程需要遵循。举例来说, 有时理事们在开会期间还需自掏腰包购买餐点, 连区区一顿午餐的费用, 也无法即时从财政那里报销。往往要经历好几次程序、等上一段时间, 才能追回相关开销。他感到疑惑, 这样辛苦付出, 是为了什么?

7.60.5 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬指出, 各位会员应理解, 并非每一个会馆都能如本会一般, 可以从早上一直开会到现在这个时间。她强调, 理事团队年复一年都尽力提供详尽资料, 不是例行公事, 而是负责任的体现。她呼吁大家, 若真认为现有理事只是凭“菜单”当选, 那也可以尽力推动改变; 但以她的观察来看, 这些理事是愿意服务的, 他们正在尽最大努力回应大家的期待。她相信, 理事会自己也有意推动和提交报告, 因为他们对职责有承担。最后她劝大家不要太过苛刻。

7.61 会员王起兴(K 1993)表示, 他本身也是其他会馆的理事会成员, 对于副会长拿督陈行昌博士所分享的内容深有同感。他指出, 每位理事都有各自的工作与责任, 大家抽出时间服务会馆, 在如

此短时间内整理与提交报告确实十分困难。

- 7.61.1 他以近期自己主办的一项活动为例,指出至今尚未完成账目的结算,原因包括财政出差、其他相关人员也分别忙于事务,导致工作受限。他强调,最终报告仍会如期出炉,并建议年底统一审核所有资料与报告。
- 7.61.2 他感谢会议中已顺利通过两项提案,并向议长表示敬意,感谢她的公正与对理事会立场的传达。他同时也提醒大家,应理解并接受理事会所承担的责任与压力。
- 7.61.3 他表示,所有人都希望会馆运作良好、表现出色,因此他支持议长所提出的建议,给予理事会一些缓冲与空间,以达成大家共同的目标。最后,他向大会与议长表达感谢。
- 7.61.4 他建议大会接受理事会就此提案所作的回应。他指出不能太过苛求,而是应该给予理事会明确的授权(mandate),同时也应给予一定的信任与信心,让理事们有信心去处理事情。
- 7.62 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬以及会员王起兴(K 1993)建议给予理事会一些缓冲与空间,与会者无异议。
- 7.63 会员王安平(K4526)提呈以下提案:
- 提案1:本会位于吉隆坡乐圣岭仍然未开发的土地开发前的建设建议概念大蓝图(提议人王安平,附议人林日炯)
- 全新建设建议概念大蓝图未出炉前,停止之前年度会员大会或之前特别会员大会时,核准通过或还未通过大会议决的开发建设案,直至获得新届 2026年度会员大会的核准议决。
- 7.63.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示,对于提案(一)的内容,章程中已有规定,凡涉及发展项目,理事会需事先提交审批,因此无需特别再通过类似提案。她认为,只需强调按章执行即可。
- 7.63.2 会员龙籍平(K 2223)指出,指出,提案(一)并非针对某个具体项目,而是关乎整体发展总规划(Master Plan),此规划需提交予市政局(Bandaraya)审批。他强调,会馆目前拥有多块土地,必须为未来进行系统性规划,明确什么地段建设什么设施,不能像乡村一样零散建设。他以交通为例,指出现有安排混乱、雨天巴士进出不便,说明缺乏规划。
- 7.63.3 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬提醒,会议召开至今已趋下午六点半。
- 7.63.4 署理会长符之庆表示,关于“总规划”的概念,理事会已有一些初步构想。他认为现在最好的做法是由YTS公司展示有关第一阶段发展方向的幻灯片,内容包括妈祖公园与停车场。至于第二阶段,或可纳入博物馆、文化街等元素;第三阶段则可能发展为会展中心等,具体将胥视资金情况而定。随后他请叶先生进行简报说明。
- 7.63.5 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬随后向大会提出关键问题:理事会是否已有整体发展总规划.若尚未有,提案如何推进。她建议待简报展示后,再进入具体讨论。
- 7.64 会员朱小虎(K 3295)指出,会馆在与吉隆坡市政局(DBKL)的诉讼案件中已胜诉,并于2023年6月15日正式向吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL)提交了1,200万令吉的索赔要求。目前案件已进入法庭阶

段, 律师文件已提交, 等待法院裁定赔偿金额。他特别强调, 理事会在未经会员特别大会 (EGM) 授权的情况下, 不得私下与吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 协商任何赔偿数额, 否则可能引起外界误会。他强调此举是为了保障所有理事的权利与声誉。此外, 他希望了解与吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 之间的法律诉讼目前已进行至何种阶段。

- 7.64.1 他也指出, 2023年律师费约为16万令吉, 而2024年则高达93万, 要求重新播放相关财务投影片, 以再询问一些问题。
- 7.64.2 大会主席拿汀巴杜卡周美芬表示同意重新播放相关资料, 惟因秘书处需时间调取文件, 建议先回答第一项提问。
- 7.64.3 副会长拿督陈行昌博士表示, 早在2023年, 会馆已与吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 就发展令 (Development Order, DO) 申请事宜展开讨论。会馆已与吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 方面多个部门已给予支持, 目前已进入协调与调解阶段。该过程尚未涉及赔偿金额, 法院也尚未裁定吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 需承担赔偿责任。
- 7.64.4 副会长拿督陈行昌博士指出, 目前与吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 的法律程序仍属“损害赔偿诉讼” (Action of Damages), 赔偿金额仍在估算中。外界流传“理事会与吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 私下达成不赔偿协议”的说法并不属实。目前与吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 的对话属协调性质, 目的是推动项目继续进行并取得发展批文。若未来进入调解阶段, 是否接受无赔偿结果, 将视情况而定, 现阶段尚未有定论。
- 7.64.5 针对外界提及的1,200万令吉索偿数额, 该数额中包括妈祖项目供应商提出的600万令吉储藏费用, 但依据现有合同, 会馆无须承担该费用。会馆已告知供应商不可索赔该项费用, 因此若再以此数额向吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 索赔, 法律上存在矛盾。
- 7.64.6 副会长拿督陈行昌博士进一步解释, 会馆并未选择终止与供应商的合同, 主要是希望通过调解方式取回项目资源。若贸然终止合同, 虽可向政府申请部分赔偿, 但会导致整体协调与项目发展受阻。此外, 从律师团队及理事会的评估来看, 目前掌握的证据尚不足以在法庭上要求吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 承担高额赔偿, 因此需谨慎处理。他补充, 由于目前涉及与丁才荣的法律诉讼, 该案件涵盖诽谤内容并牵涉30多位理事, 加上相关议题已登上媒体报道, 故仅能就案件做出概括性说明, 具体细节和文件暂不便公开。
- 7.64.7 会员朱小虎指出, 他表示副会长拿督陈行昌律师博士已说明清楚, 针对2023年6月15日事件, 双方律师已完成文件交换与整理工作, 并特别澄清文件中明确列明的12 Million 金额并非其个人所述。他建议通过召开特别会员大会 (EGM) 表决批准, 以避免后续争议。
- 7.65 会员朱小虎 (K3295) 就财政报告提出第二项质询, 关于2024年度法律及专业费用第4项 (RM34,650.00) 与第5项 (RM38,502.00) 涉及前执行秘书张玳维事件的相关支出, 询问负责律师事务所是否为在座理事所属。
- 7.65.1 副会长拿督陈行昌律师博士回应称, 虽然涉事律师事务为其所有, 但强调这两个案件均由另一位律师及其团队独立处理, 他本人并未参与相关案件工作。
- 7.65.2 会员朱小虎 (K3295) 进一步要求提供相关法律案件的详细资料。副会长拿督陈行昌律师博士回应表示, 鉴于案件仍在审理中, 且考虑到会员朱小虎与多起案件当事人拿督

丁才荣“关系密切”，现阶段不便透露更多信息。

- 7.66 会员王运东 (5278) 就“2024年4月3日恢复黄良友会员资格之决定为有效, 并基于同一事由, 一并通过撤销对其原有9项纪律指控, 以彰显本会组织程序之公正性与处理事务之一致性”的提案提出质询, 要求理事会说明具体回应立场。
- 7.66.1 副会长拿督陈行昌律师博士回应称, 理事会经讨论决定撤销对黄良友会员的8项纪律指控 (经核实确为8项), 已与其达成谅解并签署书面协议, 该议决将通过本会会刊《海南之声》及官方Facebook平台正式公布。
- 7.66.2 会员王运东 (5278) 对理事会的决定表示感谢。议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬特别表彰会员黄良友多年来的杰出贡献, 并提议全体会员鼓掌致意。同时, 议长也高度赞赏会员王运东为黄良友平反而作出的不懈努力, 以及理事会撤销指控、恢复其清白的公正决定。
- 7.66.3 会员朱小虎 (K3295) 提议, 鉴于此类案件, 建议可交由本会法律顾问处理, 以充分发挥其专业职能。
- 7.66.4 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬询问理事会法律顾问是否列席理事会议, 理事会确认法律顾问确实在席。
- 7.67 会员陈川标 (K4011) 询问有关妈祖雕像的具体尺寸规格, 并表达对吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 可能不予批准的担忧, 同时提出鉴于每逢初一十五为大众提供素食的活动已暂停数年, 建议理事会考虑重新恢复此项供斋活动, 以此回馈社会大众对本会的支持。
- 7.67.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬指出, 该妈祖雕像已报告数次, 待会将再次报告有关事项让会员了解一遍。
- 7.67.2 副会长拿督陈行昌律师博士接着回应称, 理事会已考虑重新恢复此项供斋活动, 并质询相关素食馆寻求报价, 望于下次会员大会上寻求通过。
- 7.68 会员龙籍平 (K2223) 表示妈祖公园项目已有预算安排, 同时询问工程预计完工时限。针对议长提议致函就妈祖公园相关事项交由纪律委员会调查一事表示同意, 但强调调查结果须在会员大会上报告而非仅向理事会汇报, 因理事会中涉及相关人士。
- 7.68.1 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬回应表示, 请会员龙籍平先行提交正式信函建议, 并指出给予理事会宽限时间处理相关事宜。
- 7.68.2 会员龙籍平 (K2223) 向法律顾问提出质询, 要求根据本会章程第7.1及8.1条文, 说明理事会依据章程哪项具体条款有权否决会员提案在会员大会上的讨论资格。
- 7.68.3 副会长拿督陈行昌律师博士回应表示, 经审慎审议会员龙籍平所提事项, 理事会认为该提案性质更倾向于咨询建议而非正式动议。他强调理事会已通过书面形式予以回复, 并在本次会员大会上就收到的所有提问及提案进行了说明展示, 澄清理事会从未否决任何提案的提交与讨论资格。
- 7.69 会员王安平 (K4526) 严正声明, 针对其提交的11项章程修订提案, 理事会回复将转交修章小组委员会讨论的做法, 强调此为会员大会并非座谈会, 此举实质上等同于否决了这些提案在会员大会上直接讨论的资格。

- 7.69.1 副会长拿督陈行昌律师博士再次强调,若理事会确实否决相关提案,则不会在本次会员大会上对收到的全部提问及提案进行说明展示。
- 7.69.2 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬明确表示,所有提问及提案均已完整宣读,并提醒与会会员无需在此议题上继续纠缠,并让法律顾问就此事作出其见解。
- 7.69.3 法律顾问陈泽玉律师认为,会员虽依法享有会务知情权,但理事会需审慎评估提案性质(应区分为咨询建议或正式动议),否则过多事项将导致会议议程无法有效进行。他强调,对咨询类提案理事会仍须正式回复;若属正式动议则必须提交会员大会审议表决。
- 7.69.4 会员龙籍平寻求确认,是否表示理事会有权力否决提案在会员大会上直接讨论的资格。
- 7.69.5 议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬针对会员龙籍平的持续质询作出回应,指出章程中并未明确规定理事会是否拥有否决提案在会员大会上直接讨论的权限。鉴于此,她要求理事会应当审慎评估每项提案性质,明确区分咨询建议与正式动议。议长特别强调,对于被判定为咨询性质的提案,理事会须通过书面形式予以正式回复;同时说明部分提问也在会议上进行充分说明展示及讨论。

(议长拿汀巴杜卡周美芬宣布由副议长李素桦律师暂代主持后续会议议程。)

#### (八) 汇报妈祖公园发展计划进展

- 8.1 副议长李素桦律师请署理会长拿督斯里符之庆报告相关进展。
- 8.2 署理会长拿督斯里符之庆指示YTS Architecture顾问公司叶德胜就妈祖公园项目进行专项汇报。
- 8.3 叶德胜进行汇报说明,将通过动画演示分为三大板块:现有天后宫状况、妈祖公园景观设计方案及7层楼停车场规划事项。
- 8.4 关于停车场审批进度,叶德胜确认已完备取得批准函、发展许可证(DO)及停车场建筑平面图(Building Plan)等关键文件。
- 8.5 针对妈祖公园项目,叶德胜报告称已于开斋节前完成申请文件提呈并获积极反馈,目前正式取得无异议确认函(letter of no objection)。基于此进展,项目组正与吉隆坡市政局(DBKL)积极推进后续审批程序,对最终获得发展许可证持审慎乐观态度。
- 8.6 叶德胜通过动画演示详细汇报了现有天后宫状况、妈祖公园广场景观设计方案及7层多功能停车场规划方案,特别说明该停车场选址位于天后宫主体建筑左侧,采用复合功能设计兼具停车与挡土墙功能以解决雨水积累泥土流失问题,并配备巴士专用停放区及全楼层电梯系统,同时将对原VIP及一些区设计进行优化调整以增强公园自然景观协调性。妈祖公园设计保留广场、水景等核心元素并设有无障碍步道系统,除此,亦尽量最小干预原则以最大限度保持原始地形地貌。
- 8.7 会员翁方坤(系统名称:翁宏文)(K2676)在听取叶德胜的汇报后提出质询,针对妈祖公园发展计划已取得的无异议确认函(letter of no objection),询问该文件是否附带特别约束条款。

他特别指出,据其所知该发展涉及多宗地段的权属重叠问题,包括部分属于寺庙用地 (temple land) 和农业用地 (agricultural land) 的不同性质地块,要求说明具体解决方案。

- 8.7.1 叶德胜回应表示,项目组已与吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 就土地性质问题经多次会议,现有天后宫用地归为机构地段 (institutional land),并反复勘察确认妈祖公园用地未限定特殊用途 (tiada syarat nyata),故建设公园并无不妥。停车场地段因专属天后宫使用,同样归属机构用地范畴。他强调该土地性质问题已获解决,且本会早已取得停车场发展许可证 (DO) 并获一年延期批准。
- 8.7.2 叶德胜指出,当前重点在于妈祖公园建设许可的获取。项目组协同理事会成员于去年末至今年初与吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 进行多轮磋商,根据会议指导意见,项目组已于开斋节前提交完整申请文件,并在大约三周前正式获得无异议确认函 (letter of no objection)。
- 8.7.3 叶德胜说明,鉴于此前停车场项目引发的公众关注,吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 严正以待,将本次妈祖公园发展许可证 (DO) 申请提交OSC会议审议后签发无异议确认函,后续还需通过特别OSC会议最终核准,他表示,妈祖公园获批概率达80-90%的评估。
- 8.7.4 叶德胜解释,特别OSC会议专为重大政府项目 (如MRT、JKR工程) 设立,由部长级官员亲自主持。基于此特殊审批流程,项目组对最终获批保持审慎乐观。
- 8.7.5 叶德胜重申,无异议确认函未设置额外建设限制,仅一条即要求与地方议员协商。本会与武吉免登区国会议员YB方贵伦保持良好互动,在其协助下已向吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 及特别OSC会议主席提交支持信函。目前正待吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 与部长最终核发发展许可证 (DO)。
- 8.8 会员王安平 (K4526) 指出,叶德胜的汇报内容并未完全回应其第一项提案的质询重点,他特别要求查阅妈祖公园项目的总体规划图 (master plan) 及所有相关批准函件。同时表明,若最终确认所有审批程序均符合规定,他乐见其成并支持妈祖公园的建设计划。
- 8.8.1 副会长拿督陈行昌律师博士表示,会员查阅妈祖公园相关批准函件的请求完全合理,但同时严正提醒应避免对外传播未经证实的信息,以免影响本会与吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 的良好合作关系,进而危及项目最终审批结果。
- 8.8.2 叶德胜说明,先前展示的动画可视作总体规划图,但需说明本会最新购置的前方停车场未包含在该动画演示中。他详细解释方案包含三大部分:第一部分呈现现有天后宫建筑状况;第二部分重点规划7层多功能停车场,该设计旨在解决长期困扰天后宫周边地区的水土流失问题,特别强调因先前土崩事故本会已建造临时石墙作为防护,而新建停车场将兼具永久性挡土墙功能以彻底解决地质隐患,这也正是吉隆坡市政局 (DBKL) 积极支持此项目的原因;第三部分则为妈祖公园及其连接广场的设计。针对当前旅游巴士缺乏专用接送点的问题,他说明待停车场完工后将设置带顶棚的专用上下客区域,并配备电梯连通各楼层。此外,他特别指出这座7层停车场将极大缓解天后宫长期面临的停车位不足问题,尤其是春节期间 (初一至十五) 的高峰车流量,相信项目落成后将显著改善周边交通状况。
- 8.8.3 副议长李素桦律师请会员留意有关DBKL发出的无异议确认函 (letter of no objection) 信函。叶德胜重申,信中提及仅有的一条即要求与武吉免登区国会议员协商。

- 8.8.4 会员龙籍平(K2223)持续质疑无异议确认函(letter of no objection)未使用吉隆坡市政局(DBKL)正式信笺的问题,直至秘书处出示完整信函文件后才停止追问。他进一步指出,先前展示的动画演示不能视为正式总体规划图(master plan),强调完整的总体规划图应包含土地所有权证明文件(land title),同时表达对妈祖公园地下以及周边是否规划其他建设项目的疑虑,表示该动画演示不完整。
- 8.8.5 叶德胜回应解释,本次展示的动画为精简版本,旨在向会员重点说明妈祖公园项目的核心内容。他补充说明项目团队实际备有完整版详细动画演示,其中包含所有建设细节的精确呈现,从建筑结构到景观设计(一砖一瓦、一石一木)均有完整记载,只是因会议时间考量未作全程展示。
- 8.9 会员龙籍平(K2223)针对叶德胜的演示内容提出进一步质询,要求明确说明妈祖公园、7层建筑及停车场是否分别申请建设许可,以及这些设施是否规划在不同地块上建设。
- 8.9.1 叶德胜确认相关项目确实采取分开申请许可的方式,但为便于会员整体理解,故在演示中合并说明。
- 8.9.2 副议长李素桦律师说明,本次演示旨在协助会员全面了解妈祖公园发展计划概况,其内容本身并不涉及需要审批批准。
- 8.10 会员庄耿俊(K8203)询问新旧妈祖公园有什么具体区别。
- 8.10.1 叶德胜说明,妈祖公园设计方案整体保留80-90%原始规划内容,主要针对自然景观融合度和工程预算控制进行适度优化。具体修改包括:调整水池区域原规划的船型VIP休息区设计,在确保功能性的同时增强景观自然度并扩大游客走动空间。他特别强调,本次演示动画在植被配置与建筑结构的比例包括已定制的妈祖雕像及配色呈现上,较实际建成效果具有更高的精确度。
- 8.11 会员郑庭安(K17912)提出质询,针对叶德胜所述妈祖公园获批概率达80-90%的评估,特别追问是否已充分考虑妈祖雕像的尺寸敏感性问题。他以檳城极乐寺观音像案例为鉴(原设计99英尺高度因超越周边清真寺穹顶而被迫缩减),表达对联邦直辖区部长(穆斯林身份)可能对此产生顾虑的担忧,要求说明项目团队如何规避类似争议。
- 8.11.1 叶德胜回应表示,本次妈祖公园建设申请的所有建筑参数,包括妈祖雕像的具体尺寸规格,均已完整呈报在提交的审批文件中。他特别指出,已取得的无异议确认函(letter of no objection)中并未包含任何针对妈祖雕像尺寸规格的异议或修改要求。

## (九) 遴选内部稽查员

- 9.1 副议长李素桦律师宣读第9项议程遴选内部稽查员。
- 9.2 副秘书长卢裕耿报告,在2024年度会员大会上,会员王安平提议由吴正忠担任内部稽查员并获得吴证江附议,同时会员杨庆和提议由王玉诚担任内部稽查员并获得李昌浩附议。经会员大会决议决通过委任吴正忠及王玉诚为内部稽查员,惟王玉诚事后婉拒接受委任,仅吴正忠接受该职务。然而,吴正忠于2025年5月13日正式来函,基于眼睛视力问题提出辞去内部稽查员一职,基于此,本会需要另委任2位内部稽查员。

- 9.3 副议长李素桦律师语重心长地表示,当前会馆职务的担任确实面临诸多挑战。她提到,近期有会员关切会馆涉及的多起法律案件及相关费用问题,包括她本人无端被卷入的诉讼事件。针对这些情况,她特别向会员朱小虎(K3295)提出询问,同时也恳切呼吁全体会员在提出质询时,能够客观理性地共同反思造成当前局面的因素。
- 9.4 会员朱小虎(K3295)说明,涉事会员以请愿的方式提交召开特别会员大会(EGM),但因程序进展受阻,最终需通过司法途径取得法院强制召开命令。他指出,在法院庭令具有强制效力的情况下,EGM必须依法召开,并对“以维护会馆为由质疑司法裁决效力的说法表示遗憾”,强调应尊重司法权威和法定程序。
- 9.5 副会长拿督陈行昌律师博士基于专业判断适时介入,强调鉴于相关案件正处于司法审理阶段,根据法律顾问建议及会议规范要求,现阶段不宜就该案细节进行公开讨论,以免影响司法程序。他恳请与会成员理解并配合,将讨论焦点回归本次大会议程。
- 9.6 副议长李素桦律师对会员朱小虎(K3295)的说明表示感谢,随后将会议议程重新聚焦至内部稽查员遴选事项。副会长拿督陈行昌律师博士补充强调,希望本次遴选人选均在场,能充分尊重在场出席会员大会的全体会员意见。
- 9.7 会员翁方坤(K 2676,系统名字为翁宏文)提议会员谢南达(K6704)为内部稽查员,会员陈达本(K5613)附议。
- 9.8 会员龙籍平(K2223)提议会员王安平(K4526)为内部稽查员,会员翁诗莉(K18177)附议。
- 9.9 副秘书长卢裕耿提议会员周昌同(K13931)为内部稽查员,财政吴伟刚附议。
- 9.10 教育组主任黄靖胜提议会员黄良才(K15679),惟其本人未到现场,但表示乐意被委任为内部稽查员,福利组主任彭志光附议,请求大会通过。
- 9.11 副议长李素桦律师让现场会员举手方式表示同意提名人未到现场能够竞选。
- 9.11.1 同意人数为34人,不同意人数为20。会员大会议决同意黄良才(K15679)参与竞选内部稽查员一职。
- 9.11.2 副议长李素桦律师让提名人自我介绍。
- 9.12 会员谢南达(K6704)进行自我介绍,表示已加入会馆超过20年,现已退休,拥有44年银行业从业经验,曾任高级副会长职务,主要负责银行金融犯罪合规及商业风险管理工作,对金融犯罪、洗黑钱、内外欺诈、走私逃税等事务具有专业认知,同时精通信用风险评估、进出口融资及常规银行业务运作。他深信凭借其在会计及风险管理领域的丰富经验,完全能够胜任会馆内部稽查员一职。
- 9.13 会员王安平(K4526)进行自我介绍,表示已加入会馆逾30年,现为退休人士,具有自然疗法医师及心脏病学研究员双重专业背景。针对副议长要求说明胜任内部稽查员资格一事,他提出不同见解,强调担任此职并非仅需专业资质,更重要的是心系会馆发展且愿接受会员推选,以促进会馆运作的制衡机制。他特别指出,鉴于近年来会馆屡现管理疏失,希望通过内部稽查能够一番改善。

- 9.14 会员周昌同(K13931)介绍其会馆参与经历,包括2012年加入会馆并参与青年团,曾任周氏公会会长职务,现担任文昌公会福利主任,职业为专业保险代理。基于上述组织服务经验及专业背景,他表达担任会馆内部稽查员的意愿,希望为会馆发展贡献力量。
- 9.15 理事会教育组主任黄靖胜介绍候选人黄良才(K15679)的资历背景:持有马来亚大学授予的双博士学位,退休前担任Shell公司IT高级经理职务,目前仍承接专业技术合约工作,时间安排具有弹性。该会员同时具有丰富的会馆服务经验,包括曾任巴生海南会馆总务及青年团团团长等重要职务,累计拥有超过20年的会馆服务资历。
- 9.16 副议长李素桦律师表示会馆人才济济,就有4为优秀之会员提名原意担任内部稽查员,她吁会员以举手方式进行投票,从中选出2位担任其职位。
- 9.17 会员翁方坤(K 2676,系统名字为翁宏文)提出建议,鉴于会馆账目审核工作的复杂性及内部稽查员职责的繁重性,提议同时委任4位内部稽查员共同履职。
- 9.18 副议长李素桦律师随即说明,根据本会现行章程明确规定,内部稽查员委任人数限定为2位,强调必须严格遵循章程规定执行,询求法律顾问建议。
- 9.19 法律顾问陈泽玉律师表示,虽然增加内部稽查员人数在理论上更好,但必须遵守规定委任2位正式内部稽查员,但另2位可列为候补人选。
- 9.20 副会长拿督陈行昌律师博士提出协调方案,指出当前4位候选人明显分为两个意向阵营,建议各方推选1位主要人选,其余2人组成辅助团队,最终整合形成统一的内部稽查工作小组。
- 9.21 秘书处针对该人员配置方案提出程序性质询,询问是否与会馆现行章程规定存在冲突。
- 9.22 副议长李素桦律师要求明确分组方案细节,具体质询是否拟定由谢南达与王安平组成第一组,黄良才与周昌同组成第二组,并需确认各组的主要负责人选。
- 9.23 经与会成员充分讨论后达成共识:确定谢南达与王安平为第一组,指定王安平为主要负责人;黄良才与周昌同为第二组,指定黄良才为主要负责人。
- 9.24 副议长李素桦律师依照议事规则,提请全体会员以鼓掌表决方式对该人事安排方案进行最终确认。
- 9.25 会员以鼓掌方式表示赞同,议决由谢南达与王安平为第一组,指定王安平为主要负责人成为第一位内部稽查员;黄良才与周昌同为第二组,并指定黄良才为主要负责人成为第二位内部稽查员。

#### (十) 散会

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### 1. 主要活动

会馆是在1966年社团法令下注册的非营利团体,其目的是促进会员之间的友好关系,经济、文化、教育和福利,以及管理天后宫的事务。

在本会计年度,这些主要活动的性质没有重大改变。

会馆的主要地点是坐落在65, Persiaran Endah, Off Jalan Syed Putra, 50460 Kuala Lumpur.

财务报表由理事会根据2026年5月11日理事会的议案授权公布。

#### 1. PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The Association is a non-profit organisation registered under the Societies Act, 1966 with the objective of promoting friendly relations, economy, culture, education and welfare among its members, and of managing the affairs of the Thean Hou Temple.

There have been no significant changes in the nature of these principal activities during the financial year.

The principal place of the Association is located at 65, Persiaran Endah, Off Jalan Syed Putra, 50460 Kuala Lumpur.

The financial statements were authorised for issue by the General Council in accordance with a resolution of the General Council on 11 May 2026.

#### 2. 准备的基础

会馆打算在上述适用的对MFRS的修正, 在它们生效时采用。针对会馆可能适用的上述对MFRS的显著修正的简短讨论在下面概述:

#### **对 MFRS 18 财务报表的呈现与披露之修正**

MFRS 18 取代 MFRS 101 财务报表之呈现。它保留 MFRS 101 的许多规定, 没有经过修正。

MFRS 18 引进两项小计, 它们在损益表中呈现——包括“营业利润”, 它是具有明确的定义, 收入与支出按照5个种类呈现: 营业、投资、财务、所得税以及已经停止的营业。

MFRS 18 规定披露对机构的公司特定措施之解释的披露, 这些措施与损益表有关, 被称为“管理表现措施”(MPM)。机构被要求使MPM和MFRS 18所要求的总计或小计或是MFRS的另外一个会计标准相符合。MFRS 18 也要求其他披露, 包括每一个MPM如何计算、MPM和机构的财务表现有什么联系、以及一年来MPM是否有任何改变。

MFRS 18 对资料之合计与分解增加新的原则。它规定机构在损益表中, 针对“营运”类开支, 根据其性质或功能, 或是两者兼有, 加以分类。机构如果根据营运开支的功能加以分类, 需要在财务报表的注释中, 披露折旧的数额、摊销、雇员利益、损减损失和存货之划减, 在营运分类的每一行把这些包括在内。根据重要性, MFRS 18 规定, 被当做“其他”呈现或披露的项目, 以尽可能作为忠实的代表或精确的方式加以标签以及/或是描述。

## 2. BASIS OF PREPARATION (CONTINUED)

### 2.3 New MFRSs and amendments to MFRSs that have been issued, but yet to be effective (Continued)

The Association plans to adopt the above applicable new MFRSs and amendments to MFRSs when they become effective. A brief discussion on the above significant new MFRSs and amendments to MFRSs that may be applicable to the Association are summarised below:

#### ***Amendments to MFRS 18 Presentation and Disclosure of Financial Statements***

MFRS 18 replaces MFRS 101 Presentation of Financial Statements. It retains many requirements from MFRS 101 without modification.

MFRS 18 introduces two subtotals which are to be presented in the statement of profit or loss – including “operating profit”, which has been specifically defined. Income and expenses shall be presented in five categories: operating, investing, financing, income taxes and discontinued operations.

MFRS 18 requires disclosure of explanations of the entity’s company-specific measures that are related to the statement of profit or loss, referred to as management-defined performance measures (“MPMs”). The entity is required to reconcile MPMs to a total or subtotal required by MFRS 18 or another MFRS Accounting Standards. MFRS 18 also requires other disclosures, including how each MPM is calculated, what the MPM communication about the entity’s financial performance, and any changes made to the MPMs in the year.

MFRS 18 adds new principles for aggregation and disaggregation of information. It requires the entity to classify the expenses in the “operating” category in the profit or loss by nature or function, or both. The entity that classifies operating expenses by functions are required to disclose in the notes to the financial statements, the amount of depreciation, amortisation, employee benefits, impairment losses and write-downs of inventories included in each line in the operating category. Subject to materiality, MFRS 18 requires items presented or disclosed as “other” to be labelled and/or described in as faithfully representative and precise a way as possible.

**2. 准备的基础(续)****2.3 新MFRS以及对已经公布但尚未生效的MFRS的修正/改善 (续)****针对 MFRS 9财务工具和 MFRS 7财务工具:披露之修正**

这些针对MFRS 9之狭隘范围的修正, 阐明了各种要求, 包括:

- 阐明了财务资产的分類, 特别是那些和环境、社会和企业管埋以及具有类似特点的财务资产的分類。这些修正阐明, 这类财务资产的契约性现金流通应该如何估值, 特别是针对集中于一个机构收到的赔偿(而不是它收到多少赔偿)的利益之估值。无论如何, 一个机构收到赔偿数额可能显示出, 它受到赔偿, 不是由于基本借贷的风险和成本, 而是由于其他原因。

- 阐明一项财务资产或一项财务负债通过电子支付系统结算的日期被取消确认。这些修正允许一个机构如果符合特定标准, 在它在结算日期交付现金以解决一项财务负债之前, 可以取消对该财务负债的确认。

对MFRS 7的修正, 引进和以下有关的新的披露规定通过具有不确定性特定的其他综合性收入与财务工具投资在按公允价值计算的证券工具, 这些投资和基本借贷风险与成本没有直接关系。

**2.4 功能货币与呈现货币**

会馆的财务报告, 是使用它营运的主要经济环境的货币计算。财务报告用马币令吉呈报, 令吉是会馆的功能货币。

These narrow scope amendments to MFRS 9 clarify the requirements, including:

- clarify the classification of financial assets, particularly those with environmental, social and corporate governance and similar features. The Amendments clarify how the contractual cash flows on such financial assets should be assessed, specifically the assessment of interest focuses on what an entity is being compensated for, rather than how much compensation it receives. Nonetheless, the amount of compensation the entity receives may indicate that it is being compensated for something other than basic lending risks and costs.

The financial statements of the Association are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which it operates (“the functional currency”). The financial statements are presented in Ringgit Malaysia (“RM”), which is the functional currency of the Association.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with MFRSs requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of the income and expenditure during the reported year. It also requires General Council to exercise their judgement in the process of applying the Association's accounting policies. Although these estimates and judgement are based on the General Council's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results may differ.

The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the Association's financial statements are disclosed in Note 4 to the financial statements.

**3 MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICY INFORMATION**

The resources of Association are classified for financial reporting purposes into funds established according to their nature and purposes. Separate financial statements are maintained for each fund. However, on the statement of financial position, statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, and statement of receipts and payments, the respective funds have been combined into two groups, namely, Building Fund and Operating Funds.

Building Fund represents resources restricted for the construction of the Thean Hou Temple and its extensions.

Operating Funds represent the portion of expendable funds that are available to support the activities of the Association.

Unless otherwise stated, the following accounting policies have been applied consistently to all the financial years presented in the financial statements of the Association.

**3.1 Property, Plant and Equipment and Depreciation**

All property, plant and equipment were initially stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any.

To measure the expected credit losses, receivables have been grouped based on shared credit risk characteristics and the days past due. The expected credit losses also incorporate forward looking information.

As at the end of the reporting date, there were no significant concentrations of credit risk in the Association. The maximum exposure to credit risk for the Association is represented by the carrying amount of each financial instrument.

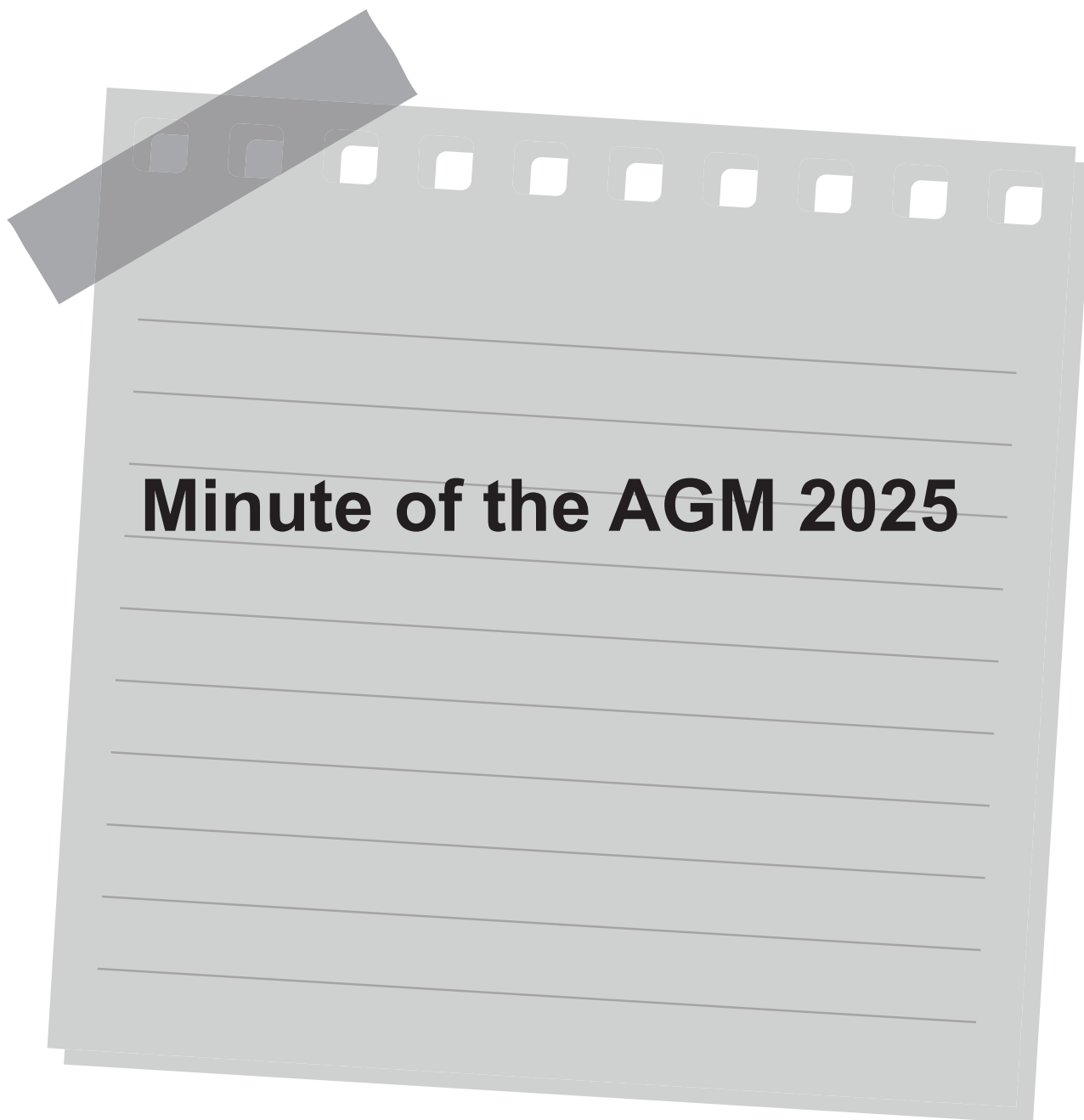
All these efforts reflect the new approaches adopted by the current GC in advancing the Association's affairs. Members who have long been concerned about the Association's development would certainly have noticed

### **1. Speaker Presides Over the Meeting**

President Foo Wah Chek, Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing, all GC Members, fellow Hainanese, and all community leaders, good morning.

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) of The Selangor & Federal Territory Hainan Association is convened again. I am presiding over today's meeting with mixed emotions.

I clearly remember the circumstances under which I returned to serve as Speaker of The Selangor & Federal Territory Hainan Association. At that time, fellow Hainanese who nominated me called, and I set one condition: if I am to serve as Speaker, please also support Lee Sok Wah to serve as Deputy Speaker. Under this premise, Lee Sok Wah and I were duly elected.

I accepted the position of Speaker out of gratitude for past support to the Association and out of respect and care for the Hainanese community. We have a responsibility to promote the healthy and smooth development of the Association. I insisted on nominating Lee Sok Wah because I know her integrity and her long-standing spirit of service to the nation and society, especially in women's affairs, where we have collaborated and exchanged ideas on multiple occasions.

Another reason for my mixed feelings today is that she, in defending the spirit of the Association's constitution and the members' electoral rights, unfortunately faced setbacks in judicial proceedings, which is regrettable and painful. Although some matters are beyond our control and should not be questioned lightly, I emphasize that her intention has always been to act in the best interests of the Association and its members. I hereby acknowledge her contributions and hope everyone will support her.

I firmly believe that the future of the Association requires everyone's joint efforts. Although the Association has experienced many controversies over the past few years, I view them as growing pains. As long as the starting point is progress, we should face them courageously. I am pleased to see that the General Council is increasingly open to criticism and acknowledges efforts to improve. However, I will not label anyone at the AGM. Regardless of whether someone is involved in a controversy, as long as their speech is reasonable, lawful, and in accordance with the constitution, I will defend their right to speak. At the same time, I hope the GC will acknowledge and respond to members' opinions and suggestions.

The operations of the Association must follow procedures. As Speaker, I can only handle matters within my authority; I cannot exceed the constitution nor overturn established procedures. Although the Association is composed mainly of senior members, it is full of talent, including lawyers, architects, engineers, and accountants. Therefore, before every AGM, I receive a large number of emails containing proposals and opinions. My principles are always consistent:

1. Matters must be reasonable, lawful, and justifiable;
2. Actions must comply with the constitution, ensuring members' rights to speak within the framework;
3. GC members are elected by one-member-one-vote and must legally fulfill their management and operational duties.

We cannot demand that GC members provide incomplete information simply because of suspicion before facts are clear; likewise, GC members should not reject all proposals merely due to doubt about the proposer's motives. Such an attitude is equally improper.

Before the meeting, I informed Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah that I would remain neutral and impartial. I hope the meeting will proceed smoothly, and even if sharp questions are raised, they should be expressed in a polite, reasonable, and rational manner. This is very important.

We do not want internal affairs to leak and be ridiculed. We are currently in a transitional period, which may attract criticism and misunderstanding, but it should be faced proactively to gain external respect and to restore the reputation of The Selangor & Federal Territory Hainan Association as an ISO-certified organization.

According to the constitution, the quorum for today's AGM requires twice the total number of GC members, i.e., 86. According to the Secretariat's data at 10:42 a.m., there are currently 164 attendees. Therefore, I officially declare that today's AGM is lawfully convened.

Next, we proceed with the agenda: I invite President Foo Wah Chek to address the meeting.

## **2. Speech by the President**

Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah, Legal Advisor Tan Chek Yoke, Legal Advisor Dato' Lim Hong Sang, Head of Disciplinary Committee Dato' Tan Beng Yeow, Head of Election Committee Eng Fwu Ji, all GC Members and Committee Members, and fellow members, good morning.

I would like to thank everyone for your concern and support for the new General Council over the past year. We feel a heavy responsibility and will continue to uphold the Association's mission, striving to develop the Association toward a more institutionalized and transparent direction.

To live up to the trust of our members, the new GC has officially taken reform steps. One important initiative is the establishment of the "Constitution Amendment Sub-Committee." Under the convening of The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong, Chew Seng Chen was appointed as Chairman of the Constitution Amendment Sub-Committee to comprehensively review the Association's constitution. To date, the Committee has held seven Constitution Amendment Sub-Committee Meetings and one Proposed Draft Review Meeting, actively studying the existing constitution and fully engaging in the

review work. We respectfully request that members give the Sub-Committee sufficient time and space, and subsequently, members' opinions will also be widely sought to perfect the content of the constitution.

Of course, the path of reform is not easy. We understand that members' concerns and opinions come from love and responsibility for the Association. The GC also welcomes constructive opinions and criticisms. However, recently, some unverified information has been widely circulated, causing misunderstandings and even affecting unity, which is regrettable. Here, we call on everyone to judge rationally, based on facts, and to jointly maintain the harmonious atmosphere of the Association.

Reform takes time and requires everyone's support. In this year's AGM, we have specially arranged a "Progress Report on the Mazu Park Development Plan" as part of the agenda, to help everyone better understand the latest updates of the plan.

We also report that the seven-storey car park project has obtained the Development Order (D.O.) and Building Plan approval from the Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL). Regarding the Mazu Park Development Plan, we have formally submitted the application for a Development Order, and the next step is to apply to the Mayor for final approval. Other details will be further explained by Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing later in Agenda (8).

I believe everyone has been following a hot topic recently, which is the court case involving our esteemed Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah. The Deputy Speaker has diligently and selflessly served, fighting for the lawful rights of the Association and all members, yet unfortunately faced accusations and litigation, which is distressing.

Here, we must firmly express our position: we acknowledge and appreciate the contributions of Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah and deeply regret all that she has endured. The Selangor & Federal Territory Hainan Association will stand as her strongest support and provide her with full backing.

Members, let us all express our support with one voice: "Stand with the Deputy Speaker, we are with you!"

Finally, once again, thank you for your continued trust and support. Thank you.

### **3. Approval of Previous General Meeting Minutes Extraordinary General Meeting (17/04/2024)**

- 3.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun explained that this session is not to review the meeting content, but to allow members who attended the previous meeting to confirm whether the minutes accurately reflect the meeting proceedings. If there are errors, omissions, or amendments needed, attendees may raise them at this stage, including errors or omissions of attendees' names.

The confirmation is limited to corrections proposed by those who attended the previous meeting. Non-attendees have no right to confirm, review, overturn, or reject the minutes unless the resolutions involved violated the law or the Association's constitution. Those wishing to speak must raise their hands and be recognized by the Speaker; they must state their name before speaking. Those who have already spoken should allow non-speakers to go first. Each person should speak concisely, preferably no more than twice,

and aim to express all proposed corrections in one statement.

If there are no further comments, a member may propose to approve the minutes, to be seconded by another member, after which this agenda item will be concluded.

- 3.2 Member Wong Joon Tong (K5278) proposed observing a one-minute silence before the agenda begins in memory of the late Head of Election Committee, Mr. Hong Nan Tong.
  - 3.2.1 Secretary General Tan Kuan Feng added that another GC Member, Deputy Head of PR Committee Mah Chee Tong, has also passed away, and suggested remembering him together.
  - 3.2.2 All present stood in silence for one minute to pay respects and commemorate. After the moment of silence, everyone resumed their seats and the meeting continued.
- 3.3 Member Choo Sio Hong (K3295) pointed out that in the previous meeting minutes, item 3.5 used the term “accused the Speaker,” which did not reflect the original meaning. At that time, he had merely “reminded the Speaker to handle matters impartially.” He proposed correcting it to “reminded” and checking other sections for similar wording for consistent correction.
  - 3.3.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun stated that the Association and members should maintain rationality and respect, and the term “accused” is inappropriate. She agreed with the proposed correction.
- 3.4 Secretary General Tan Kuan Feng noted that in the previous minutes, item 3.7.14 mentioned “Matric Justice” in English, which was incorrect. It should be “Natural Justice.” He proposed the correction.
- 3.5 Secretary General Tan Kuan Feng proposed that item (9) “Discussion of Proposals” in the previous minutes should be amended to “Discussion of Other Proposals” to more accurately reflect the agenda at that time.
- 3.6 Member Lee Siong How (K7659) pointed out that his name was incorrectly written as “李昌皓” in item 11.4 of the previous minutes and should be corrected.
- 3.7 Member Chuang Keng Soon (K8203) suggested that the previous meeting minutes in the President’s address, which stated: “From the Association’s standpoint, a series of recent events have been very distressing, especially frequent disputes and the considerable cost of litigation,” should be specifically noted in the minutes.
  - 3.7.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun reminded that this is the confirmation of minutes stage, not a review or debate session. The appropriateness of the President’s speech is a procedural matter for the Speaker to decide.
- 3.8 Member Chu Wan Fei (K15820) commented that Hainanese culture is not limited to Qiong Opera and Hainan songs...

3.8.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun reminded again that the review should follow the agenda for confirming the minutes.

3.9 Member Yeok Ah Kim (K9271) proposed, seconded by Member Choo Sio Hong (K3295), that the Special General Meeting Minutes (17/04/2024) be approved.

3.9.1 Member Lee Hsiau Yun (K6185) noted that Yeok Ah Kim proposed, but attendance records show he did not attend the EGM. The Secretariat should verify. If attendance is confirmed, he may remain the proposer; if not, she may act as the proposer.

3.9.2 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun requested the Secretariat to verify the relevant information.

3.10 As Member Yeok Ah Kim (K9271) did not attend the EGM, the proposal was made by Member Lee Hsiau Yun (K6185) and seconded by Member Choo Sio Hong (K3295). The AGM approved the EGM Minutes (17/04/2024).

### **3. Approval of Previous General Meeting Minutes Annual General Meeting 2024 (30/06/2024)**

3.11 Member Lim Fang Hau (K15859) noted that according to practice, members should submit questions to the Association weeks before the AGM within the designated deadline. He had submitted his questions in accordance with the rules and now wished to speak on the matter.

3.12 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun reminded that the current agenda is the confirmation of the AGM minutes 2024. Speeches should follow the agenda. Any questions, suggestions, or comments should be raised at the appropriate segment. She further noted that there were some typos in the Secretary General's report, which have been acknowledged and will be corrected by the Secretariat.

3.13 Member Jenny Wong Chew Boey (K15948) proposed, seconded by Member Yeok Ah Kim (K9271), that the AGM approve the Annual General Meeting Minutes 2024 (30/06/2024).

### **4. Review of Previous General Meeting Minutes Extraordinary General Meeting (17/04/2024)**

4.1 Member Chuang Keng Soon (K8203) referred to the President's address in the previous minutes: "From the Association's standpoint, a series of recent events have been very distressing, especially frequent disputes and the considerable cost of litigation". He further emphasized the question: "Why not resolve matters behind closed doors?" He suggested that a Review Committee be established during the constitution amendment process. Any internal disputes should first be submitted to this committee for investigation and coordination, to avoid resorting directly to legal action, which wastes manpower, resources, and money.

4.1.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun responded that if mediation succeeds, judicial proceedings would be avoided. She invited Mr. Chew Seng Chen

to give a one-time response at the meeting.

4.2 Member Wong Joon Tong (K5278) raised that the previous EGM minutes were submitted to court, causing a Contempt of Court controversy. He questioned whether the previous resolutions still hold legal validity. Using the example of membership expulsion, he stated that non-members should not comment on Association matters and emphasized: “Please shut up or keep your mouth shut”. He said this was out of care for the Association and support for the GC and Deputy Speaker, and requested guidance from the Speaker so that members could more effectively support the GC and maintain fairness and unity.

4.2.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun replied that the GC would address member opinions later. She emphasized that the EGM resolutions are legally valid, and any related court cases do not directly affect these resolutions. Even if litigation occurs, it does not affect the legality of the meeting decisions.

4.3 Member Chuang Kuang Yen (K13702) questioned item 11.6 of the previous minutes regarding whether Goh Ching Toong and Wong Jee Seng, upon resigning as Internal Auditors, had submitted formal reports or recommendations.

4.3.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun noted that this matter falls under the EGM agenda and will be addressed in the relevant segment. The Secretariat is instructed to record it, and repetition is unnecessary.

4.4 Deputy President Dato’ Dr Tan Seng Cheong responded that the Constitution Amendment Sub-Committee suggests the President first mediate; if unresolved, the matter will be handled by the Speaker and the Committee. Arbitration mechanisms are being considered. Referring to political party mechanisms, if a member sues the Association, membership is automatically forfeited. The proposal is under evaluation. The plan is for the GC to discuss and then hold member consultation sessions in the second half of 2024, with at least two sessions involving member participation. He added that Committee members include legal professionals, most of whom are non-GC members. Since 2024, multiple meetings have been held, with scheduled sessions from July to September, continuously advancing constitutional reform.

4.5 Deputy President Dato’ Dr Tan Seng Cheong further stated that the EGM procedures are legal and compliant. Although Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah was ordered to apologize and compensate due to procedural errors, his intention was to safeguard member rights. The opposing party’s insistence on a seven-day imprisonment was regrettable, highlighting the need for constitutional reform. Post-EGM election results also showed member support for the Council. He called for unity and emphasized that members should not “fight among themselves.”

4.5.1 Member Wong Joon Tong (K5278) stated that Hainanese should avoid internal conflicts. The Disciplinary Committee should investigate and, if necessary, act against unreasonable disruptions or attacks on the Deputy Speaker to protect the Association’s reputation.

4.5.2 Member Soo Juan Choon (K4077) reminded the Council to handle future court

communications prudently and include such matters in the agenda to avoid implicating the Speaker and others legally.

- 4.6 Member Phang Yap Hen (K13333) suggested that constitutional amendments should focus on the interests of all members and not favor the GC, promoting the democratization of the Association.
- 4.7 Member Tan Thai See @ Tan Kok Jee (K0040) expressed gratitude to the President, stating that due to personal emotions, he hoped to seek answers and inner peace through the meeting. His speech reflected respect and trust in the Association.
- 4.7.1 He continued that he has been a member for 40 years. He noted that lawsuits are endless, and spending money on litigation has no right or wrong; there is no definitive answer. He remarked that the Association faces many issues and opinions due to 42 GC members of varying quality, and members should recognize their shortcomings.
- 4.7.2 He further mentioned that lawyers and others have advised against “Hainanese fighting Hainanese,” but he was unsure if it actually happened, calling it a disgrace. At over seventy years old, one should speak from the heart: speak if willing, remain silent if not. He believes that before any dispute is taken to court, it should first be clearly explained at the General Meeting. Regarding constitutional amendment proposals by the President, he opined that disputes should not be codified into the Constitution or taken to court. Instead, legal advice should be heard first before deciding whether to include relevant parts.
- 4.8 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun stated that to maintain order, members’ opinions should be presented later. Regarding Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah’s case and the legality of the EGM, Deputy President Dato’ Dr Tan Seng Cheong has already provided an explanation. President Foo Wah Chek also expressed support for the Deputy Speaker in his address and confirmed the interpretation.
- 4.8.1 President Foo Wah Chek confirmed the interpretation was correct.
- 4.9 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun noted that the constitutional amendment process has been clearly presented, emphasizing member participation. At this stage, proposals have not yet been submitted to the GC, and members may still submit proposals. She stressed that member proposals should prioritize the interests of all members and the Association, avoiding overemphasis on personal positions, and asked if members agreed.
- 4.9.1 Members agreed.
- 4.10 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun encouraged members to submit amendment proposals promptly to complete the process by April 2027. She emphasized using the proper mechanism to express opinions rather than merely criticizing during meetings. Regarding mediator arrangements, she stated that to maintain neutrality and fairness in presiding, she will not serve as a mediator and suggested that the Constitution Amendment Sub-Committee not include the Speaker as a mediator candidate.

- 4.11 Member Wong Joon Tong (K5278) proposed, seconded by Member Jenny Wong Chew Boey (K15948), to approve the above review matters.

**4. Review of Previous General Meeting Minutes  
2024 Annual General Meeting (30/06/2024)**

- 4.12 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, reminded all members that the meeting would soon proceed to the motion session. Members who wish to participate in the debate must first obtain and complete the prescribed form from the Secretariat. Only those who have submitted the form will be allowed to speak, in order to ensure the smooth conduct of the meeting. She emphasized that members should be well-prepared before taking part in the discussion.

- 4.13 Member Lim Fang Hau (K15859) pointed out that in the annual report, page 246, item 7.8, the name “Wang Ang Peng” was incorrectly romanized and should be “Wong Ang Peng.” In addition, the motion document for the day incorrectly stated it as “Wong Ang Ping.” He requested the General Assembly to confirm the correct spelling.

- 4.13.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, stated that this matter falls under the confirmation of the previous meeting minutes and asked if there were any further amendments.

- 4.14 Member Teh Ting Oin (K17912) noted that Item 4 of the agenda is “Review of Previous General Meeting Minutes” and inquired whether it is the same as Item 5, “Annual Report.”

- 4.14.1 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, explained that Item 5, the “Annual Report,” is a comprehensive report by the previous year’s Council, covering activities, meetings, and operations, whereas Item 4 refers to the review of the previous Annual General Meeting minutes. The two are of different nature.

- 4.14.2 Member Teh Ting Oin (K17912) further asked whether the “Annual Report” is not included in the “Meeting Minutes,” and whether the discussion has not yet proceeded to the “Annual Report.”

- 4.14.3 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, reiterated that the “Annual Report” falls under Item 5 of the agenda and is separate from the “Meeting Minutes.”

- 4.15 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) stated that he required another member to assist in translating his Chinese remarks on-site and requested the Assembly to provide a microphone.

- 4.15.1 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, asked for the identity of the translator. Upon being informed that it was Member Ong Tee Li (K18177) (ONG TEE LI), she approved the request.

- 4.15.2 Member Loong Chiah Peng pointed out that the last sentence in Item 5.3.3 should read, “I asked during the meeting who should be responsible now,” instead of “I

would like to ask.”

- 4.15.3 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, responded that this matter should have been raised at an earlier stage and reminded that some members were still unclear about the proper handling of different agenda items.
- 4.15.4 Loong Chiah Peng stated that from Items 5.4 to 5.6.4, the Assembly had spent a long time discussing 25 issues. If the Secretary-General had clearly stated at the time that DBKL had not issued the Development Order (D.O.), the discussion could have been concluded within three minutes. This information had already been confirmed in a DBKL meeting and originated from a resolution passed at the 2023 General Meeting—that no construction or payment should proceed before obtaining the Development Order. However, this was not recorded in the meeting minutes.
- 4.15.5 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, sought confirmation of his main point, namely that “although the Secretary-General had responded, it was not recorded in the minutes.”
- 4.15.6 Loong Chiah Peng confirmed and added that DBKL had clearly stated that no Development Order had been issued, but this information was not conveyed during the Assembly, leading to prolonged questioning.
- 4.15.7 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, asked whether he meant that the Secretary-General did not state DBKL’s decision during the meeting.
- 4.15.8 Loong Chiah Peng confirmed and emphasized that this omission resulted in at least half an hour of prolonged discussion.
- 4.15.9 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, stated that the Secretary-General would respond later.
- 4.16 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) further pointed out that Items 5.6 to 5.6.5, comprising six matters, involved the discontinued “Mazu Park” project and a new development plan related to DBKL. He suggested that the old project approved in the 2016 General Meeting should first be formally revoked before initiating a new plan, to avoid confusion.
- 4.16.1 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, responded that there had indeed been confusion in the previous General Meeting between the “Mazu Park” and the “Phase Two Development Project.” To ensure smooth progress of future development, a clear distinction must be made. The matter would be addressed after a report by the Deputy President, Dato’ Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing, after which Member Loong Chiah Peng would be allowed to speak further in accordance with the constitution.
- 4.16.2 Loong Chiah Peng questioned the professionalism of the QS (Quantity Surveyor) cost evaluation mentioned in Item 5.6.2 and called for the report to be made public. Regarding Item 5.6.4, which referred to discussions with DBKL on a new

development plan, he cautioned that relying solely on the QS report could lead to repeated mistakes. He emphasized that construction material costs had increased by 35% and suggested arranging a meeting with the QS. He added that if the Council did not take this matter seriously, he would refrain from further comment.

- 4.16.3 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, responded that detailed figures could only be confirmed during the open tender process. If there is a trend of rising costs, the Council should remain alert, but all matters must still be subject to formal procedures and be deliberated and approved by the AGM. She considered members' feedback as a reminder to the Council.
- 4.17 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) stated that Item 3.1 should address the potential issues of the "Mazu Park Project" and hold the previous Council accountable for failing to handle the matter effectively or assume responsibility. He emphasized that this project was not part of what was approved in the 2016 AGM, and as there had been no response over the years, he decided to formally raise it for the last time, and if necessary, pursue accountability through a resolution.
- 4.17.1 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei, asked about the purpose of his statement.
- 4.17.2 Loong Chiah Peng stated that the matter had been disputed for nine years with no substantive plan. He attempted to present slides and asked whether members at the back could see clearly.
- 4.17.3 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, advised him to state his key points directly to save time.
- 4.17.4 Loong Chiah Peng stated that the absence of the PPT would affect his presentation but would proceed concisely.
- 4.17.5 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, responded that she had already summarized part of the content earlier.
- 4.17.6 Loong Chiah Peng emphasized that what was approved in the 2016 AGM was a development project valued at RM104 million, consisting of Phase One and Phase Two.
- 4.17.7 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, reminded him that he had exceeded his speaking time and granted an additional five minutes to conclude.
- 4.17.8 Loong Chiah Peng stated that the matter was crucial and that many members were still unaware of the facts.
- 4.17.9 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, pointed out that it had been stated earlier that most members could not clearly view the slides, and thus they were not suitable as the main presentation method, and requested him to proceed with key points.

- 4.17.10 Loong Chiah Peng clarified the confusion regarding the name “Mazu Park,” stating that DBKL had rejected the development application approved by members, rendering the project invalid.
- 4.17.11 Loong Chiah Peng added that the relevant plan was initially proposed by Aspirasi Permai as early as 2015 and had received DBKL approval. Subsequently, the Council submitted a RM104 million plan which was approved by the AGM. However, the company later upgraded the application under “Landscape” and renamed it “Mazu Park,” a name not clearly presented to the AGM. Another company, Vintage Paradise, later submitted further upgrades, with a third revision in 2017, upon which DBKL required a Development Order (D.O.).
- 4.17.12 Loong Chiah Peng emphasized that the name “Mazu Park” was not approved by members but originated from pre-2015 plans. He had raised this multiple times with the Council, but it was not addressed nor recorded in the minutes, and he urged that it be clarified as soon as possible.
- 4.17.13 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun (, summarized that the core issue lay in the confusion between Phase One (including basement parking, etc.) and the Phase Two development plan. It should have been referred to as the “Phase Two Development Plan,” but the term “Mazu Park” appeared, causing confusion originating from the previous Council. If the current Council intends to proceed, any matters relating to naming, planning, or costs that exceed or differ from what was previously approved by the AGM, or that are unclear and cause confusion, must be rectified and resubmitted to the AGM for approval before implementation. She reiterated that the matter was concluded and would not be further discussed.
- 4.17.14 Loong Chiah Peng stated that the issue had been identified and that it was his responsibility, but the Council still needed to decide whether to agree.
- 4.17.15 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, emphasized that agreement is not determined by the Council but must follow the constitution; as it is stipulated, it must be agreed upon and implemented.
- 4.17.16 Loong Chiah Peng further asked who would bear the losses if the matter proceeds. The Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, clearly stated that the entire Council would bear responsibility.

(The members present responded with applause in agreement.)

- 4.17.17 The Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun added that all matters must be carried out in accordance with the constitution and AGM resolutions. She reminded members that it had been clarified in the previous AGM that even if a project is led by an individual council member, responsibility cannot be borne by an individual but must be shared by the entire Council. Therefore, any matters proposed and within the Council’s authority must be collectively borne. She emphasized that the matter was closed, and only the proposal by the Deputy President, Dato’ Sri

Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing, would be discussed later, without revisiting past Council issues.

- 4.17.18 Wong Ang Peng (K4526) pointed out that the Honourable Speaker's statement must be recorded in the minutes, namely that the Council must bear responsibility for the matter. Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, responded that the Secretariat would record her statement and remarked that she had never seen such detailed minutes before.
- 4.17.19 Loong Chiah Peng expressed full agreement with the Honourable Speaker and cited Clause 9.1 of the constitution, stating that all matters are the responsibility of the Council and must be taken seriously.
- 4.18 Member Chuang Keng Soon (K8203) raised a question that according to page 54, Item 7.9.29, the total cost of the Mazu statue project was RM3.19 million, with payment terms of 40% upon 50% completion, and a further 20% upon completion and delivery to site, totaling 60%. However, page 53, Item 7.9.27 stated that RM2,073,500 had already been paid, approximately 65% of the total, questioning whether there had been an overpayment of 5%. He also asked about Item 7.9.31, which mentioned that Vice President Dato' Tan Seng Cheong had led a delegation to China, where Zheng Chang Stones Berhad Ltd requested RM5 million, and requested details of the trip.
- 4.19 Member Wong Joon Tong (K5278) raised two issues. Firstly, regarding page 241, Item 7.2.13, where the 2023 Council approved RM119,558 for medical insurance for council members. He questioned this, noting that council members serve on a voluntary basis and are not staff, and public funds should not be used to purchase high-value insurance for 45 council members. He proposed setting up a medical assistance fund instead to support needy Hainanese members and replacing the insurance scheme to avoid escalating costs. He suggested that this matter be brought to the AGM for decision.
- 4.19.1 Secondly, he referred to pages 251–252, Item 7.10.9, regarding donations to other Hainan associations with Mazu temples, where each received RM20,000, totaling over RM250,000, exceeding the Council's approval limit. He objected to treating each donation as a separate case to bypass scrutiny and called for those responsible to explain, leaving it to the Honourable Speaker to decide whether it should be brought to the Assembly.
- 4.20 Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) stated that the AGM should allow members to speak freely, and that unresolved issues over the past ten years had led to the current situation. He asked for the total amount paid to Zheng Chang Stones Berhad Ltd in China and whether payments were made based on a contract or correspondence. He pointed out that under Clause 11 of the contract, the association had the right to terminate the contract at any time without reason, yet the contractor had not been terminated and payments continued, while no statue had been delivered. He stated that the Treasurer should respond and emphasized that the Council must be held accountable.
- 4.20.1 Treasurer Woo Wee Kang responded that the payment progress had been displayed. The first payment on 23/08/2019 was 45% (after deducting 10% retention) upon

50% completion, amounting to RM1,435,500. The second payment on 14/02/2023 was 20%, amounting to RM638,000, based on the second interim certificate issued by YTS. The total paid was RM2,073,500, representing 65% of the contract.

- 4.20.2 Treasurer Woo Wee Kang further explained that the total contract sum was RM3,190,000, payable in stages: 10% upon signing (RM319,000), 40% upon 50% factory completion (RM1,276,000), 20% upon full completion and delivery (RM638,000), 25% upon installation (RM797,500), 3% upon issuance of Certificate of Completion (RM79,750), and 3% upon issuance of Defects Liability Certificate (RM79,750). The outstanding amount to date is RM1,116,500.
- 4.20.3 He added that there is a contingent liability involving a legal claim by the supplier related to the Mazu Park project amounting to RM5,946,009, including storage, management fees, and interest, which remains unpaid and under negotiation.
- 4.20.4 The 3rd The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong added that under the contract, only 50% was payable before arrival in Malaysia, with the balance payable after delivery. Upon taking office, the current Council discovered issues and had received a lawyer's letter claiming RM6,000,000. According to the contract, the association is not obliged to pay, and no legal action has been taken yet. The association will coordinate after obtaining DBKL approval and proceed only after AGM approval. The RM5.9 million claim will not be paid, and the contract terms will be upheld.
- 4.21 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, responded that the Council would provide a consolidated response to members' questions, inviting the Secretary-General or relevant council members to explain, and requested that it be clearly recorded in the minutes that no Development Order (D.O.) had been issued previously.
- 4.22 The 3rd The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong stated that upon taking office, the Council decided to apply for the Development Order (D.O.) and upon reviewing past documents, found that no such approval had previously been obtained. The Council had since engaged with DBKL multiple times and formally submitted the application within a year. The Council committed that after obtaining the D.O., quotations would be obtained and presented to the AGM for approval before any construction begins.
- 4.23 Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing explained that past approvals, the Mazu Park issue, and parking matters largely originated from the previous leadership and possibly involved external parties or DBKL. At present, the Council has obtained 100% approval for the parking facility, and the Mazu Park project has also passed multiple reviews, with the Minister raising no objection.
- 4.23.1 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, reminded the Deputy President to clearly specify which parking facility had received approval.
- 4.23.2 Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing clarified that the approved development was the original basement parking approved in the 2016 AGM, located at the Mazu Park site, and not the newly designed parking facility. He

added that although approval had been obtained, the Council had not commenced construction and planned to make adjustments to improve traffic flow.

4.23.3 Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing stated that after personally observing the crowd flow and bus movement arrangements during the Chinese New Year period, he decided to revise the route design. Buses would no longer stop along the main road in front but would instead enter from the rear. The Council also proposed to add two lifts to facilitate elderly members and to replace the existing Mechanical Ventilation system with natural Air Flow Ventilation. The proposed modifications had been discussed with professional Yap Teck Seng, and a presentation (PPT) had been prepared to brief members in detail.

4.23.4 Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing called on members to support the new design and direction, emphasizing the need to look forward and collectively advance the association's development.

(Members applauded)

4.24 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, sought confirmation on whether the proposed modifications would need to be submitted to the AGM for approval in due course. This was affirmed by 3rd The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong (DATO' DR TAN SENG CHEONG), who stated that all proposed changes would be presented to the AGM for discussion and approval after obtaining the Development Order (D.O.), before any construction proceeds.

4.24.1 The 3rd The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong further responded that the previous Council had assigned President Foo Wah Chek together with auditors from Bakertilly to conduct a site visit in Fujian, China, to verify the existence of the statue at Zheng Chang Stones Berhad Ltd. At present, the Council would wait for DBKL's formal issuance of the D.O. before proceeding to Fujian to negotiate with the supplier on subsequent matters. He stated that the Council is committed to presenting the confirmed statue costs to the AGM for deliberation and approval before proceeding with further actions.

(Members applauded)

4.24.2 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun emphasized that all changes must be approved by the AGM before implementation and urged members to support the Council.

(Members applauded)

4.25 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, noted that the Council had yet to respond to the issue of medical insurance.

4.25.1 Secretary General Tan Kuan Feng responded that the insurance matter referred to by members is detailed in the Chinese version of the report, page 47, Item 7.2.13, amounting to RM119,558. According to the association's constitution, the Council's

approval limit must not exceed RM250,000. This expenditure was mainly for insurance coverage for council members, excluding those above 70 years old. As some members had raised concerns about the amount, the Council would revisit the matter and decide whether to continue the policy.

- 4.26 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) (LOONG CHIAH PENG) attempted to speak but was stopped by the Honourable Speaker.
- 4.26.1 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun instructed him to be seated, emphasizing that this is a meeting, not a debate session, and requested the relevant council members to respond to the insurance issue. She specifically pointed out that council members should take responsibility and not leave all responses to 3rd The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong, as this would amount to neglect of duty by others. This statement was met with applause from attendees.
- 4.26.2 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun reiterated that each matter should be addressed by the responsible council member and not by a single individual handling all responses.
- 4.27 Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing responded regarding the RM20,000 donation to Mazu temples. He explained that as a Hainanese association, and given that the association's Thean Hou Temple was built through contributions from the Hainanese community in Malaysia, it was in the spirit of giving back and preserving cultural heritage that the Council approved RM20,000 for each temple in underdeveloped areas such as Penang and Kuala Lipis for maintenance purposes. He emphasized that there was no personal use involved.
- 4.28 Member Chuang Kuang Yen (K13702) raised the issue that the Internal Auditor had not submitted a report, and that findings had yet to be explained.
- 4.28.1 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun requested Treasurer Woo Wee Kang to clarify the matter of the Internal Auditor.
- 4.28.2 Treasurer Woo Wee Kang stated that the AGM had appointed two Internal Auditors, namely Wong Jee Seng and Goh Ching Toong. However, after the AGM, when Wong Jee Seng was contacted, he declined the appointment. As for Goh Ching Toong, he had met with the association after the accounts were prepared but subsequently submitted his resignation. Despite attempts to retain him, he declined to take up the role. As such, no audit report could be presented. The current AGM would appoint two new Internal Auditors to fulfill the oversight function.
- 4.29 In her summary, the Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun stated that throughout the meeting, she had repeatedly asked whether there were further questions. Members had remained silent but continued raising questions after the response session had ended, making it difficult to proceed smoothly. She emphasized the need to observe meeting discipline and called on members to cooperate, stating that this should not happen again.

- 4.30 Member Choo Sio Hong (K3295) intended to raise a question, but the Honourable Speaker instructed that it be brought up during the motion session instead.
- 4.31 Member Bang Peng Eam (K3875) stated that to avoid misunderstanding, he would speak in English. He pointed out that the Council intended to submit the parking or Mazu Park development plan for approval and questioned whether this constituted a “fait accompli,” particularly if preparations such as bank financing required prior planning but might ultimately not be approved.
- 4.31.1 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun responded that the application was at a preliminary stage, involving only design modifications, and no construction had commenced. It would be submitted to the AGM for approval before any work proceeds.
- 4.31.2 Member Bang Peng Eam further asked whether approval could be obtained before incurring costs, such as architectural drawings and consultancy fees, to avoid wastage should the proposal be rejected.
- 4.31.3 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun clarified that the reference was to the original parking project, not the seven-storey parking plan.
- 4.31.4 Member Bang Peng Eam pointed out that the 2016 approval had lapsed and suggested that a proposal should first be prepared and, based on feedback from consultants, be submitted to the AGM for approval, as per proper procedure.
- 4.31.5 Honourable Speaker, Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun advised the Council to take note of and consider members’ suggestions and to carefully plan procedures in the future.
- 4.31.6 Member Bang Peng Eam explained to members who did not understand Chinese that “fait accompli” refers to proceeding with actions before seeking approval.
- 4.31.7 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun responded that the term “acting first and seeking approval later” used by the member may not be entirely appropriate. However, she suggested that the Board adopt the member’s proposal: to first prepare a preliminary proposal, obtain approval from the General Meeting, then proceed with design engagement, and finally submit it again to the General Meeting for formal approval, in order to ensure proper procedures.
- 4.32 Member Chuang Keng Soon (K8203) pointed out that he had previously raised two questions, but only one had been answered. The other remained unanswered, namely that under Clause 7.9.29, payment should be 60%, yet under Clause 7.9.27, 65% has already been paid.
- 4.32.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun stated that the matter had already been addressed earlier, and confirmed that the payment had indeed exceeded the stipulated amount. She reminded attendees to pay attention to the discussion and emphasized that despite her lack of sleep, she was still able to

follow the proceedings clearly. She also instructed Loong Chee Peng (K2223) to stop speaking and take his seat.

- 4.33 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) continued to request to speak, stating that his question had not been answered, and questioned whether overpayment had indeed occurred in relation to the Mazu statue. The Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun confirmed that his statement was correct and reiterated that the issue originated from the previous Board. Loong Chiah Peng stressed that contracts have continuity and accountability should extend across terms. He questioned why the contract, which granted the Association the right to terminate, was not exercised, and why payments continued, ultimately resulting in overpayment, which he deemed unfair.
- 4.33.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun requested The 3rd The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong to clarify the timeline of payments and the actions taken by the current Board.
- 4.33.2 The 3rd The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong explained that the payments were made in 2019 and January 2023, before he joined the Board. Upon discovering the issue after assuming office, he immediately initiated corrective actions.
- 4.33.3 Loong Chiah Peng stated that without holding responsible parties accountable, the issue would remain unresolved.
- 4.33.4 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun reminded Loong Chiah Peng to remain rational and not raise his voice. She explained that if mistakes were made by the previous Board, the current Board should not be held responsible. The role of the current Board is to identify, acknowledge, and rectify past mistakes to prevent recurrence. (Applause)
- 4.33.5 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun added that those responsible were mostly no longer in office or even members. She urged attendees not to dwell excessively on past mistakes, but to ensure future matters are handled in accordance with the constitution and with respect for members' rights.
- 4.33.6 Loong Chiah Peng asked who should now bear responsibility for the matter and the associated payments.
- 4.33.7 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun asked whom he expected to take responsibility and suggested he submit a formal written complaint to initiate a disciplinary investigation. Loong Chiah Peng agreed to do so.
- 4.33.8 The 3rd The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong explained that the current Board decided not to terminate the contract in order to retrieve the Mazu statue and continue the development of the Mazu Park. As the statue is custom-made, the Association still hopes to take delivery and proceed with the project. Hence, the contract remains in force while coordination continues.

- 4.34 Ong Hong Hoon reminded the Meeting that the responsibility of Board members is significant, especially as many current members were also part of the previous Board. Therefore, if issues are identified, the relevant individuals should be held accountable.
- 4.34.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun stated that these Board members were elected by the members.
- 4.34.2 Member Bang Peng Eam (K3875) pointed out that responsibility should not be avoided simply because previous members have left. Even if a CEO resigns, the organisation still bears responsibility. He emphasized that Thean Hou Temple and Selangor & Federal Territory Hainan Association still exist, and thus must take responsibility.
- 4.34.3 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun stressed that operations must move forward. If the new GC continues unfinished matters from the previous term, any changes or ambiguities in name, plan, or expenditure must be resubmitted to the General Meeting for approval. She also reminded members to consider whether they understand candidates when voting, rather than simply following a “menu vote,” as this affects governance. She added that if members insist on accountability, they may follow proper procedures to reopen investigations and decide on further action at a General Meeting.
- 4.34.4 Ong Hong Hoon expressed agreement and reminded all GC members to take responsibility sincerely. If mistakes are repeated, it would bring shame to the Hainan community. He supported the Speaker’s view and urged members not to vote blindly. (Applause)
- 4.34.5 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun thanked him and added that the current GC is more progressive. She had proposed organizing leadership training camps to guide members on conducting meetings, serving as GC members, and planning activities, which received unanimous approval. (Applause)
- 4.34.6 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun stated that the Association must continue progressing, learn from the past, and improve in the future. (Applause and cheers)
- 4.35 Subsequently, it was proposed by Wong Joon Tong (K5278) and seconded by Lee Siong How (K7659) that the above review be adopted.
- 4.36 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun declared a recess, to reconvene at 2:00pm after lunch.

## 5. Discussion and Adoption of the 2024 Annual Report

- 5.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun announced that the Meeting had proceeded to Agenda Item 5 and invited Secretary-General Tan Kuan Feng to present the 2024 Annual Report.
- 5.2 Secretary-General Tan Kuan Feng presented the 2024 Annual Report, stating that the Chinese version is on pages 63 to 105, while the English version is on pages 263 to 286.
- 5.3 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun stated that the floor would now be open for discussion of the 2024 Annual Report. She also reminded members who wish to participate in the debates under Agenda Item 7 to first collect and complete the relevant forms from the Secretariat.
- 5.4 Secretary-General Tan Kuan Feng proposed that the following information be added under Section 8.5 “Women’s Group” on page 67:  
Advisors: Loong Yuet Boey, Tan Mong Leng, Datin Ho Siew Juat, Tan Kai Jong  
Legal Advisor: Lawyer Goh Nai Hsing
- 5.5 Member Teh Ting Oin (K17912) pointed out that the representation roles relating to SJK(C) Chiao Nan on page 84, Section 11.4, were unclear, as some Board members did not have their respective representing bodies indicated. He suggested further clarification of their affiliations. He also noted that the placement of the national flag behind the stage was incorrect and should be positioned on the right-hand side of the Speaker in accordance with national protocol.
- 5.5.1 Secretary-General Tan Kuan Feng explained that Board members were appointed to represent the Association on the SJK(C) Chiao Nan Board. Elections were conducted internally within the School Board, and the Association only appoints representatives without involvement in role assignments. Woo Wee Kang serves as Treasurer, while Phang Chee Kwong and Chu Wan Chek hold no specific positions.
- 5.5.2 The Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun stated that the Association only appoints Board members and does not appoint Parent-Teacher Association representatives. As no PTA list was provided by Chiao Nan, the positions mentioned pertain solely to the School Board.
- 5.5.3 For further clarification, the Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun invited the Chairman of the Board of Directors SJK(c) Chiao Nan, Dato’ Lim Hong Chang (Lawyer), to explain.
- 5.5.4 The Chairman of the Board of Directors SJK(c) Chiao Nan, and Legal Advisor of the Association, Dato’ Lim Hong Chang (Lawyer), explained that the Board consists of 15 members, comprising three representatives each from the Alumni Association, Parent-Teacher Association, Trustees, Ministry of Education, and Sponsors. Apart from the six representatives from the Alumni and PTA, the remaining nine are nominated by the Association to serve as Trustees, Ministry representatives, and Sponsors. Woo Wee Kang, Phang Chee Kwong, and Chu Wan Chek serve as

Sponsor representatives.

- 5.5.5 Member Teh Ting Oin (K17912) suggested that such affiliations should be clearly stated. Dato' Lim Hong Chang (Lawyer) responded that this could be supplemented in the future.
- 5.6 Member Teh Ting Oin (K17912) further raised comments regarding the “Beneficiary Organisations” section on pages 93 to 94:
1. He suggested numbering the list for easier ISO management and tracking.
  2. He noted that since 2023, the government has institutionalised funding for Chinese primary schools, and SJK(C) Chiao Nan should receive certain allocations; therefore, the Association may not need to bear substantial additional funding.
  3. He proposed that some expenses should be borne by the school’s PTA, including:
    - Teachers’ Day Dinner (RM8,203.45)
    - Teachers’ Office Computers (RM28,952.00)
    - Three printers (RM1,830.00)
    - Children’s Day gifts (RM2,750.00)
    - Children’s Day tea reception (RM1,000.00)
    - School badminton competition expenses (RM2,000.00)
  4. He suggested reviewing the RM1,000 financial aid allocated to underprivileged students of Chung Hwa Independent High School, Kelantan.
- 5.7 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun instructed that if there were no further questions, a proposer and seconder could be called to adopt the 2024 Annual Report.
- 5.8 Member Teh Ting Oin (K17912) noted that his question regarding funding arrangements had not been answered. He pointed out that SJK(C) Chiao Nan is an asset of the Association and questioned why most expenses are borne by the Association rather than the PTA.
- 5.8.1 The Chairman of the Board of Directors SJK(c) Chiao Nan, Dato' Lim Hong Chang (Lawyer), responded that the school is currently financially weak, with only 265 students, of whom 165 are Chinese, while the rest are Malay and Indian. Due to the predominantly lower- to middle-income backgrounds of the students, fundraising is difficult, and the Board lacks a steady income stream. Without the Association’s support, the school would struggle to sustain operations. He added that schools managed by other dialect groups, such as the Hakka, Hokkien, and Teochew, are thriving, whereas Chiao Nan has been declining. He urged the Association to prioritise supporting the school, which was built by earlier benefactors, and to take steps to revive it.
- 5.8.2 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun interrupted Member Teh Ting Oin (K17912) and reminded attendees to observe proper speaking order.
- 5.8.3 Member Teh Ting Oin (K17912) clarified that he was inquiring whether government funding was sufficient and suggested that the School Board should actively apply for additional funding if needed.

- 5.8.4 The Chairman of the Board of Directors SJK(c) Chiao Nan, Dato' Lim Hong Chang (Lawyer), responded that government funding is limited. Annual maintenance costs amount to approximately RM200,000; the school received RM100,000 the year before last, and although RM200,000 was applied for last year, only RM50,000 was approved. This remains insufficient to maintain facilities, hence continued support from the Association is necessary.
- 5.9 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun repeatedly confirmed whether there were further questions. As there were none, she concluded this session.
- 5.10 Member Choo Sio Hong (K3295) suggested that, given the continuous decline in student numbers at SJK(C) Chiao Nan, consideration be given to relocating the school to an area with a higher Chinese population and rebuilding it to support the Association's future development.
- 5.11 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun asked Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) what he intended to speak on.
- 5.11.1 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) stated that although his question had been answered by the Board, he believed it was necessary to reflect on why the school had reached its current state. He emphasized that the school should formulate concrete action plans rather than engage in empty discussion.
- 5.11.2 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun responded that such matters could be discussed further during the motion debate session.
- 5.12 Member Teh Ting Oin (K17912) proposed, and Member Lee Siong How (K7659) seconded, that the Meeting unanimously adopt the 2024 Annual Report.

## **6. Discussion and Adoption of the Audited Financial Report 2024**

- 6.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun informed the assembly that the next agenda item was the discussion and adoption of the audited financial report for the year 2024, and invited Treasurer Woo Wee Kang to present.
- 6.2 Treasurer Woo Wee Kang greeted Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun and the members present, and stated that he would present the report via PowerPoint. The financial report can be found on pages 142 to 183.
- 6.2.1 He reported that the total revenue for 2024 was RM18,446,594, a decrease of RM478,603 (2.5%) compared to 2023.
- 6.2.2 Total expenditure for 2024 was RM12,618,195, resulting in a surplus of RM5,828,399, a decrease of 5%. However, total assets increased by 5.2% to RM123,041,854.
- 6.2.3 Comparing total revenue and expenditure from 2020 to 2025, expenses decreased in 2020 due to the pandemic and MCO, gradually increased after 2022, and slightly declined in 2024 but remained close to 2023 levels.

- 6.2.4 The main fluctuation in revenue came from activities. In 2024, income from events such as religious ceremonies, Wesak Day, and Chinese New Year was RM5,098,637, a decrease of 1.4% compared to 2023. Donations increased to RM9,997,792, an increase of nearly 6%.
- 6.2.5 Interest income from deposits was RM2,401,202, a decrease of 1.8%, while rental income increased by RM133,066 (18%). There was also income from a legal settlement case.
- 6.2.6 He explained that a supplier had delivered incorrect goods and was required by court judgment to pay compensation. RM50,000 has been repaid over 8 months, with 24 months of instalments remaining.
- 6.2.7 The surplus from 2022 to 2024 remained above RM5 million annually. In 2024, the surplus was RM5,828,399, and total assets increased by approximately RM5–6 million each year, reaching RM123,041,854.
- 6.2.8 Event expenses in 2024 were RM2,873,571, an increase of RM360,827 compared to 2023.
- 6.2.9 Total external donations amounted to RM1,783,496, an increase of RM844,960 compared to 2023. The largest increase was donations to the Hainan Federation, affiliated associations, and clan groups, totaling RM797,000. Members may refer to pages 89 to 105 for details.
- 6.2.10 Legal compensation expenses amounted to RM88,400, arising from litigation involving members Law Cheong Keng and Wong Ah Seng, in which the association lost the case.
- 6.2.11 Legal and professional fees amounted to RM930,074, an increase of RM761,368 (451%) compared to 2023, mainly due to multiple court cases involving committee members.
- 6.2.12 The association wrote off RM44,000 in rental receivables. Treasurer Ng Wei Kang explained that due to severe financial difficulties faced by a tenant at Jalan Raja Bot, and upon legal advice that recovery costs would be too high, the committee resolved to write it off.
- 6.2.13 Repair and maintenance expenses amounted to RM858,642, an increase of RM255,623 compared to 2023, mainly due to maintenance of a newly acquired parking facility.
- 6.2.14 Parking spaces increased by 50 to a total of 180. Parking income in 2024 was RM268,650, nearly offsetting maintenance costs. Regular maintenance costs are approximately RM600,000.
- 6.2.15 Event surplus in 2024 included:  
Chinese New Year RM930,400;

Religious ceremonies RM1,013,004;  
Wesak Day RM173,623;  
Buddha's Birthday RM608,526;  
Marriage registration RM537,021;  
Total surplus RM3,262,574, a decrease of RM300,000 compared to 2023.

- 6.2.16 He reminded all departments to actively increase revenue, especially from events.
- 6.2.27 Personal accident insurance premium for members was RM142,716, due to an increase from RM8.30 to RM11 per policy. Currently, 12,408 members are insured.
- 6.2.18 Insurance claims amounted to RM114,171, recoverable from the insurance company. University graduation incentives totaled RM54,450, members' children incentives RM33,900, bereavement assistance approximately RM60,000, and aid for the elderly increased by RM248,579.
- 6.2.19 As of 2024, total property value was RM52,270,123, with the largest asset being the newly acquired parking facility valued at RM37,400,200.
- 6.3 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun thanked Treasurer Woo Wee Kang for the detailed report and opened the floor for questions.
- 6.4 Member Lim Fang Hau (K15859) asked whether the external audit firm Baker Tilly's partner being a member of the association would affect its independence.
- 6.4.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun asked whether Member Lim Fang Hau believed that members of the association should not serve as external auditors.
- 6.4.2 Member Lim Fang Hau replied that he was concerned about potential conflicts of interest.
- 6.4.3 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun responded that external audit firms are regulated by the government and would face disciplinary action for misconduct, and asked whether he believed the auditors would act improperly.
- 6.4.4 Member Lim Fang Hau replied that he was unsure but maintained his concerns.
- 6.4.5 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun proposed that constitutional provisions should be established to clearly define the conditions and standards for professionals.
- 6.4.6 Treasurer Woo Wee Kang responded to Member Lim Fang Hau (K15859) regarding the independence of the auditor. He stated that the association has taken note of the matter and obtained clarification and assurance from Baker Tilly. The audit partner, although a member, does not hold any position in the association and has no authority to participate in its operations.

- 6.4.7 Furthermore, Treasurer Woo Wee Kang stated that page 144 of the annual report contains a clear declaration that the auditors are independent of the association, and all work complies with the professional code of ethics and practices of the Malaysian Institute of Accountants (MIA) and the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants (IESBA). Therefore, Baker Tilly and its partners are responsible for ensuring audit transparency, and the report is accountable not only to the association but also to the government. He believes that there is no issue with Baker Tilly serving as the external auditor, as they are also auditors for many large corporations and possess professional qualifications.
- 6.4.8 Baker Tilly representative Ong Teng Yan added that he is only an ordinary member and does not have any authority to intervene.
- 6.5 Member Teh Ting Oin (K17912) pointed out that as at 31 December 2024, fixed deposits amounted to RM67,212,422, with interest rates of only 2% to 2.5%. He suggested considering investment in trust institutions, where returns could reach 10% to 12%, subject to a minimum of RM500,000.
- 6.5.1 In response, Treasurer Woo Wee Kang explained that the decision to place funds in fixed deposits rather than trust funds is based on return and risk considerations. To safeguard funds, a more stable option such as fixed deposits was chosen. He believes that other associations adopt similar practices and that this remains the best option at present.
- 6.6 Member Chuang Kuang Yen (K13702) stated that there appeared to be an error in the financial report, noting that expenditure had actually increased by approximately RM2 million, including RM700,000 to RM800,000 in donations and another RM800,000 in legal and professional fees. He acknowledged that legal and professional fees are unavoidable.
- 6.6.1 He stated that compared to legal fees, he was more concerned about donations. Using personal income as an analogy, he felt that the proportion of donations was too high and suggested increasing assistance for the elderly and incentive amounts.
- 6.6.2 He asked whether the reduction in capital commitment from RM17 million in 2023 to RM1.4 million in 2024 was related to the Mazu Park project, and suggested including compensation clauses in future contracts.
- 6.6.3 Regarding member welfare, Treasurer Woo Wee Kang stated that this does not fall under financial matters and must be decided by the committee. However, adjustments can be made if agreed upon.
- 6.6.4 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun pointed out that this involves budget planning, and the Treasurer may consider adjustments in terms of cost and budgeting.
- 6.6.5 Regarding capital commitment, Treasurer Woo Wee Kang explained that it had decreased from RM17 million to RM1.429 million, mainly due to the termination of certain contracts in 2022. Ongoing projects include stone works, the Mazu statue,

consultancy, and landscape design.

- 6.6.6 The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr. Tan Seng Cheong reported that the association is involved in approximately 10 cases. Legal and professional fees this year amounted to approximately RM500,000, with a previous amount of RM400,000, totalling RM930,000. He explained that payments for each case are made based on progress, and most cases involve the association being sued. The latest case involves Deputy Speaker Lee Su Hwa, which is a 2025 matter and not included in this report.
- 6.6.7 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun asked about the progress of the cases. The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr. Tan Seng Cheong responded that the first five cases have been completed: the association won the Vintech Solution case; lost two cases involving members; and reached settlements in two cases involving former Executive Secretary, with withdrawal of suits after apology. Cases 6 to 9 involving former Deputy President Dato' Tang Chai Yoong are still ongoing.
- 6.6.8 Member Chiam Tow Hong (K7390) asked whether the lawyers were internal or externally appointed. Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun explained that different cases require different legal expertise. The member expressed understanding.
- 6.6.9 Member Wong Joon Tong (K5278) questioned the legal fees of RM30,000 for cases 4 and 5, asking whether the cases had gone to trial. Based on his 50 years of experience, he stated that such fees would be reasonable if the cases had proceeded to trial, otherwise they would be considered high.
- 6.6.10 Member Wong Joon Tong added that he had served the association for 15 years and was a member of the disciplinary committee, but was removed following the dismissal of the former Secretary-General. He stated that as a Hainanese, he is willing to provide services without charge and hopes the committee will make use of available resources.
- 6.6.11 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun responded that she acknowledged his willingness to serve voluntarily and that future staff-related disputes could be referred to him.
- 6.7 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) asked whether the rental write-off for the Raja Bot property mentioned by Treasurer Ng Wei Kang amounted to RM40,000.
- 6.7.1 Treasurer Woo Wee Kang replied that the amount was RM44,000.
- 6.7.2 Member Loong Chiah Peng raised a query to Treasurer Woo Wee Kang, questioning whether, if the property were personally owned, one would easily write off rental arrears. He also asked about the tenancy agreement and stated that there should be a solution.

- 6.7.3 Member Loong Chiah Peng reminded that the issue regarding the write-off of RM44,000 in arrears had not yet been answered.
- 6.7.4 Treasurer Woo Wee Kang explained that the committee had made multiple attempts to recover the amount without success and had consulted lawyers Tony Chiu & Partner. As the outstanding amount was below RM50,000, the legal cost would be too high and not worthwhile to pursue; therefore, the decision was made to write it off. He emphasised that this decision was made based on legal advice and not done arbitrarily. He added that the tenant's contract had been terminated and the committee is currently seeking a new tenant.
- 6.7.5 Member Loong Chiah Peng asked about the tenancy agreement and annual rental income of Nanyang Hotel, as well as the number of legal cases involving the association, their status, and the success rate.
- 6.7.6 Treasurer Woo Wee Kang explained that although the hotel faced difficulties during the pandemic, it continued its tenancy and eventually settled all outstanding payments. He stated that the committee believes maintaining a stable long-term tenant is beneficial. Current rental adjustment negotiations are being led by Secretary-General Tan Kuan Peng and the property subcommittee, taking into account potential renovation and reliability risks if a new tenant is introduced.
- 6.7.7 Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng@Foo Sea Hing added that the tenant related to the RM44,000 write-off had gone bankrupt. To pursue recovery would require liquidation, which would be costly and time-consuming. Therefore, the amount was written off as bad debt, although reminder letters would still be issued as part of formal procedure.
- 6.7.8 Member Loong Chiah Peng expressed understanding but questioned why no action had been taken earlier, allowing the arrears to accumulate. He also asked about the rental of Nanyang Hotel.
- 6.7.9 Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng@Foo Sea Hing responded that the hotel lease had expired and only a short-term extension was granted. Although there were rental arrears during the pandemic, all amounts were eventually settled. He recently met with the hotel management, who indicated that the premises are outdated and will undergo renovation before submitting a proposal for further negotiation. A long-term lease may be considered in the future.
- 6.7.10 Legal Advisor Lawyer Tan Chek Yoke stated that as a landlord, if a tenant defaults on rent for more than three months, the administrative department should immediately initiate legal action. If the amount is large, action should be taken within one to two months through legal channels; otherwise, it may accumulate into a substantial sum. He questioned why the association did not pursue the matter if the company had closed or declared financial distress. Even if recovery is unlikely, a small legal cost could compel the debtor into bankruptcy, allowing proper accounting treatment as bad debt.

- 6.7.11 Legal Advisor Lawyer Tan Chek Yoke further pointed out that many lawyers merely follow procedures without considering the association's tax or practical perspective. If rental amounts are significant, action should be taken after one or two months of default to prevent accumulation into large bad debts. He cited an example where a company defaulted RM100,000 and subsequently closed down, resulting in inability to recover the amount. As a major landlord, the association should strengthen its handling of such matters.
- 6.7.12 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun asked whether the committee had consulted Legal Advisor Lawyer Tan Chek Yoke when handling such matters. He replied that he had not been consulted.
- 6.7.13 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, pointed out that since she began chairing AGM, she has observed that the Legal Advisor has been virtually a "mere decoration." Since the association has appointed a Legal Advisor, the advisor must be involved and consulted whenever there is a need to engage a lawyer. Any legal issues should also be referred to the advisor first. She questioned why Legal Advisor Tan Chek Yoke had never been consulted before but suddenly stood up to answer questions, which shows that GC has not made good use of the advisor's resources. She emphasized that GC must improve in the future, and even if this angers GC, she must speak the truth.
- 6.8 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) questioned why the parking lot still uses a coupon payment system and suggested installing an automated fee collection system to strengthen management.
- 6.8.1 He asked for the total cost of the parking lot and argued that relevant legal fees should be included in the cost.
- 6.8.2 Treasurer Woo Wee Kang responded to the issue of the parking lot fee collection system, stating that the IT department has requested proposals from multiple vendors and is currently evaluating them. Some companies require a 50/50 profit split, while others propose building and operating their own system. This involves operational models, fee arrangements for GC Members and members, and other issues that require detailed discussion. He assured that members would be notified once a decision is made.
- 6.9 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) pointed out that the association's payment of RM500,000 to Mah Weng Kwai & Associates for legal fees should be attributed to the cost of the Mazu Park project.
- 6.9.1 He questioned the practice of listing the 24 statues as assets, emphasizing that members have the right to know the total project cost, which he believes no one can currently confirm.
- 6.9.2 He mentioned discussions in 2023 with GC Member Yang Keng Hwa and others regarding the RM189,000 due to DBKL. At that time, it was suggested not to pay, but it was eventually paid. He asked GC Member Yang Keng Hwa to explain how

the accounting department handled it and the validity of the approval.

- 6.9.3 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, responded that GC Member Yang Keng Hwa would answer later and asked Member Loong Chiah Peng if he had any further questions.
- 6.9.4 Addressing Member Loong Chiah Peng's question about RM189,500.00, GC Member Yang Keng Hwa pointed out that in 2022, the GC Members was divided into two factions. At that time, the former and current Presidents had asked him about the development source of the parking lot. He explained that the development originated from a seven-story multi-purpose building application by former President Datuk Tang Chai Yoong, which included ground-floor motorcycle and car parking, storage rooms, and offices. This plan had been submitted to DBKL multiple times from the start but had not been approved until early 2022 because the land use was designated as "Institutional," only permitting the construction of facilities like temples.
- 6.9.5 GC Member Yang Keng Hwa explained that later, due to Datuk Yong Thain Sung's good relationship with DBKL, the plan might have been revised to a seven-story pure parking lot, as other developments were not feasible. He had sought an approval letter from DBKL at the time. The conclusion was that to build only the seven-story parking lot, two land premium fees were required: RM20,000 and RM169,500. The letter was sent out in 2023.
- 6.9.6 GC Member Yang Keng Hwa added that in February 2023, the President and a group of GC Members, including the late GC Member Wee Lork Fook, held a meeting in Bandar Puteri. He had explained the approval to the attendees. The parking lot involved three land lots, including LOT PT 1 or 104, and Lots 143 and 42. The latter two were agricultural land, requiring a land use conversion application before construction. At that time, most people, including the President, Vice Presidents, and GC Members, were unaware of the actual location of the parking lot.
- 6.9.7 GC Member Yang Keng Hwa further explained that in the meeting on February 12, 2023, he told GC that if they refused to pay, they wouldn't have to pay the premium. However, at GC Meeting three days later, although a majority had initially objected, they eventually all raised their hands in approval, with only Lim Jit Yee and Wang Choon Wing opposing. He believes that DBKL still imposes conditions requiring proof of the use and status of the three land lots. To proceed with development, a land conversion is necessary, requiring at least an additional RM2-3 million in premium fees. Thus, the RM189,500.00 was that expense.
- 6.9.8 Member Loong Chiah Peng asked the Treasurer under which category the RM189,500.00 expense was listed, whether it was still valid with DBKL, and whether it meant no further payment was needed in the future, or if it had lapsed.
- 6.9.9 GC Member Yang Keng Hwa responded that the RM189,500.00 was paid to DBKL in exchange for the parking lot development order. According to Datuk Tang Chai Yoong's explanation, if they didn't pay, the approval letter would lapse, making

future applications more difficult. Therefore, GC had no choice but to agree by a show of hands to pay on February 15, 2023.

- 6.10 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) added that if the RM2.7 million impairment loss were combined with related projects, it might exceed RM5 million, and emphasized that the RM189,000 payment must be accounted for.
- 6.10.1 He questioned who was responsible for the impairment loss. If no one was responsible, the loss would be borne by the members. He reminded GC that its authority limit is RM250K and questioned whether the excess was the members' responsibility. If so, members should not rashly approve the financial report.
- 6.10.2 Treasurer Woo Wee Kang referred the question to Deputy Treasurer Lim Chee Peng to respond. Deputy Treasurer Lim Chee Peng stated that this was his first report and asked for everyone's understanding. He explained that the total cost of the Mazu Park project was RM5.043 million, but the financial report had different classifications, so some expenses were not directly listed as project costs. For example, the production cost of the Mazu statue was RM2.07 million (paid from 2019 to 2023), which was a project expense; the tender advertisement fee of RM23,000 was listed under miscellaneous items.
- 6.10.3 Deputy Treasurer Lim Chee Peng further explained that the statue cost of RM2.073 million had been impaired in the financial report; ground works and landscaping cost RM1.1 million; consulting and legal fees were RM463,000; DBKL approval fees and the 2015 24 Filial Piety statues cost RM209,000; tender advertisement fees were RM23,000. As for the RM17,000 travel expenses for GC Members to visit the statue factory in China in 2024, these were not included as project costs.
- 6.10.4 Deputy Treasurer Lim Chee Peng reported that total expenses from 2015 to 2020 were RM3.8 million; RM86,000 in 2021; and RM103,000 in 2024. Although the 2024 EGM opposed continuing the project, there were still RM183,000 in expenses, including DBKL approval fees, soil testing, and factory inspection visits. From January to May 2025, there were also some approval and drawing fees.
- 6.10.5 Deputy Treasurer Lim Chee Peng stated that he had compiled a list of payees and payment years, calculated the total amount, and reclassified the expenditures, confirming that the final total expenditure for the Mazu Park project was RM5 million. The RM500,000 for repainting the main hall was a routine expense.
- 6.10.6 Member Loong Chiah Peng asked whether the RM5.04 million included the RM300,000 for hillside clearing.
- 6.10.7 Deputy Treasurer Lim Chee Peng initially didn't hear clearly, then confirmed and answered that the cost was contracted to Crystal Business Solution for RM308,000 and had been included under "Site Clearing."
- 6.10.8 Member Loong Chiah Peng responded that he was just confirming the data and emphasized that someone must be responsible for this payment.

- 6.10.9 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, stated that she observed that while Deputy Treasurer Lim Chee Peng was reporting, Member Loong Chiah Peng was not paying attention to the slides (PPT) and was only looking at the materials in his hand, not listening carefully.
- 6.10.10 Member Loong Chiah Peng denied this and explained that he was looking for the RM300,000 fee for Crystal Business Solution, which he couldn't find at first but has now found. He then asked the external auditor about the meaning of "Related Party Transaction" and "Key Management Personnel Compensation" mentioned on page 170 of the financial report.
- 6.10.11 External Auditor Ong Teng Yan responded that "Key Management Personnel Compensation" is a standard disclosure. As this association operates collectively with no individual managers, the report states that this situation does not exist. Regarding "Related Party Transaction," it is purely for disclosure purposes and does not affect the results of the financial report.
- 6.11 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, stated that this Committee's ability to answer members' questions is commendable, and she hopes they will continue their efforts.
- 6.12 Member Bang Peng Eam (XK3875) asked which expense of the Mazu Park project the RM189,500.00 paid to DBKL in 2023 was for. Was it related to the seven-story parking lot? He asked the Treasurer or accountant to explain and clarify whether this capital item was approved by the EGM.
- 6.13 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) stated that the key issue now is whether the RM189,500 fee has been wasted ("burn"). He pressed the Treasurer to confirm whether this amount has been wasted.
- 6.13.1 Deputy Treasurer Lim Chee Peng asked what "burn" meant. Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) answered "is gone." Deputy Treasurer Lim Chee Peng asked if he meant "spent out" and explained that the amount had indeed been spent, as evident from the 2023 data summary where the amount has been booked. He emphasized this was a fact, but further explanation of the situation was difficult.
- 6.13.2 Member Loong Chiah Peng asked whether this fee still served any purpose.
- 6.13.3 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, asked rhetorically why not directly explain to the members under what circumstances a paid fee becomes invalid.
- 6.13.4 Member Loong Chiah Peng continued, saying Our Association paid RM189,500 to apply for DBKL approval to build a parking lot, but ultimately did not build it. He asked whether this RM189,500 could be offset against a future new parking lot application.
- 6.13.5 Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing responded that Our Association is about to build a new parking lot behind the temple, hence the question about offsetting.

- 6.13.6 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, explained that after paying such a fee, construction must be completed within a specified period; otherwise, the license becomes invalid. If construction is not completed, the fee must be paid again for future applications. She explained that the land originally intended for the seven-story parking lot is agricultural land. To convert it to commercial land, the Constitution require a three-fourths majority vote of members, and GC did not complete that procedure at the time.
- 6.13.7 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, continued, stating that the permit was applied for and obtained, and the fee was paid before completing the land conversion procedure. Whether construction could be completed within the deadline remained doubtful due to the unconverted land. If the EGM does not approve it, and GC has no intention of proceeding, the RM189,500 will be in a "frozen" state. She believes GC must handle this matter properly.
- 6.14 Member Ong Hong Hoon (K2676) stated that after listening to everyone's remarks, the conclusion of this matter serves as a reminder that back then, supporting some of former President Datuk Tang Chai Yoong's decisions led to mistakes. It is unfair to place all blame on Datuk Tang Chai Yoong; he did make errors, but some GC Members present supported his actions at the time. Therefore, this must be seen as a lesson and a wake-up call to be cautious in handling any matter in the future. If the GC Members had been more rigorous in examining the issues and conducting detailed analyses back then, the RM2,700,000 bad debt, over RM5,000,000 in contingent liabilities, and over RM1,000,000 in legal fees would not exist today.
- 6.15 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, called for a motion and a second to accept the Treasurer's report.
- 6.15.1 Member Teh Ting Oin (K17912) moved, and Seventh Vice President Tan Eng Peng seconded. Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, called for unanimous approval by acclamation to accept the audited financial report for the year 2024.

## 7. Discussion of Motions

- 7.1 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, asked Secretary General Tan Kuan Feng to report how many Motions and questions had been received. She reminded everyone that many questions had already been answered in the previous session and should not be dwelled upon repeatedly if already answered.
- 7.2 Secretary General Tan Kuan Feng reported that a total of fourteen Motions had been received.
- 7.3 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, asked Secretary General Tan Kuan Feng how these Motions would be handled.
- 7.4 Secretary General Tan Kuan Feng reported that, upon convening by the Convener and Third Vice President, Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong, GC had established a Constitution

Amendment Subcommittee and appointed Chew Seng Chen as chairman to lead the subcommittee in studying and amending the Constitution. Seven subcommittee meetings and one draft Motion review meeting have been held so far.

- 7.5 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, again asked Secretary General Tan Kuan Feng how many Motions were received, how many were accepted, and how they were handled, emphasizing that failure to clarify would surely lead to disputes later.
- 7.6 Secretary General Tan Kuan Feng reported that basically, there were eleven Motions moved by Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) and seconded by Member Lim Yat Queng (K2742); plus the Motion from SJK(C) Chiao Nan's Chairman, Dato' Lim Hong Sang, a lawyer; the Motion for distributing aid to the elderly poor moved by Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing and seconded by Third Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong; and the Motion from Member Wong Liang Yew (K0019), moved by Member Wong Joon Tong (K5278) and seconded by Member Lim You Goang.
- 7.7 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, personally reported to the meeting: A total of eight Motions and questions were received, amounting to eighteen Motions and seven questions in total. After discussion, GC resolved to accept three Motions for discussion at the meeting, which are currently displayed on the screen. Written replies have been given for the remaining Motions.
- 7.8 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, stated that since written replies have been given, there will be no further discussion. If there are still objections, they must be addressed after the discussion of the three Motions is completed; otherwise, even those three cannot be finished.
- 7.9 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, invited the Chairman of SJK(C) Chiao Nan, Dato' Lim Hong Sang, to explain the reason and background of this Motion to the meeting.

Motion 1: Call upon this association to approve the SJK(C) Chiao Nan Board's promotion of a planned three-story building project with an estimated value of RM8 million, including a historical corridor and parking spaces on the ground floor, parking on the first floor, and a hall with badminton and basketball courts on the second floor, and request Our Association to allocate RM3.5 million as part of the construction costs.

- 7.9.1 SJK(C) Chiao Nan Chairman Dato' Lim Hong Sang, reported that he assumed the chairmanship over a year ago. Following the 2024 elections, there were changes in the Board, with most members being new. According to government regulations, the chairman needs at least three years of board experience, so he became chairman due to a lack of other options.
- 7.9.2 He recalled that during its glorious period, SJK(C) Chiao Nan had over a thousand students, but the number has reduced each year since the relocation of Perkeliling Flat, currently only 265 students, including 165 Chinese, and 90 Malays, Indians, and other ethnicities. Over the years, the Board has tried methods like offering English remedial classes to attract students, but with limited effect. In contrast, Chung Hwa Primary School, though not in a Chinese-majority area, attracts students from afar

due to its unique educational features.

- 7.9.3 He pointed out that the school gate is obscured by a flyover built for a road, affecting visibility. Despite this, SJK(C) Chiao Nan students have performed excellently in recent years: winning 19 medals (7 gold) in the 2024 Selangor & FT badminton competition, and 17 medals (9 gold) as of June 2025. Although the school lacks a badminton court, parents still pay for training transport. Some students have represented the country in SEA Games badminton. Students have also won national Mandarin speech championships and Mandarin debate runners-up.
- 7.9.4 He added that students also achieved good results in 24-season drums, Asia-Pacific Math Olympiad, primary school Chinese orchestra, and taekwondo competitions. To cultivate more talent, the school believes it needs more modern facilities to enhance its image and attract students.
- 7.9.5 The Board proposes building a three-story building: a historical corridor and parking on the ground floor; parking on the first floor; a multi-purpose gymnasium (basketball, badminton) on the second floor. The existing historical corridor is closed most of the year and inconspicuous; the new corridor will be open daily, displaying the ancestors' contributions in a more formal and grand manner.
- 7.9.6 He added that a survey found 4-5 apartment projects within walking distance of the school to be completed by the end of 2026. One has 918 units; if 200 households send children to the school, that adds 200 students. Therefore, they should seize the opportunity to build and improve competitiveness.
- 7.9.7 He emphasized that SJK(C) Chiao Nan is an asset of the association, representing the hard work of Hainan pioneers for 108 years, so they must preserve and enhance it. The current project has secured commitments from a group of advisors, engineers, and a QS to provide free services. The budget is approx. RM8,000,000, with RM4,500,000 pledged so far.
- 7.9.8 He requested the meeting to approve the plan and authorize Our Association to provide RM3,500,000 in the worst-case scenario, though he is confident that Our Association's funds may ultimately not be needed.
- 7.10 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, asked: If RM3.5 million is allocated, will the building be named "The Selangor & KL Hainan Association Building"? Dato' Lim Hong Sang replied yes. The Speaker joked that "it will bring great honor," but clarified it was just a joke and would not affect members' judgment.
- 7.11 Member Wong Liang Yew (K0019) asked whether this case had been approved by GC and requested the date be recorded.
- 7.11.1 The Secretariat reported that the 7th Committee Meeting (11/06/2025) had approved it. Secretary General Tan Kuan Feng confirmed this.
- 7.12 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) asked about the project completion timeline.

- 7.12.1 Dato' Lim Hong Sang replied that approval from the Ministry of Education is still needed. If smooth, approval could be obtained within the year, and construction completed next year.
- 7.13 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) stated that he is not against the expenditure, but questions whether an RM8,000,000 project is worthwhile for only 265 students.
- 7.13.1 Dato' Lim Hong Sang responded that the building is being prepared for the future 1,000 students. The school is actively promoting itself online and attracting attention from professional families.
- 7.14 Member Wong Liang Yew (K0019) pointed out that when Our Association funded the school building in the past, the school had over 1,700 students, and the classrooms already exceed current needs. Some classrooms are now vacant, leaking, and damaged. He questioned whether priority should be given to repairs and focusing on the feasibility of hall revenue; otherwise, it might follow the fate of many empty halls in KL.
- 7.14.1 Dato' Lim Hong Sang responded that after the new building is operational, the library will be moved to a vacant classroom, which can be reused when student numbers increase. The hall and courts have rental potential, especially badminton and pickleball, which are in high demand, and can generate income for the school.
- 7.15 Member Teh Ting Oin (K17912) asked if our Association ultimately does not provide funds, will the name "Selangor & KL Hainan Association" not appear?
- 7.15.1 Dato' Lim Hong Sang clarified that regardless of fundraising methods, the Hainan Association's contribution will not be forgotten, and the building will still bear our Association's name.
- 7.16 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, asked whether the RM8,000,000 is only for construction costs.
- 7.16.1 Dato' Lim Hong Sang replied that it is mainly construction costs, with limited fittings; only the historical corridor involves more substantial furnishing.
- 7.17 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, called for a show of hands. The secretariat counted 225 attendees, 103 in favor, none against, 16 abstentions. The Speaker declared the Motion passed by a large majority and congratulated SJK(C) Chiao Nan.
- 7.18 SJK(C) Chiao Nan Chairman Dato' Lim Hong Sang expressed deep gratitude for the support and promised to do his utmost to complete the project.
- 7.19 Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing moved, and Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong seconded, to submit Motion 2 to the EGM.

Motion 2: Recommend that the EGM approve an allocation of RM350,000 (Three hundred fifty thousand Ringgit) as the operating budget for the association's 2026 "Aid to the Elderly Poor" activity.

- 7.19.1 Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing reported that our Association holds this activity annually, and often there are insufficient red packets. This year, there was a particular shortage. Therefore, it is suggested to increase the amount from RM250,000 to RM350,000 to benefit more members.
- 7.19.2 President Foo Wah Chek added that this is not an ordinary red packet but specifically assistance for needy members.
- 7.20 Member Chu Wan Fei (K15820) asked, if RM350,000 is allocated, how much will each beneficiary receive? What will be the form of distribution?
- 7.20.1 Welfare Officer Phang Chee Kwong explained that in the January 2024 event, 1,700 people collected, exceeding the usual 1,500. According to Constitution 10.2, GC expenses cannot exceed RM250,000 per item, so some could not benefit. Most GC Members paid RM22,950 from their own pockets to cover the shortfall. This Motion aims to prevent a recurrence. Each beneficiary will receive RM150. Starting in 2025, pre-registration (Google Form) has been adopted, keeping numbers below 1,500, and the event went smoothly.
- 7.21 Member Bang Peng Eam (K3875) suggested that the approved amount should be flexible. If actual expenses exceed RM350,000, GC could approve it first but must report to the next EGM. He suggested setting an upper limit of RM500,000 for adjustment.
- 7.22 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, reminded that eligibility for "elderly poor" must be defined, otherwise numbers are hard to control. She gave herself as an example: if it's age 60 and above, she would qualify; and RM150, after travel costs for those coming from afar, leaves little real benefit. Therefore, implementation must be carefully considered.
- 7.23 Member Teh Ting Oin (K17912) suggested that after increasing the amount to RM350,000, the number of beneficiaries should be maintained at 1,500, each receiving RM200, with the rest for miscellaneous expenses. He also questioned the term "elderly poor," as many recipients are not poor, suggesting "Senior Citizen Sponsorship" instead.
- 7.23.1 Speaker Chew Mei Fun agreed and joked that "Senior Citizen Red Packet" would also be suitable.
- 7.23.2 Welfare Officer Phang Chee Kwong clarified that the activity is only for members aged 65 and above. As of June 2025, 7,204 members are eligible. If everyone claimed, it would cost over RM1 million, so the number must be limited.
- 7.24 Member Chu Wan Fei (K15820) suggested using online transfers to avoid travel fatigue and high transport costs for the elderly. He emphasized that aid should benefit those truly in need, not be a mere formality.
- 7.25 Member Lim Yat Queng (K2742), as a beneficiary, stated that the term "elderly poor" is inappropriate; it should be positioned as a welfare for senior citizens. He supports the registration method as it avoids long queues and protects the rights of the elderly.

7.26 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, summarized that the main point of the Motion is to increase the budget to RM350,000 to cope with potential future increases in participants. In the long run, our Association should systematize member welfare, clarify eligibility and methods, so that truly needy members benefit, and use the care for fellow villagers to attract younger members.

7.27 After a vote, the majority was in favor, with 2 against and 2 abstentions. The Speaker declared the Motion passed by a large majority and called for applause.

7.28 Member Chuang Keng Soon (K8203) submitted Motion 3.

Motion 3: Promote a fairer and more reasonable admission system for university courses; urge the government, before being able to fully implement a merit-based system, to adopt a quota system based on the country's ethnic population ratio to admit outstanding students of all ethnic groups with excellent results into pre-university programs.

7.29 Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun, asked if debate was needed and stated that this reflects the sentiment of most members, though some disagree.

7.30 The meeting resulted in 1 against, none abstaining, passed by a large majority. The Speaker called for acclamation, and most members responded.

7.31 The Speaker then opened the floor for appeals from members whose Motions were not included.

7.32 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) asked if he needed to read out his Motion.

7.32.1 The Speaker stated that before he reads it, GC must give a response. If he is still unsatisfied after hearing it, he can then express his views.

7.32.2 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) pointed out that his Motion had the support of 114 signatures, so according to the Constitution, it must be submitted. GC cannot simply reply directly. He emphasized that the Motion must be heard. If the majority disagrees, it should be put to a vote according to Clause 7.2.

7.32.3 The Speaker asked him to read it first, then hear GC's opinion before proceeding to a vote. She also asked that it be done item by item.

7.33 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) read out his second Motion in English, which concerns our Association's annual budget, and requested a Chinese translation, but the Speaker refused.

Motion 2: Annual Expenditure Budget Motion of the Association (Proposer Wong Ang Peng, Secunder Lim Yat Queng)

GC shall submit an annual pre-application for the budget of each activity's expenditure to the AGM for discussion, seeking the meeting's approval and ratification.

This pre-application shall include, but is not limited to, the following items: a. Staff salaries, including overtime pay, year-end bonuses, and incentives. b. Wages for temporary workers. c. External donations and charitable items including the annual grant for the elderly poor. d. Education loans, bursaries, and grants. e. Series of traditional festival celebration activities, including Lunar New Year and New Year's Eve. f. Property maintenance, renovation, and upgrading projects. g. Other expenditure items not mentioned above.

Rationale: Submitting the annual expenditure budget Motion ensures transparency in fund utilization, accountability, clearly shows the fund flow for the year's activities, strengthens fund control, aligns with international standard operating procedures, encourages efficient resource use, and continuously improves monitoring and evaluation reports.

7.33.1 The Speaker explained to GC that the Motion suggests that the AGM should approve the next year's budget. This is a progressive step, helps GC plan expenses in advance, and if insufficient, they can seek ratification or approval from the AGM. She asked members if they agreed.

7.33.2 Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong stated that the budget should be prepared by the new Committee after elections based on their plans. Immediate implementation might stall work for the entire year after the election year. He suggested referring it to the Constitution Amendment Subcommittee for study, then opening it for a full day of detailed discussion with members to find the best approach.

7.33.3 Member Chew Siang Peng (K4462) believed that there is no best method, only better. Company or association activities must have budgets, break-even points, and measures for overspending. He stressed no more delays; transparency and prior planning are crucial.

7.33.4 Proposer Wong Ang Peng (K4526) reiterated that a financial budget is a basic annual requirement.

7.33.5 The Speaker agreed with the Motion, stating that even if elections are imminent, a budget must be presented; it's a sign of good governance.

7.33.6 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) supported the Motion, emphasizing that the budget is GC's responsibility, and they cannot refuse on grounds of difficulty. If the budget is approved by members, the new Committee should inherit it and make necessary adjustments.

7.33.7 The Speaker further explained that an annual budget would avoid last-minute special Motions for funding (like the RM350,000 for aid to the elderly), provide clear direction, and improve efficiency. She suggested starting next year.

7.33.8 Treasurer Woo Wee Kang displayed a "2025 Budget Overview," stating that GC prepares a budget every year and adjusts it after activities based on actual expenditure.

7.33.9 Deputy Treasurer Lim Chee Peng pointed out that the budget preparation timing

may not align with the AGM. If the June AGM needs to approve the next year's budget, it means the budget must be prepared 7 months in advance, which is relatively early.

7.33.10 The Speaker suggested adjusting the fiscal year and its deadlines. Although she didn't study accounting, she felt there were technical issues with this...

7.34 Proposer Wong Ang Peng (K4526) suggested voting on this Motion.

7.35 The Speaker stated that since GC already has a budget preparation mechanism, there is no problem.

7.35.1 Deputy Treasurer Lim Chee Peng stated that the association does prepare a budget for the next year and presents it to the AGM so members understand the work plan for the new year, but not for formal approval, because if adjustments are needed later, it would cause procedural problems.

7.35.2 The Speaker asked Deputy Treasurer Lim Chee Peng if he had experience with annual budgets in companies or organizations and asked him to explain why the AGM cannot approve or endorse the financial budget.

7.35.3 Deputy Treasurer Lim Chee Peng replied that he had participated in departmental budgeting. He believes there's no problem if approved according to procedure. However, if the AGM is in June and the budget needs to be prepared in May for the following January, that's 7 months early, too early. The national budget presented in October is more reasonable.

7.35.4 The Speaker asked if any accountants were present, but no one responded.

7.35.5 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) stated that Deputy Treasurer Lim Chee Peng only raised difficulties. Members elect GC to solve problems, so it must be implemented. He demanded to see the budget and wanted to know the total expenditure amount.

7.35.6 Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong responded, as Chairman of the Lunar New Year 2025, he and GC had detailed the 15-day activity plan before the New Year, and each group submitted budgets that were integrated. He emphasized that the meeting is discussing the 2024 report; if they are to debate the 2025 Lunar New Year activity budget, he would not participate.

7.36 The Speaker called for order and stated:

(1) The issue is whether everyone is accustomed to the current method of handling the budget.

(2) According to the Constitution, there are limits for project expenses, but this year's Lunar New Year exceeded the budget.

If a budget is prepared and submitted annually, GC can legally execute it like

Parliament, avoiding future accusations of overspending.

7.36.1 She emphasized that the claim "cannot prepare next year's budget in June" is unfounded, believes parts of the Motion are acceptable, and the final decision should be made by the meeting.

7.37 Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong pointed out that GC will implement members' request to "prepare a financial budget," but needs time to handle it. He noted that if the motion "must submit a financial budget to the AGM in the future" is passed today, practically speaking, Lunar New Year work cannot proceed next year because they must wait for the June AGM to approve the budget. Therefore, implementing this needs time for gradual adjustment.

7.37.1 The Speaker agreed that GC needs time to implement gradually.

7.38 Member Ong Hong Hoon (K2676) requested a 3-year budget. He agreed with the Speaker and stressed that time is not an issue; even if preparation takes 2 months, he can accept. The main point is that the Motion "must submit a financial budget in the future" must be passed today.

7.39 The Speaker suggested that the Motion be passed today but implemented starting next year, using the 2026 AGM to present the 2027 budget as an example, and called for a vote.

7.40 Member Lilian Yang Keng Yiew (K13444) stated that New Year expenses are largely predictable; for example, if RM50k is needed this year, and an extra RM20k is required, it should be directly included in the budget as RM70k for clear direction. She emphasized that a response can be given today, no need to wait one or three years, and believes this avoids excessive spending.

7.41 The Speaker put it to a vote. No one opposed. The meeting unanimously passed: Starting from 2026, GC must submit the financial budget for the following year to the AGM.

7.42 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) submitted the following Motion:

Motion 3: Appointment of Authorized Spokesperson (Proposer Wong Ang Peng, Seconder Lim Yat Queng)

Members propose and resolve to appoint the association's President, Secretary General, or one GC Member elected by GC as the association's Authorized Spokesperson. The association will not recognize statements made on its behalf by unauthorized persons; such statements do not represent the association's stance and have no legal basis.

7.42.1 Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong expressed agreement and explained that for external visits and statements, everything must be arranged through the Secretariat. No one is allowed to hold press conferences or give interviews on behalf of the association without authorization. The spokesperson is generally the President.

~~7.42.2 Proposer Wong Ang Peng (K4526) thanked Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng~~

Cheong for his response and added that there had been incidents where the President's public statements caused controversy, leading to legal action against the association.

7.42.3 Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong explained that the press conference in question was authorized by GC and approved by the President; it was a duly authorized press conference. Someone later tried to smear the association and defame it. The association's handling at the time was in accordance with the Constitution. However, the association recently discovered that someone gave a TV interview without the association's consent, so they will look into this matter.

7.43 The Speaker asked Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) if he agreed with the matters discussed. Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) agreed.

7.43.1 Proposer Wong Ang Peng (K4526) agreed, and no one present opposed the "President being the association's official spokesperson."

7.44 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) submitted the following Motion:

Motion 4: Online/Internet Banking Services (Proposer Wong Ang Peng, Seconder Lim Yat Queng)

Clause 10.1 of the association's Constitution must include a clause on online/internet banking services.

7.44.1 Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong pointed out that the association's Constitution already cover online banking services. The service is currently implemented and also included in the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP).

7.44.2 The Speaker stated that this means there are no restrictions in the Constitution, so online operations can be freely conducted.

7.44.3 Proposer Wong Ang Peng (K4526) stated that if this matter is already covered in the Constitution, he believes many problems can be solved, including human resource issues.

7.44.4 Since the association's Constitution already cover "online banking services," Proposer Wong Ang Peng (K4526) and the attendees had no objections.

7.45 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) submitted the following Motion:

Motion 5: Implement and Enforce a Cashless Payment System (Proposer Wong Ang Peng, Seconder Lim Yat Queng)

Propose to implement and enforce a cashless payment system starting January 1, 2026. All payments made by the association to external parties must be made via internet/online banking services, including remittances and transfers. Under Clause 10.1(f), the Treasurer shall continue to keep petty cash not exceeding RM3,000.00 per occasion.

7.45.1 Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong pointed out that the association will

implement cashless payments as much as possible. The association follows SOP and ISO requirements. Relevant cash is kept by staff for transactions. Some activities require on-site cash payments, e.g., competition awards because winners cannot be known in advance, necessitating cash transactions. The association monitors and audits cash transactions, especially recently when a member requested a remittance of RM11,000. Over the years, cash withdrawals have been properly conducted. Currently, a monthly reporting system is in place, regularly reporting the amount of cash withdrawn for various activities and the amount of unused cash deposited back into the bank. The association's current finance and accounting personnel manage these cash transactions properly, but not all transactions can be cashless, e.g., buying refreshments and cakes from external suppliers, which are daily operational needs.

7.45.2 Proposer Wong Ang Peng (K4526) stated that he understands some situations do require cash payments, but hopes to significantly promote cashless payments in the future to prevent any improper conduct, forgery, or other undesirable situations. They seek transparency and effective control, avoiding the chaos of the past. He emphasized that for clear assurance, this Motion must be seriously put to a vote and taken seriously.

7.45.3 Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong stated that the association is gradually reducing cash usage, adopting cashless methods where possible, and currently uses QR codes and bank transfers for payments.

7.45.4 The Speaker asked how the association pays staff salaries.

7.45.5 Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong stated that cheques or online transfers are used for staff salaries, rarely cash, except for daily-rated temporary workers. The association prefers online transfers in most cases and agrees with the proposer's "implement and enforce a cashless payment system," but believes the Treasurer truly has a headache with practical operations, though efforts to improve are ongoing.

7.45.6 The Speaker believes the association is already "implementing and enforcing a cashless payment system," but they need room for improvement.

7.45.7 Since the association is already "implementing and enforcing a cashless payment system," Proposer Wong Ang Peng (K4526) and the attendees had no objections.

7.46 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) submitted the following Motion:

Motion 6: Approval of Payment Requests (Proposer Wong Ang Peng, Secunder Lim Yat Queng)

The association's Treasurer or Deputy Treasurer must first review and scrutinize any payment request according to the Standard Operating Procedure, and only after confirming its correctness can they approve the payment request and sign cheques or online/internet banking payment applications. According to Clause 10.1(d), Group 1 and Group 2 shall jointly sign.

7.47 Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong pointed out that according to the current Constitution, first the Secretary General gives "approval," then the Treasurer conducts "validation." The same person (e.g., the Treasurer) cannot be responsible for both approval and validation; these two steps are performed by different people. According to ISO standards, after confirming the budget and related matters, the Secretary General approves the RS15 payment. Then, accounting or finance personnel verify the completeness and accuracy of the documents before signing and final approval.

7.47.1 The current process already has one person reviewing and another validating, with three people jointly signing cheques. GC will refer this Motion to the Constitution Amendment Subcommittee to further explore better checks and balances.

7.47.2 If "approval" is returned to the Treasurer alone, the check and balance is lost. In fact, most payment approvals come from the General Committee (GC). The Secretary General merely executes decisions already passed and recorded by GC. These approval authorities and mechanisms are already written into the Constitution. Currently, according to the Constitution, there are four roles that can approve payments:

1. President – can approve up to RM10,000
2. Secretary General – can approve up to RM5,000
3. General Committee (GC)
4. Executive Committee (Exco) – can approve up to RM25,000

7.48 Member Ong Hong Hoon (K2676) pointed out that in all corporate accounting operations, whether listed or private companies, the Treasurer or accounting department typically reviews all relevant documents first, and after confirming correctness, submits them to senior management (e.g., Treasurer or President) for approval. This is reasonable and correct practice. The association's current practice of the Secretary General approving first, then the Treasurer handling it, is incorrect and does not conform to this norm. Hence, the suggestion to point out this procedural flaw.

7.48.1 He added that he had heard the saying "the President and Secretary General have signed, so the Treasurer has to sign too," which is clearly wrong.

7.48.2 The Speaker agreed with Ong Hong Hoon's statement: the claimant should submit the request first, then give it to the Treasurer for checking and verification, then to the Secretary General or President for approval.

7.48.3 Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong pointed out that the current Constitution so stipulate. The Speaker and Member Ong Hong Hoon suggested amending the Constitution.

7.48.4 Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong stated that there are different views and suggested referring this matter to the Constitution Amendment Subcommittee for comprehensive study to find the most suitable approach. If amendments are needed, adjustments to ISO procedures and related forms should also be included.

- 7.49 Deputy Chair of the Constitution Amendment Subcommittee Micheal Mok Loong Check (K8227) stated that the Subcommittee's task is to conduct a thorough and in-depth review of the Constitution and propose amendments that are as complete as possible. He firmly believes that any proposed Constitution amendments must ultimately align with the collective will of the AGM. If members are allowed to discuss and vote on Motions at the AGM, the resolutions passed can reasonably be regarded as the collective stance of the assembly.
- 7.49.1 According to Clause 7.1, the AGM is the highest authority. Therefore, resolutions passed at the meeting should not be obstacles but rather provide direction and basis for the Subcommittee's work. In fact, once a resolution involving the Constitution is passed at the meeting, the Subcommittee no longer needs to debate that issue in detail but should incorporate the resolution into the final Constitution amendment recommendations.
- 7.50 The Speaker stated that so far, the meeting has only voted on one Motion (the one regarding the budget). The remaining member Motions will be referred to the Constitution Amendment Subcommittee, responsible for discussing and re-examining the content of these Motions and submitting Constitution amendment suggestions.
- 7.50.1 Deputy Chair Micheal Mok Loong Check (K8227) stated that the problem lies in whether it is legal that previously passed Motions did not result in Constitution amendments. Moreover, this matter is actually an implementation issue, so a vote should be taken, emphasizing that "members' opinions are very important."
- 7.50.2 The Speaker stated that she would not put this Motion to a vote because it will be referred to the Subcommittee for study and amendment recommendations. If it is passed by vote today, it would be binding and would prevent the Subcommittee from having the authority to study or amend it further. She asked Proposer Wong Ang Peng (K4526) if he agreed.
- 7.50.3 Proposer Wong Ang Peng (K4526) stated that he agreed with the Speaker and also did not want to restrict the Subcommittee's autonomy.
- 7.50.4 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) stated that Deputy Chair Micheal Mok Loong Check (K8227) expressed that this is an implementation issue. The members present have expressed their wishes and decisions, and it does not need to be handled by the Subcommittee. He also asked which clause in the Constitution states that "the Secretary General must approve first."
- 7.50.5 Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong responded that it is Constitution "9.4 Duties of Secretary General: (f) To verify all payment vouchers and bills." He agreed that the proposed method is good, but if the Motion is passed today, implementation might face obstacles tomorrow because of a conflict between the current Constitution and today's Motion, and it would be unclear which one to follow.
- 7.50.6 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) asked Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong whether he understood that the Secretary General's duty in the Constitution is to "examine" (verify) and not to "approve."

7.51 The Speaker apologized for not checking the Constitution before speaking and called for a return to discussing the Motion itself.

7.51.1 She believes that examination is needed before the Secretary General signs. The current financial process according to the Constitution: the claimant must apply first, the Treasurer conducts a preliminary verification; if it belongs to a specific unit like the Welfare Group, the unit head must also verify; then the Secretary General signs and approves; after all steps are completed, a cheque can be issued or payment made. The current Motion is still incomplete; she suggested referring to Member Ong Hong Hoon's suggestion.

7.51.2 Finally, after the Executive Secretary briefly came on stage to communicate with the Speaker, the Speaker stated that she was not very familiar with the specific ISO procedures and asked Member Wong Liang Yew on the spot: "Is the current financial procedure subject to ISO standards?"

7.51.3 Member Ong Hong Hoon (K2676) believed that the association's operations should not be restricted by ISO standards, as ISO is a separate area and should be handled separately from daily operational matters.

7.51.4 The Speaker gave an example: a former Secretary General was subjected to disciplinary action. She questioned whether the then IT Director followed the payment request procedure: did he apply first? Was it reviewed? Was it approved by the Secretary General? She further illustrated: if the Education Group incurs expenses for an activity, they should organize the bills, have the activity person in charge sign, submit to the Treasurer for review, then to the Secretary General, and finally payment can be made. Generally, the cheque signatories are the Treasurer, President, and Secretary General. What is being requested is simply a standardized procedure. Would passing this Motion affect the association's operations? If things really develop that way, she believes the problem lies with ISO, not the association.

7.51.5 Member Ong Hong Hoon (K2676) pointed out that he had worked in large companies domestically and internationally and had served as president of a listed company. He believes this is common practice and should be followed as the correct procedure. If the Constitution is wrong, it should be amended. Hence, he suggested a vote.

7.52 The Speaker called for a show of hands. She emphasized "Constitution 9.4: Secretary General to sign correspondence and keep custody of all documents, seal and etc." Even if the vote passes, it does not violate Constitution 9.4(f), because it only provides better protection for the Secretary General. She asked the Secretary General: if he is asked to examine the activity bills without understanding the situation, and then instruct the Treasurer to pay, is he willing to bear this responsibility? Is this fair to him?

7.52.1 Secretary General Tan Kuan Feng said "dangerous."

7.52.2 The Speaker stated that in her experience in MCA and related departments, there has never been a practice of "Secretary General signs first, then Treasurer signs."

The GC Members didn't raise their hands just now. Does that mean they disagree? She said the execution is very simple. For example, if someone wants to claim a payment today, they need to provide receipts and submit an application. After submission, the Treasurer checks whether the application is for an already approved activity. However, this process does not apply to ad-hoc purchases like cakes or drinks; that's why the Treasurer has the RM3,000 petty cash budget, to pay for such expenses.

- 7.53 Education Officer Ooi Sim Ee pointed out that this issue involves administrative operations, so he agrees that the content can be included in a Motion. However, he suggested that the meeting could agree in principle to "refer the Motion to the General Committee (GC) for further study and implementation." He emphasized that voting on the Motion at this stage would only express "for" or "against," and many details are still unclear. He suggested putting this opinion on record but not voting, and providing an explanation at next year's meeting.
- 7.53.1 The Speaker stated that regarding the handling of this motion, there is no need to worry about the vote; it is just a motion.
- 7.53.2 Education Officer Ooi Sim Ee explained that not every Motion is suitable for an immediate vote. A vote might be interpreted as a confrontational stance.
- 7.53.3 Member Ong Hong Hoon (K2676) stated that a vote is not confrontation but to push for the necessary decision. He believes they are doing the right thing and called on the Speaker to support the process, emphasizing that this is common practice.
- 7.53.4 The Speaker explained that her position is to wish to handle matters better, without intending to cause misunderstanding or confrontation. She noted that although the current Motion is incomplete, its basic spirit can be accepted and referred to GC for subsequent improvement and handling. She hopes that after full discussion at the meeting, everyone can be convinced willingly.
- 7.53.5 Education Officer Wong Sim Ee supplemented that GC members are elected by members; therefore, members should have confidence in the GC's work. He stated that while members' opinions may be heard, he does not agree that members should directly instruct the GC on how to handle matters during the meeting. He suggested that the relevant opinions be referred to the GC for further study and pointed out that it would not be appropriate if all matters were handled in a similar manner.
- 7.54 Member Wong Liang Yew (K0019) stated that all members have the right to raise opinions during the meeting and have them recorded; however, without a formally submitted motion, it is not appropriate to proceed directly to voting. He does not believe that members have such voting authority under these circumstances.
- 7.54.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun responded that the motion had in fact been raised previously but was not accepted by the GC at that time. In essence, the motion already fulfills the requirements for submission. According to

the regulations, if a member's motion is submitted late or beyond the deadline, the GC has the right not to accept it; if the content is in the nature of an inquiry, the GC may choose to respond verbally. She further explained that any motion that complies with the procedures entitles the proposer to request discussion during the meeting. In addition, she pointed out that GC members should bear the necessary execution responsibilities when handling such matters and should not shift such responsibilities to the Secretary General; only in this way can transparency and overall operational efficiency be enhanced.

7.54.2 Member Wong Liang Yew (K0019) stated that if the GC does not adopt the motion, a EGM may be considered.

7.54.3 Proposer Wong Ang Peng (K4526) agreed that the motion should be put to a vote and reiterated that the minutes should fully reflect the discussion process.

7.55 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun stated that she agrees with the spirit of the motion, which is to ensure that the Association's payment procedures are more in line with standard financial management practices. She suggested that, subject to members' agreement, the Association should further refine and implement the matter to enhance the soundness and completeness of the overall financial system. She then conducted a show-of-hands vote on the spot; as there were no objections, the motion was unanimously carried.

7.56 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) submitted the following motion:

Motion 7: Interpretation of the phrase "at any one time" in Clauses 10.2 (a) (b) (c) (d) of the Association's Constitution (Proposed by Wong Ang Peng, Seconded by Lim Yat Queng)

The phrase "at any one time" in Clauses 10.2 (a) (b) (c) (d) of the Constitution shall be clearly interpreted as "any single project," referring to one entire project. This includes that the Chinese New Year's Eve, the first to the fifteenth day of the Lunar New Year celebration series are regarded as one entire project. Similarly, Vesak Day and the Birthday Celebration of Mazu are each considered as "a single project." Any single entire celebration series project has its own key elements, celebration segments, and programme series, which are managed and conducted concurrently.

7.56.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun suggested that, as the matter concerns the definition of wording, it should be referred to the Constitution Amendment Sub-Committee for in-depth study to ensure that the issue is properly addressed.

7.56.2 Proposer Wong Ang Peng agreed but stated that positive action should be taken starting now because...

7.56.3 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun stated that earlier The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong had already welcomed members to submit constitutional amendment proposals to the Constitution Amendment Sub-Committee for study.

- 7.56.4 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) opined that the current discussion is not about amending the Constitution; the definition of the phrase “at any one time” is a separate issue. Members wish to decide on the definition of the phrase at this AGM. For example, with 50 or 100 members present today, a decision can be made, whereas a committee of only 10 members is making decisions on behalf of all members.
- 7.56.5 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun questioned why the matter should be handled hastily, as it involves interpreting wording in the Constitution and should not be dealt with directly without proper study.
- 7.56.6 Member Loong Chiah Peng stated that he would remain patient and wait another two to three years, even if millions of Ringgit continue to be spent. He cited the recent Chinese New Year event as an example, pointing out that the related expenditure easily exceeded RM1 million, and questioned who had approved such spending.
- 7.56.7 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun stated that matters cannot be changed overnight. Considerable improvements have been made over the past few years, and the current GC has performed well; therefore, everyone should give themselves and the GC a round of applause. However, more patience is needed. If problems persist in the future, members will naturally “monitor and rectify” them, but at present, some level of trust should be given to the GC, as they were elected by members. She called on everyone to focus on fulfilling current responsibilities.
- 7.56.8 Proposer Wong Ang Peng stated that at the very least, he agrees with the spirit of pursuing change.
- 7.56.9 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun suggested that the matter concerning the interpretation of the phrase “at any one time” in Clauses 10.2 (a) (b) (c) (d) of the Constitution be referred to the Constitution Amendment Sub-Committee for further study. The proposer, Wong Ang Peng, agreed to the suggestion to refer the matter accordingly.
- 7.57 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) submitted the following motion:

Motion 8: Interpretation of the term “works/project” in Clause 15.3 of the Association’s Constitution (Proposed by Wong Ang Peng, Seconded by Lim Yat Queng)

The term “works/project” in Clause 15.3 of the Constitution shall be interpreted as:

“Any construction project, festive celebration series, maintenance project, procurement project, or any undertaking involving financial expenditure or contractual control, time constraints, or completion targets within a specified period.”

- 7.57.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun opined that this motion similarly concerns the definition of wording and is of the same nature as Motion 7, and suggested proceeding to the next motion.

7.57.2 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun suggested that the matter concerning the interpretation of the term “project/work” as stated in Clause 15.3 of the Constitution be referred to the Constitution Amendment Sub-Committee for further study. The proposer, Wong Ang Peng (K4526), and the members present had no objection.

7.58 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) submitted the following motion:

Motion 9: Adoption of Internal Audit Guidelines (Proposed by Wong Ang Peng, Seconded by Lim Yat Queng)

AGM approve and adopt the proposed Internal Audit Guidelines (Appendix 1).

7.58.1 Proposer Wong Ang Peng (K4526) stated that the hard copy of the Internal Audit Guidelines had already been submitted to the GC, and that the guidelines are based on generally accepted internal audit standards in Malaysia. He added that as the Constitution does not clearly define the duties of internal auditors and only mentions external auditors, this initiative aims to better regulate the relevant system.

7.58.2 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun asked whether companies generally have both internal auditors and external auditors. She also pointed out that the two internal auditors elected at the AGM have both resigned.

7.58.3 Proposer Wong Ang Peng responded that the discussion pertains to the Association, not a typical company, and acknowledged that both internal auditors have resigned.

7.58.4 Proposer Wong Ang Peng stated that the lack of clear definition of internal auditors’ duties has led to difficulties in execution. He admitted that some individuals who were elected had expected only to play a nominal “rubber stamp” role, which further highlights the necessity of establishing Internal Audit Guidelines.

7.58.5 Member Ong Hong Hoon (K2676) stated that he would nominate two new internal auditors and currently has two candidates in mind. In response to the issues raised, they have submitted a set of “Internal Audit Guidelines” to serve as a working reference for future internal auditors, which is the reason for submitting the guidelines.

7.58.6 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun reiterated her suggestion to refer the document accordingly instead of conducting an on-the-spot vote. Member Ong Hong Hoon expressed agreement.

7.58.7 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun suggested that the matter concerning the “Internal Audit Guidelines” be referred to the Constitution Amendment Sub-Committee for further study. The proposer, Wong Ang Peng (K4526), and the members present had no objection.

7.59 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) submitted the following motion:

Motion 10: Appointment of Professional Accounting Firm to Assist in Audit and Reporting Work (Proposed by Wong Ang Peng, Seconded by Lim Yat Queng)

The two internal auditors appointed by the AGM may recommend and appoint a qualified professional audit firm to assist in conducting in-depth audit and inspection work, as well as in the preparation and submission of reports. All audit and inspection activities shall be carried out in accordance with internal audit standards.

7.59.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun suggested that the matter be referred to the Constitution Amendment Sub-Committee for further study.

7.59.2 The proposer, Wong Ang Peng, nodded in agreement.

7.59.3 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun further suggested that the matter concerning the “Appointment of Professional Accounting Firm to Assist in Audit and Reporting Work” be referred to the Constitution Amendment Sub-Committee for study. The proposer Wong Ang Peng agreed, and the members present had no objection.

7.60 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) submitted the following motion:

Motion 11: Review of Project/Work Accounts Reports and Meeting Minutes at AGM/EGM (Proposed by Wong Ang Peng, Seconded by Lim Yat Queng)

Members proposed that for every project/work, the final accounts report must be submitted to the GC within 2 months for review and approval. Similarly, AGM/EGM accounts reports and meeting minutes must be submitted within 3 months for approval by the GC. Upon review, such reports and minutes shall be made available for members’ inspection upon request.

7.60.1 The 3rd Vice President Dato’ Dr Tan Seng Cheong stated that while many members have high expectations of the GC, they often overlook the actual circumstances faced by its members. He expressed appreciation for members’ concern but pointed out that many do not fully understand the working conditions of the GC nor actively offer assistance. He welcomed members to participate in event planning, join sub-committees, or review quarterly financial reports. However, he noted that the Association’s finance team consists of only four members, and manpower is limited, making it impossible to operate with the efficiency of a corporate entity. Both Treasurers and the Secretary General have full-time jobs yet still attend almost daily to assist. He himself has devoted substantial time to handling documentation and procedures in order to improve the quality of operations. The current GC continues to learn and coordinate, with efforts made to openly discuss budgets and activities in pursuit of transparency.

He emphasized that while the GC has done its utmost to carry out its duties, imposing rigid timelines without understanding the actual processes would create significant pressure. He cited examples:

- Immediately after the Chinese New Year, major events such as Wesak Day and the Port Klang Mazu procession follow, requiring attendance by GC members;

- Financial closing processes are ongoing, but delays occur due to pending receipts and invoice confirmations from vendors;
- As such, it is not feasible to complete financial reports within two to three months. He appealed for reasonable time to be given to the GC to complete its work properly.

7.60.2 He further stated that if excessive expectations and external pressure persist, he may refrain from organizing activities in the coming year to avoid criticism. Regarding constitutional amendments, he noted that a full year had been allocated for members to submit proposals, and while immediate amendments are possible, they may not comply with the Constitution or could expose those implementing them to further disputes or legal risks. He expressed concern that continued criticism at AGMs or other occasions would significantly affect the GC's willingness and confidence to carry out its duties.

7.60.3 The proposer, Wong Ang Peng, clarified that his remarks were not directed at the current GC but were intended as long-term procedural improvements.

7.60.4 The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong stated that some individuals are unwilling to understand the Association's operational processes and refuse to communicate. He remarked that the Association follows established procedures. For example, GC members sometimes have to pay out-of-pocket for meals during meetings, and reimbursement may require multiple procedures and time. He questioned the purpose of such efforts under these circumstances.

7.60.5 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun pointed out that members should understand that not every association is able to conduct meetings continuously from morning until evening as this Association does. She emphasized that the GC has consistently provided detailed information over the years, which reflects responsibility rather than routine compliance. She urged members not to be overly critical and expressed confidence that the GC is committed to fulfilling its responsibilities.

7.61 Member Wong Hee Heng (K1993) stated that he is also a member of the GC in other associations and fully resonates with the views shared by The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong. He pointed out that each GC member has their own work and responsibilities, and it is indeed difficult to prepare and submit reports within such a short timeframe.

7.61.1 He cited a recent event that he personally organized as an example, noting that the accounts have yet to be finalized due to various constraints, including the Treasurer being away and other relevant parties being occupied with their own commitments. He emphasized that the final report will eventually be completed and suggested that all reports and documents be reviewed collectively at the end of the year.

7.61.2 He expressed appreciation that two motions had been successfully passed during the meeting and conveyed his respect to the Honourable Speaker for her fairness and for conveying the position of the GC. He also reminded members to understand

and accept the responsibilities and pressures borne by the GC.

7.61.3 He stated that everyone hopes the Association will operate effectively and perform well. He expressed support for the Speaker's suggestion to allow the GC some flexibility and space to achieve common goals. He concluded by thanking the meeting and the Speaker.

7.61.4 He suggested that the meeting accept the response provided by the GC regarding the motion. He emphasized that members should not be overly demanding, but instead grant the GC a clear mandate, as well as trust and confidence, to carry out their duties.

7.62 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun and Member Wong Hee Heng (K1993) suggested that some flexibility and space be given to the GC. The members present had no objection.

7.63 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) submitted the following motion:

Motion 1: Proposed Concept Master Plan for Development of the Association's Undeveloped Land at Robson Height, Kuala Lumpur (Proposed by Wong Ang Peng, Seconded by Lim Yat Queng)

Before a new conceptual master plan is finalized, all previously approved or pending development proposals passed or tabled in previous AGMs or EGMs shall be suspended until approval is obtained at the 2026 AGM.

7.63.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun stated that for Motion 1, the Constitution already provides that any development project must be submitted by the GC for prior approval. Therefore, there is no need to pass a similar motion again, and it would suffice to emphasize compliance with the Constitution.

7.63.2 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) pointed out that Motion 1 is not directed at any specific project, but concerns the overall development master plan, which must be submitted to the city authority for approval. He emphasized that the Association currently owns multiple parcels of land, and there is a need for systematic planning for future development, clearly defining the use of each land area rather than carrying out scattered developments. He cited traffic arrangements as an example, noting that the current situation is disorganized and buses face difficulty entering during rainy days, indicating a lack of proper planning.

7.63.3 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun reminded that the meeting had reached approximately 6:30 p.m.

7.63.4 Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing stated that the GC already has some preliminary ideas regarding the overall master plan. He suggested that the best approach would be to have YTS Architecture present a slideshow on the first phase of development, including the Mazu Park and the car park. As for the second phase, it may include elements such as a museum and cultural street, while the third phase may involve the development of a convention or exhibition centre,

subject to funding availability. He then invited Mr. Yap to present the briefing.

7.63.5 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun raised a key question to the meeting as to whether the GC already has an overall master plan. If not, she queried how the motion could be implemented. She suggested proceeding with the briefing first before further discussion.

7.64 Member Choo Sio Hong (K3295) raised a query regarding the ongoing legal case between the Association and Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL). He noted that the Association had obtained a favourable judgment and had submitted a claim amounting to RM12 million to DBKL on 15 June 2023. He stated that the matter has now entered the court stage and is pending determination of the compensation amount.

He emphasized that the GC should not privately negotiate any compensation sum with DBKL without prior authorization from an EGM, as this may give rise to misunderstanding. He further requested clarification on the current status of the legal proceedings.

7.64.1 He also pointed out that the legal fees amounted to approximately RM160,000 in 2023 and increased significantly to RM930,000 in 2024. He requested that the relevant financial slides be replayed for further clarification.

7.64.2 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun agreed to replay the relevant slides. However, as the Secretariat required time to retrieve the documents, she suggested addressing the first query first.

7.64.3 The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong stated that discussions with DBKL regarding the Development Order (DO) application had already commenced in 2023. He noted that multiple departments within DBKL have expressed support and that the matter is currently at the coordination and engagement stage. He clarified that the issue of compensation has not yet been determined by the court.

7.64.4 The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong further explained that the current legal proceedings remain an action for damages, and the compensation amount is still under assessment. He clarified that rumours alleging that the GC had reached a private agreement with DBKL to forgo compensation are unfounded. The current engagement with DBKL is aimed at facilitating project continuation and securing the necessary approvals.

7.64.5 He further explained that the RM12 million claim includes RM6 million in storage charges claimed by a project supplier. However, based on the existing contract, the Association is not liable for such costs. The supplier has been informed accordingly, and including such claims in the compensation demand may present legal inconsistencies.

7.64.6 The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong added that the Association has not opted to terminate the contract with the supplier, as doing so may disrupt project recovery efforts. While termination may allow for partial claims against the government, it could hinder project continuity. Based on legal advice and the GC's assessment, the current evidence may not be sufficient to support a high

compensation claim in court, hence the need for a cautious approach.

He further noted that as the matter involves ongoing legal proceedings, including related defamation cases involving multiple GC members and media coverage, only general explanations can be provided at this stage, and detailed disclosure is not appropriate.

7.64.7 Member Choo Sio Hong acknowledged that the explanation provided by The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong was clear. He clarified that the RM12 million figure was not his personal claim but was stated in official documents exchanged between legal representatives. He suggested that any final decision be approved through an EGM to avoid future disputes.

7.65 Member Choo Sio Hong (K3295) raised a second query regarding the financial report, specifically the legal and professional fees for 2024, Items 4 (RM34,650.00) and 5 (RM38,502.00), which relate to the case involving former Executive Secretary Chang David. He inquired whether the law firm handling the matter belongs to any GC member present.

7.65.1 The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong responded that although the law firm belongs to him, the cases were handled independently by another lawyer and his team, and he was not personally involved.

7.65.2 Member Choo Sio Hong further requested detailed information regarding the cases. The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong replied that as the cases are ongoing, and considering that the member has close associations with certain parties involved, it would not be appropriate to disclose further details at this stage.

7.66 Member Wong Joon Tong (K5278) raised a query regarding the motion to confirm the reinstatement of membership of Wong Liang Yew on 3 April 2024 and the withdrawal of nine disciplinary charges against him. He requested the GC to clarify its position.

7.66.1 The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong responded that the GC had resolved to withdraw eight disciplinary charges (as verified) against the member and had reached an understanding with him through a written agreement. The decision will be officially announced via the Association's publication and Facebook platform.

7.66.2 Member Wong Joon Tong (K5278) expressed appreciation for the GC's decision. Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun commended Wong Leong Yew for his long-standing contributions and invited members to give a round of applause. She also acknowledged the efforts of Wong Joon Tong in seeking clarification and praised the GC's decision.

7.66.3 Member Choo Sio Hong (K3295) suggested that such matters be handled by the Association's legal advisor in future.

7.66.4 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun inquired whether the legal

advisor attends GC meetings, and it was confirmed that the legal advisor is present.

7.67 Member Chin Suan Pew (K4011) inquired about the specifications of the Mazu statue and expressed concern over whether DBKL would approve it. He also suggested that the Association consider resuming the vegetarian meal offerings on the 1st and 15th days of the lunar calendar, which had been suspended for several years.

7.67.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun noted that the matter regarding the statue had been reported several times and would be presented again later.

7.67.2 The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong responded that the GC is considering reinstating the vegetarian meal programme and has begun obtaining quotations, with the intention of presenting the proposal at a future AGM.

7.68 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) noted that a budget has been allocated for the Mazu Park project and inquired about the expected completion timeline. He also agreed with the proposal to refer related matters to the Disciplinary Committee but emphasized that the findings should be reported to the AGM rather than only to the GC.

7.68.1 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun requested that a formal written submission be made and stated that the GC should be given time to address the matter.

7.68.2 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) further requested the legal advisor to clarify, based on Clauses 7.1 and 8.1 of the Constitution, whether the GC has the authority to reject motions from being tabled at the AGM.

7.68.3 The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong responded that upon review, the GC considered the matter raised to be more in the nature of a suggestion rather than a formal motion. He emphasized that the GC had provided a written response and had presented all received questions and motions at the AGM, and that no motion had been rejected from being tabled or discussed.

7.69 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) expressed concern that referring his 11 constitutional amendment proposals to the Constitution Amendment Sub-Committee effectively denied them the opportunity to be directly discussed at the AGM.

7.69.1 The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong reiterated that if the GC had rejected the motions, they would not have been presented at the AGM.

7.69.2 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun stated that all questions and motions had been duly read out and advised members not to prolong the discussion. She invited the legal advisor to provide his view.

7.69.3 Legal Advisor Tan Chek Yoke opined that while members are entitled to be informed, the GC must assess whether a matter constitutes a suggestion or a formal motion. He emphasized that suggestions must still be responded to formally, whereas

formal motions must be submitted to the AGM for deliberation and decision.

7.69.4 Member Loong Chiah Peng sought clarification on whether the GC has the authority to reject motions from being discussed at the AGM.

7.69.5 Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun responded that the Constitution does not explicitly state whether the GC has such authority. She emphasized that the GC should carefully assess the nature of each matter and clearly distinguish between suggestions and formal motions, and that appropriate responses should be provided accordingly.

(Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun announced that Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah would assume the chair for the remainder of the meeting.)

## **8. Progress Report on Mazu Park Development Plan**

- 8.1 Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah invited Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing to present the progress report.
- 8.2 Deputy President Dato' Sri Foo Sae Heng @ Foo Sea Hing invited Yap Teak Sing from YTS Architecture to conduct a special presentation on the Mazu Park project.
- 8.3 Yap Teak Sing delivered his presentation, explaining that it would be divided into three main components: the current condition of Thean Hou Temple, the landscape design proposal for Mazu Park, and the planning of the seven-storey car park.
- 8.4 Regarding the approval status of the car park, Yap Teak Sing confirmed that key documents have been obtained, including the approval letter, Development Order (DO), and Building Plan.
- 8.5 With regard to the Mazu Park project, Yap Teak Sing reported that the application documents had been submitted before Hari Raya and had received positive feedback. The project has now obtained a letter of no objection. Based on this progress, the project team is actively engaging with DBKL to proceed with the next stages of approval, and remains cautiously optimistic about obtaining the final DO.
- 8.6 Yap Teak Sing further elaborated through animation, detailing the current condition of Thean Hou Temple, the landscape design of the Mazu Park plaza, and the seven-storey multi-purpose car park. He explained that the car park will be located on the left side of the main temple building and will adopt a dual-function design, serving both as a parking facility and a retaining wall to address soil erosion caused by rainwater. The design includes a dedicated bus parking area and a full lift system for all levels. Adjustments will also be made to the original VIP and certain area layouts to enhance the harmony of the park's natural landscape. The Mazu Park design retains core elements such as the plaza and water features, and includes barrier-free pathways, while adopting a minimal intervention approach to preserve the original terrain as much as possible.
- 8.7 Member Ong Hong Hoon (K2676) raised a query after the presentation, asking whether the

letter of no objection obtained for the Mazu Park project contains any specific conditions. He pointed out that, to his understanding, the development involves multiple land parcels with overlapping ownership, including temple land and agricultural land, and requested clarification on how these issues are being addressed.

- 8.7.1 Yap Teak Sing responded that the project team has held multiple meetings with DBKL regarding land classification. The existing temple land is categorized as institutional land, and it has been confirmed that the Mazu Park land does not carry any specific usage restrictions (tiada syarat nyata), making the park development permissible. The car park land is also categorized under institutional land as it is designated for temple use. He emphasized that the land issue has been resolved, and that the car park DO has already been obtained with a one-year extension.
- 8.7.2 Yap Teak Sing added that the current focus is on obtaining approval for the Mazu Park. The project team, together with GC members, held multiple discussions with DBKL from late last year to early this year. Following guidance from these meetings, the full application was submitted before Hari Raya, and a letter of no objection was obtained approximately three weeks ago.
- 8.7.3 Yap Teak Sing explained that due to public attention arising from the previous car park project, DBKL has handled the current application with greater scrutiny. The application for the Mazu Park DO has been reviewed at the OSC meeting, which issued the letter of no objection. The next step is to obtain final approval from a Special OSC meeting. He estimated the approval probability at 80–90%.
- 8.7.4 Yap Teak Sing further explained that the Special OSC meeting is reserved for major government projects, such as MRT and JKR projects, and is chaired by ministerial-level officials. Based on this process, the project team remains cautiously optimistic.
- 8.7.5 Yap Teak Sing clarified that the letter of no objection does not impose additional conditions, except for one requirement to consult with the Member of Parliament for Bukit Bintang. The Association has maintained good engagement with the MP, YB Fong Kui Lun, and with his assistance, letters of support have been submitted to DBKL and the Special OSC chairman. The project is now awaiting final issuance of the DO.
- 8.8 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) pointed out that the presentation by Yap Teak Sing did not fully address the key concerns raised in his Motion 1. He specifically requested to review the master plan of the Mazu Park project as well as all related approval documents. He further stated that if it is ultimately confirmed that all approval procedures are in compliance, he would support the development of the Mazu Park.
- 8.8.1 The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong stated that the request by members to review the approval documents is reasonable. However, he strongly cautioned against the dissemination of unverified information to external parties, as it may affect the Association's relationship with DBKL and potentially jeopardize the final approval of the project.

- 8.8.2 Yap Teak Sing explained that the animation presented earlier may be regarded as a conceptual master plan, although it does not include the newly acquired front parking area. He elaborated that the plan consists of three main components: the current state of Thean Hou Temple, the seven-storey multi-purpose car park, and the Mazu Park with its connecting plaza. He emphasized that the car park is designed not only to address long-standing parking shortages but also to serve as a permanent retaining structure to resolve soil erosion issues caused by previous landslides. He further explained that the design includes a covered drop-off point for tour buses and a full lift system, which will significantly improve traffic conditions, particularly during peak festive periods such as the Chinese New Year.
- 8.8.3 Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah requested members to take note of the letter of no objection issued by DBKL. Yap Teak Sing reiterated that the only condition stated in the letter is the requirement to consult with the Member of Parliament for Bukit Bintang.
- 8.8.4 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) continued to question the authenticity of the letter of no objection, noting that it was not issued on official DBKL letterhead. He ceased his queries only after the Secretariat presented the complete document. He further stated that the animation presented should not be regarded as a formal master plan, emphasizing that a proper master plan should include land title documentation. He also raised concerns about whether there are additional underground or surrounding developments not reflected in the presentation.
- 8.8.5 Yap Teak Sing clarified that the animation shown was a simplified version intended to highlight the key components of the project. He added that a full version of the animation exists, which includes detailed representations of all elements, from structural design to landscaping, but was not fully presented due to time constraints.
- 8.9 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) raised further queries regarding whether separate approvals are required for the Mazu Park, the seven-storey building, and the car park, and whether these are to be constructed on different land parcels.
- 8.9.1 Yap Teak Sing confirmed that separate applications have been made for the respective components, but they were presented together for ease of understanding.
- 8.9.2 Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah explained that the purpose of the presentation is to provide members with an overall understanding of the Mazu Park development plan, and that the presentation itself does not require approval.
- 8.10 Member Chuang Keng Soon (K8203) inquired about the differences between the new and previous Mazu Park plans.
- 8.10.1 Yap Teak Sing explained that approximately 80–90% of the original design has been retained, with adjustments made to improve integration with the natural landscape and to better manage construction costs. He highlighted modifications such as redesigning the original boat-shaped VIP resting area within the water feature to enhance natural aesthetics and increase visitor space. He also emphasized that the animation reflects a high level of accuracy in terms of vegetation, structure

proportions, and the design and colour of the Mazu statue.

8.11 Member Teh Ting Oin (K17912) raised a query regarding the estimated 80–90% approval probability of the Mazu Park project, specifically questioning whether sufficient consideration has been given to the sensitivity of the statue's size. He cited the example of the Guanyin statue at Kek Lok Si Temple in Penang, where the original height had to be reduced due to concerns over exceeding nearby mosque structures. He expressed concern that similar issues may arise given the Federal Territory's context and requested clarification on how such risks are being addressed.

8.11.1 Yap Teak Sing responded that all parameters of the Mazu Park project, including the dimensions of the Mazu statue, have been fully submitted in the application documents. He emphasized that the letter of no objection obtained does not contain any objections or requirements for modification regarding the statue's size.

## 9. Appointment of Internal Auditors

9.1 Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah announced Agenda Item 9 on the appointment of internal auditors.

9.2 Assistant Secretary General Loh Ju Keng reported that at the 2024 AGM, Member Wong Ang Peng proposed Goh Ching Toong as an internal auditor, seconded by Goh Seng Kuang. Member Yang Keng Hwa proposed Wong Jee Seng as an internal auditor, seconded by Lee Siong How, both of which were approved. However, Wong Jee Seng declined the appointment, leaving only Goh Ching Toong. Subsequently, Goh Ching Toong submitted a resignation letter on 13 May 2025 due to vision issues. Therefore, the Association is required to appoint two new internal auditors.

9.3 Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah remarked that holding positions within the Association is increasingly challenging. She noted that recent legal cases and related expenses have raised concerns among members, including a case in which she herself was involved. She called on members to reflect objectively and rationally when raising questions.

9.4 Member Choo Sio Hong (K3295) explained that the EGM was convened through a petition process, which eventually required a court order to proceed due to procedural delays. He emphasized that once a court order is issued, the EGM must be conducted in accordance with the law, and expressed regret over any remarks questioning the authority of judicial decisions.

9.5 The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong intervened, stating that as the matter is currently under judicial proceedings, it would not be appropriate to discuss details publicly. He requested members' understanding and cooperation in refocusing on the meeting agenda.

9.6 Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah thanked Member Choo Sio Hong and redirected the meeting to the appointment of internal auditors. The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong added that it is preferable for nominees to be present at the AGM to respect the members present.

~~9.7 Member Ong Hong Hoon (K2676) proposed Member Cher Nam Tat (K6704) as internal~~

auditor, seconded by Member Tan Tat Pun (K5613).

- 9.8 Member Loong Chiah Peng (K2223) proposed Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) as internal auditor, seconded by Member Ong Tee Li (K18177).
- 9.9 Assistant Secretary General Loh Ju Keng proposed Member Chiew Sang Thong (K13931) as internal auditor, seconded by Treasurer Woo Wee Kang.
- 9.10 Education Officer Ooi Sim Ee proposed Member Wong Liang Sai (K15679) as internal auditor. Although the nominee was not present, he had expressed willingness to accept the appointment. The motion was seconded by Welfare Officer Phang Chee Kwong.
- 9.11 Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah requested members to vote by a show of hands on whether a nominee not present at the meeting may stand for election.
- 9.11.1 34 members voted in favour and 20 voted against. The AGM resolved to allow Wong Liang Sai (K15679) to stand for election.
- 9.11.2 Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah invited the nominees to introduce themselves.
- 9.12 Member Cher Nam Tat (K6704) introduced himself, stating that he has been a member for over 20 years and has 44 years of experience in the banking industry, including roles in compliance and risk management. He expressed confidence in his ability to serve as internal auditor.
- 9.13 Member Wong Ang Peng (K4526) introduced himself, stating that he has been a member for over 30 years and holds professional backgrounds in naturopathy and cardiology research. He emphasized that the role of internal auditor requires commitment to the Association and a willingness to serve, beyond just professional qualifications.
- 9.14 Member Chiew Sang Thong (K13931) introduced his background in association work and his profession as an insurance agent, expressing his willingness to contribute.
- 9.15 Education Officer Ooi Sim Ee introduced Member Wong Liang Sai (K15679), highlighting his academic qualifications and extensive experience, including a senior IT management role at Shell.
- 9.16 Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah stated that 4 capable candidates have been nominated and invited members to vote by a show of hands to select 2.
- 9.17 Member Ong Hong Hoon (K2676) suggested appointing all 4 candidates due to the workload involved.
- 9.18 Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah clarified that the Constitution limits the number of internal auditors to 2 and sought legal advice.
- 9.19 Legal Advisor Tan Chek Yoke advised that while additional support is beneficial, only 2

official internal auditors may be appointed, with the others serving as alternates.

- 9.20 The 3rd Vice President Dato' Dr Tan Seng Cheong proposed a coordination arrangement, noting that the 4 candidates appeared to form 2 respective groups. He suggested that each side nominate 1 primary candidate, while the remaining 2 candidates would form a supporting team, ultimately working together as a unified internal audit team.
- 9.21 The Secretariat raised a procedural query regarding the proposed arrangement, specifically whether such a structure would be in conflict with the Association's Constitution.
- 9.22 Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah requested clarification on the proposed grouping arrangement, specifically whether it would involve Cher Nam Tat and Wong Ang Peng forming the first group, and Wong Liang Sai and Chiew Sang Thong forming the second group, and further requested confirmation of the lead candidate for each group.
- 9.23 After discussion, it was agreed that Cher Nam Tat and Wong Ang Peng would form the first group, with Wong Ang Peng as the lead, and Wong Liang Sai and Chiew Sang Thong would form the second group, with Wong Liang Sai as the lead.
- 9.24 Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah, in accordance with meeting procedures, called for confirmation of the proposed arrangement by way of a show of approval by applause.
- 9.25 Members expressed their agreement by applause. The AGM resolved that Cher Nam Tat and Wong Ang Peng be constituted as the first group, with Wong Ang Peng designated as the lead and appointed as the first internal auditor, while Wong Liang Sai and Chiew Sang Thong be constituted as the second group, with Wong Liang Sai designated as the lead and appointed as the second internal auditor.

## **10. Adjournment**

- 10.1 Deputy Speaker Lee Sok Wah delivered the closing remarks, expressing sincere appreciation to all members for their participation. She commended Honourable Speaker Datin Paduka Chew Mei Fun for her excellent chairmanship and acknowledged the dedication of the GC members. She also noted the constructive contributions made by members and concluded that the meeting was fruitful. The meeting was adjourned with a round of applause.
